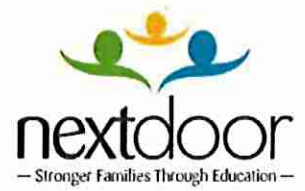

We have examined management's assertion that Next Door Charter School complied with all contractual requirements as listed in the accompanying representation letter dated March 26, 2025, during the school year ended June 30, 2024. As discussed in that representation letter, management is responsible for Next Door Charter School's compliance with those requirements. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on management's assertion about Next Door Charter School's compliance based on our examination.

Our examination was conducted in accordance with the attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and Milwaukee Public School's Minimum Audit Procedures and, accordingly, included examining, on a test basis, evidence about Next Door Charter School's compliance with those requirements and performing other procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances. We believe that our examination provides a reasonable basis for our opinion. Our examination does not provide a legal determination on Next Door Charter School's compliance with the specified contract requirements.

In our opinion, management's assertion that Next Door Charter School complied with the aforementioned requirements for the school year ended June 30, 2024, is fairly stated in all material respects, except for one deviation disclosed in the administrative and fiscal performance section of this report.

Next Door Charter School

Background

The Wisconsin Charter School Law, Statute 118.40, authorizes the Milwaukee Board of School Directors (the "Board") to establish by contract Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) instrumentality and non-instrumentality charter schools. A charter school, as defined by the Statute or Board Policy, is a public school created by contract that shall (a) be exempt from the provisions of Chapters 115 to 121 of the Wisconsin Statutes, except as otherwise explicitly provided; (b) be nonsectarian in its programs, admission policies, employment practices, and all other operations; (c) be free from tuition and without mandatory fees, unless such fees are consistent with MPS's policies; (d) not discriminate in admission or deny participation in any program or activity; (e) enroll students in the school on a purely voluntary basis; (f) give preference in admission to any pupil who resides within Next Door Charter School's attendance area; and (g) administer, at a minimum, the same proficiency and performance measures and assessments that are applied to other MPS schools. State Statute 118.40 also defines a non-instrumentality charter school as a charter school in which the personnel are not employed by the school district.

On August 26, 2004, the Board granted the petition of Next Door Foundation, Inc. for Next Door Charter School (NDCS) to operate as a Grade K4 through K5 non-instrumentality charter school. The current contract, approved by the Board in May 2021, includes the school year 2023-2024.

State Statutes require that a charter school must annually have a programmatic examination performed. To comply with the State Statute, NDCS engaged Wipfli LLP to conduct a compliance examination.

Scope and Objective

The objective of this compliance examination was to determine the extent to which NDCS complied with the administrative and fiscal provisions set forth in the charter school contract between NDCS and MPS. The scope of the examination was for the 2023-2024 school year and included examining, on a test basis, compliance with the provisions of the contract and performing other procedures we considered necessary. Specific contract provisions examined included, but were not limited to, governance council membership and activities, methods of instruction and educational programs, parent involvement, student disciplinary and admission policies, special education, budgeting, staff licensing, health and safety, financial management, examination, and grant requirements. In addition, the internal controls used at NDCS were reviewed to determine whether the controls were established to ensure compliance with the administrative and fiscal provisions of the contract.

Contract Compliance Conclusion

The examination of NDCS’s compliance with the provisions of the contract dated June 30, 2016, between MPS and NDCS for the 2023-2024 school year disclosed one instance of material noncompliance with the provisions of the contract. NDCS was found to be noncompliant with contract provisions that require compliance with the Board’s immunization requirements.

Our examination also included a review of the internal controls designed to ensure compliance with the provisions of the contract and our consideration of potential fraud conditions. Except for the deficiency in internal controls that contributed to the noncompliant issue noted above, we noted no matters involving internal control over compliance that would be considered material in relation to contract compliance, nor did we identify any conditions of potential fraud.

In our opinion, except for the material noncompliance issue described in the first paragraph, NDCS has complied, in all material respects, with the provisions of the contract for the 2023-2024 school year.

The table below reports the detailed results of our examination of NDCS’s compliance with the various provisions of the contract. Specific details, including recommendations for the area where compliance was not noted, are presented in the report section following the table.

*Next Door Foundation, Inc. did hold debt in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2024. However, the Charter School did not, and Next Door Foundation, Inc. does not utilize MPS funding to pay principal and interest obligations. The allocation of occupancy costs to the Charter School is based on square footage occupancy and this methodology has not changed as a result of the debt issuance.

Charter School's Responses to Recommendations

Finding #1

Condition

NDCS's records indicated that 98% (113 children of the 115 children) of the students' immunizations were up to date.

Criteria

To ensure NDCS is in compliance with Section 1.H., NDCS must comply with the Board's policies and local, state, and federal laws, regulations, and codes that pertain to health and safety, specifically immunization requirements. The Board's policy on immunization requirements is that 100% of the students' immunizations are up to date.

Cause

As NDCS records indicated that 98% percent of the students were immunized, they did not meet the required 100%.

