

HOW TO APPLY FOR A MAGNET OR FUNDAMENTAL PROGRAM

For a New Student / Pinellas County Resident

THE INITIAL APPLICATION PERIOD FOR THE 2026-27 SCHOOL YEAR IS OPEN FROM 9 AM JANUARY 6 THROUGH 5 PM ON JANUARY 16, 2026!

1 ACCESS THE FOCUS PARENT PORTAL.

To complete an application, families must use the online Focus Parent Portal at <https://focus.pcsb.org>. Use your email to set up an account. You can use any computer or the Focus App to login and apply.

2 ENTER BASIC STUDENT INFORMATION

- On the left-side menu, find Forms and click the drop down arrow.
- Select Online Application.
- Enter your child's first name, last name, date of birth and choose New Student to Pinellas County Schools.
- Select Begin Application.
- Enter your student's legal middle name, gender, county of residence.
- If you are only applying for a magnet or fundamental program (not your child's zoned school), check the box.
- Select 2026-27 as the school year and enter the grade level they will be in for that year.
- IEP/ Gifted Information
 - If your child has an IEP or is gifted, select yes and enter the requested information.
 - If not, select No for both questions.
- Select your child's language.
- Click Next Page to continue.
- Type your house number and street name, then select your address from the list.
- Select save, then Next Page to verify information.
- Select +Add New Contact
- Enter the relationship to the child and choose contact address
- Select Save Contact
- If you want to include another contact, select +Add New Contact and enter their information.
- Select Next Page to Continue
- Select Click to Sign, provide your signature and enter the date.
- Click the Submit and Finish button.

- Find your child's name on the left side menu.
- Click the drop-down arrow next to the name.
- Select Magnet & Fundamental Program Application 2026-27.

Upload military transfer orders, gifted eligibility, or other documents.

Accepting a seat will decline all other offers and remove you from all other waitlists.
Not accepting will keep your student on waitlists but forfeit any current Magnet & Fundamental Program offers.
All decisions must be finalized by 5 PM on Friday, February 20, 2026.
