These programs encourage students across the world to become active, compassionate and lifelong learners who understand that other people, with their differences, can also be right.

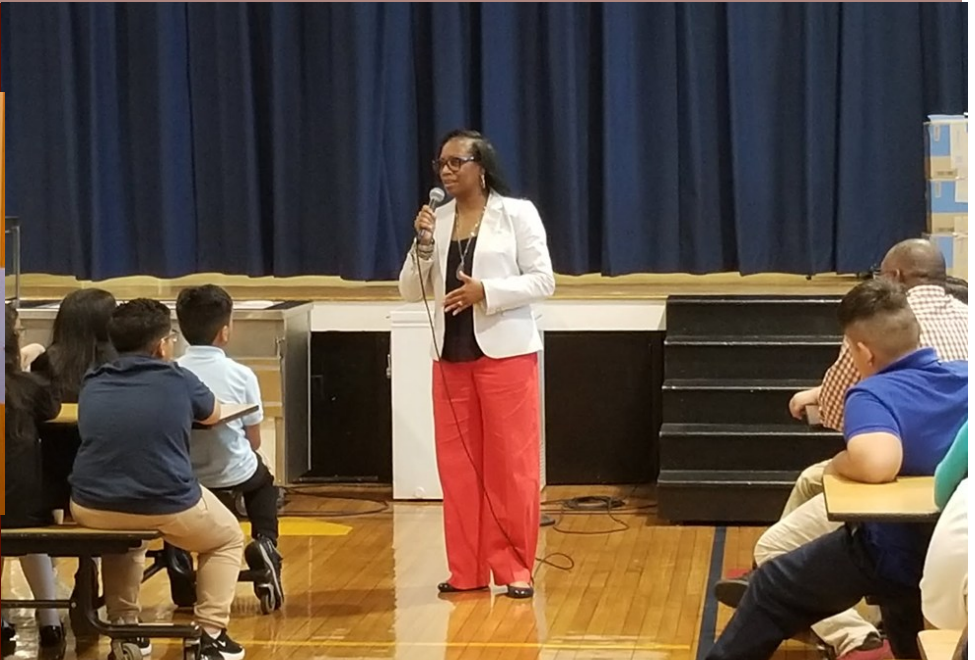
What is the International Baccalaureate Primary Years Program (PYP)?

The PYP is a uniquely international program that focuses on the total growth of the child. This embraces academic excellence, cultural awareness and promotes social, physical, emotional well being.