Effect

NDCS is not in compliance with the requirement.

Recommendation

To ensure NDCS is in compliance with contract Section 1.H., it is recommended that NDCS see that all enrolled students obtain the necessary immunizations.

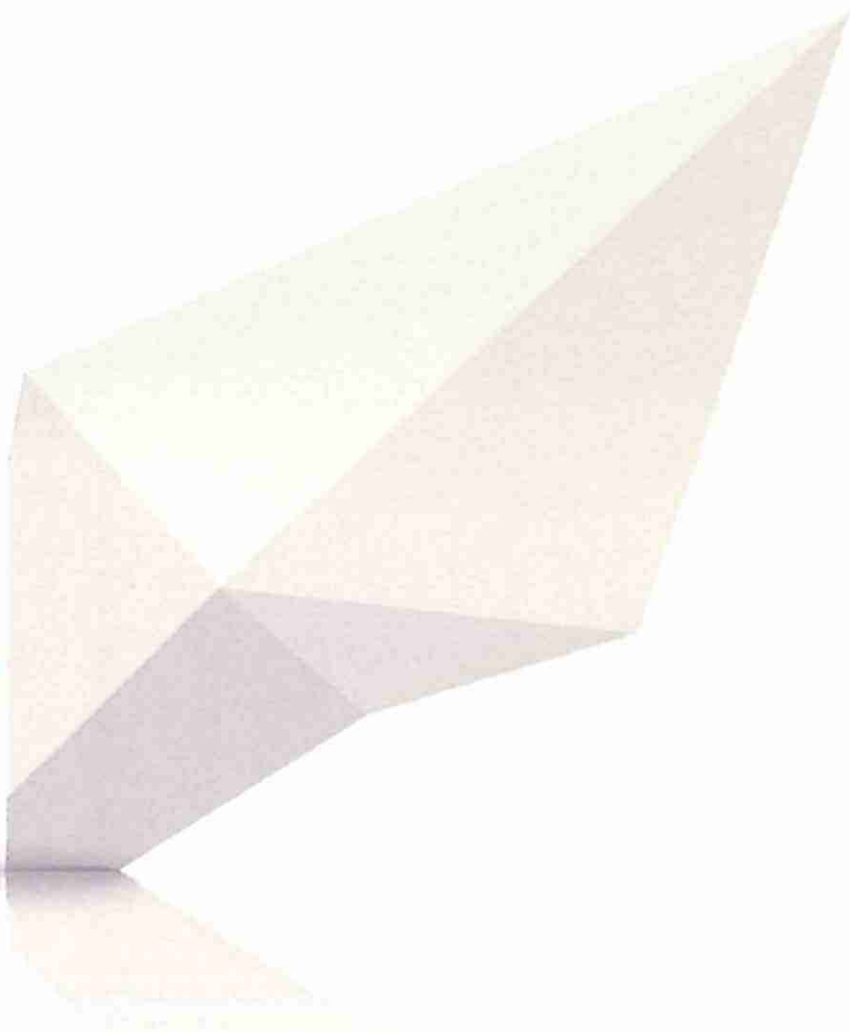
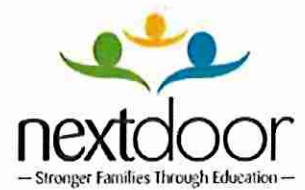
Charter School Response

NDCS will develop a plan including defined collaboration between Family Advocate Specialist and Health Services Specialist that support Charter students. NDCS will be increasing efforts to obtain health documentation, including physicals and immunization records at the start of the school year.

Background

The Wisconsin Charter School Law, Statute 118.40, authorizes the Milwaukee Board of School Directors (the "Board") to establish by contract Milwaukee Public Schools (MPS) instrumentality and non-instrumentality charter schools. State Statutes require that a charter school must annually have a performance examination performed. To comply with the State Statute, NDCS engaged Wipfli LLP to conduct a performance examination.

Scope and Objective

The objective of this performance examination was to determine the extent to which NDCS achieved the academic performance criteria set forth in the charter school contract between NDCS and MPS. Performance was assessed according to MPS's performance criteria. The scope of the examination was the 2023-2024 school year and included examining, on a test basis, evidence about the reported performance results with the provisions of the contract and performing other procedures we considered necessary. In addition, the internal controls used at NDCS were reviewed to determine whether the controls were established to ensure the integrity of reported student data.

Next Door Charter School

Academic Performance

According to the charter contract, schools are required to (1) demonstrate sufficient progress toward attaining the educational goals under Section 118.01, or the academic performance criteria established by the Board, by achieving at least 75% of the applicable performance criteria, and (2) achieve all the other applicable criteria. NDCS administered the required examinations.

Criteria 1

Achieve a percentage of pupils in Charter School scoring at or above readiness on the District’s early literacy reading assessment that is the same as, or higher than, the percentage of pupils scoring at or above readiness in five-year-old kindergarten in all MPS schools.
