ADMISSIONS AND ENTRY PROCEDURES

All pupils interested in applying for Wellington School at any age need to register to start the entry process. The registration form is on the website and should be completed and returned together with the registration fee of £100.

Initial Enquiry

Please do contact us by phone or email and we will send you a prospectus and further information on Wellington School. We would be delighted to discuss your family's requirements.

Open Morning

We have two Open Mornings each year, September and May which is a great opportunity to see our wonderful School and we would be delighted to show you around and for you to meet our pupils and staff.

Registration

You can register your child when you are ready but it is helpful to do this before a taster day so that we are able to advise you of the next steps of the admissions journey at each stage.



Taster days

These are the perfect opportunity for your child to meet pupils in their year group and start to make friends, see how the School works and enjoy a delicious lunch!

Entrance Tests

Prep School prospective pupils will take part in low-key, light touch assessments during their taster day. All year groups in the Senior School take tests prior to entry to Wellington School. For Year 7 these take place in January each year, Year 9 examinations take place in November and February and for Sixth Form we work with the candidate to identify a suitable time. For all other year groups Entrance Examinations can be taken throughout the year. We also ask for your child's latest school report and a reference from their school.

Offer of a Place

Once we have your child's school reports, reference and entrance examination results, the Head will send a letter offering your child a place at the School along with our acceptance form.

Accept Place

To accept the place please complete the acceptance form and return it to us with the deposit (refundable when your child leaves Wellington). This reserves your child's place. We will then send joining information and forms to be completed prior to joining us in September. Welcome to Wellington School!





WELLINGTON PREP SCHOOL

We welcome day children from Nursery (age 3) to Year 6. In addition we run “Little Wellies” a Toddler Group for children younger than 3.

Admission to Nursery

Our Nursery takes children from age 3 onwards and we accept the Early Years Entitlement (EYE) up to 30 hours per week for three and four year olds for those families who are eligible.

Children may join the Nursery throughout the year if spaces are available. Children should aim to spend a minimum of 6 sessions per week with us. Prior to admission, children will spend a “Stay and Play” (taster session) in our Nursery.

Admission to Reception - Year 6

Most children enter these year groups in September, however, if places are available, pupils are welcome to enter at any age and time during the academic year.

Once registered, children will be invited to spend a day in an appropriate class in order to get to

know their peer group by working and socialising alongside them during a normal school day. Over the course of the day the necessary assessment will take place, which will be an informal test in English and Maths and observations of a child’s ability and disposition.

There is an automatic transition from the Prep School to Year 7 in the Senior School, with no additional assessments or tests.

Taster Days

We welcome children of any age to spend a day in School with us, meet other pupils and get to know their way around. These can be arranged at any time to suit you. In addition, we run group Taster Days for children coming into Year 7, so they can meet other children and start to make friends and truly experience a day in the life of Wellington School.

WELLINGTON SENIOR SCHOOL

We welcome students between 11 and 18 years of age. Applications are encouraged from prospective day students and boarders, and from students resident in the UK or living overseas.

Admission to Year 7

Assessments will take place in January and comprise an online assessment which will assess quantitative and non-verbal reasoning ability, as well as English proficiency. It will not be possible to prepare for this test and it will be completed on our assessment day.

We also request the pupil’s most recent set of reports and will ask schools for a reference for each applicant. International pupils will take tests in Maths and English.

Admission to Year 8

Pupils will be asked to sit Maths and English tests and we will require school reports and a reference.

Admission to Year 9

Assessments comprise an online assessment which will assess quantitative and non-verbal reasoning ability, as well as English proficiency. It will not be possible to prepare for this test and it will be completed on our assessment day. We also request the pupil’s most recent set of reports and will ask schools for a reference for each applicant. International pupils will take tests in Maths and English.

Admission to Year 10

Pupils will be asked to sit Maths and English tests and we will require school reports and a reference.

Admission to Year 11

We offer a one year Personalised Foundation Programme at Year 11. Students will be required to complete tests in Math and English and will have a virtual interview.

Admissions to Sixth Form (Year 12)

We consider each student on merit, but in general the following principles apply;

- Offers of places will be made on the basis of predicted GCSE grades.
- GCSE requirements of 3 x level 6 and 3 x level 4/5 grades.
- Current school reports will be reviewed.
- International pupils will also be required to undertake a written test in English and written papers in their chosen A Level subjects.

CURRICULUM

Nursery School

At Wellington School Nursery, we focus on Guided Play, Learning Skills and our Learning for Life Enrichment programme which includes our Balanceability programme, Forest School, Movement and Performing Arts lessons with qualified teachers, all meals and snacks, our Welly Walks, access to and use of the wider school facilities.

Years 1 to 6

The curriculum has been carefully structured to meet the intellectual, emotional, social, physical and moral development of our children. The individual subjects contained within the Prep School curriculum include:

English, Mathematics, Science, History, Geography, Art, Design Technology, Drama and Dance, Music, Computing, Sport and Physical Health, RS, Spanish (Reception to Year 6), Outdoor Learning at Forest School, (Nursery to Year 2). We believe in the importance of a broad

and balanced curriculum but recognise the fundamental importance of English and Mathematics as the essential building blocks.

Prep School pupils regularly use the facilities in the Senior School – these include the Chapel, Great Hall, the Science laboratories, the swimming pool and playing fields and the Princess Royal Sports Complex. The older children are taught in the Senior School Science Laboratories and Art Department as well as using the Music and Drama spaces.





Years 7 , 8 and 9

We aim to provide a broad a range of subjects to enable children to experience as many opportunities as possible prior to narrowing down GCSE choices. Children move around together in a class and are taught together with the exception of Maths, which is set.

Subjects taught in Year 7 and 8 are English, Mathematics, Science, Geography, History, Latin, Computer Science, RS, Music, Art, Design Technology, Drama, Sport & Physical Health and PSHEE, French/Spanish/German. Some pupils take Classics rather than Latin in Year 9. We also have an excellent Learning Support department who can support our pupils where necessary.

Years 10 and 11

A wide variety of subjects are taken at GCSE level. Mathematics, English Language and English Literature are compulsory. The IGCSE is studied in some subjects, including Mathematics. Separate Sciences can be selected, and the remaining subjects chosen from those studied in Year 9, as well as Greek, Business and PE. There is also a BTEC in Applied Science as an option.

Year 11 – Personalised Foundation Programme

We offer a dedicated programme for students from outside the UK to complete appropriate courses in Mathematics and English alongside other qualifications which suit personal interests and goals. This is a fully flexible programme which is moulded to the individual student and provides a route into Sixth Form.

Sixth Form (Year 12)

Our Sixth Form students have a choice of over 20 academic subjects, in addition to BTECs in Sport, Applied Science and Business (equivalent to 2 A levels). Students have a high level of independence, as well as extensive enrichment, leadership and careers opportunities and an impressive array of co-curricular options. Our Sixth Form Centre offers a space akin to a university student union and we recognise that our students are young adults and treat them as such – both inside and outside the classroom.

In addition, a wide range of Sixth Form trips are available to broaden their horizons and present opportunities for personal growth and development.



BOARDING

We offer boarding from Year 7 and accommodate students in 3 well-appointed houses located in close proximity to the main campus. Boarders are an integral part of the life of the School and there are many weekend and evening activities as well as dedicated prep time. Flexi and weekly boarding is also available.

International Admissions

Wellington School welcomes applicants who live overseas. Our vibrant and busy seven-day-a-week boarding community allows pupils to integrate and make the most of all the excellent opportunities available at our school.

We have a limited number of places for short-term applications and these are usually for a minimum of one term for students who wish to improve their English.

Parents living overseas must appoint a guardian for their son or daughter who will have authority to act on behalf of the parents if necessary and to make arrangements for time away from school, travel and in case of emergency.

Visa Information

Wellington School is a Child Student Visa Sponsor and we welcome pupils from every nationality. We will ensure your visa application runs smoothly and to start this process, we will need:

- A copy of the pupil's passport
- A copy of their birth certificate (translated)
- Full home address
- Signed contract with the School and receipt of the deposit

Please do not send us the originals of these documents as you will need them once we have accepted you on to your chosen course and issued your CAS (Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies).





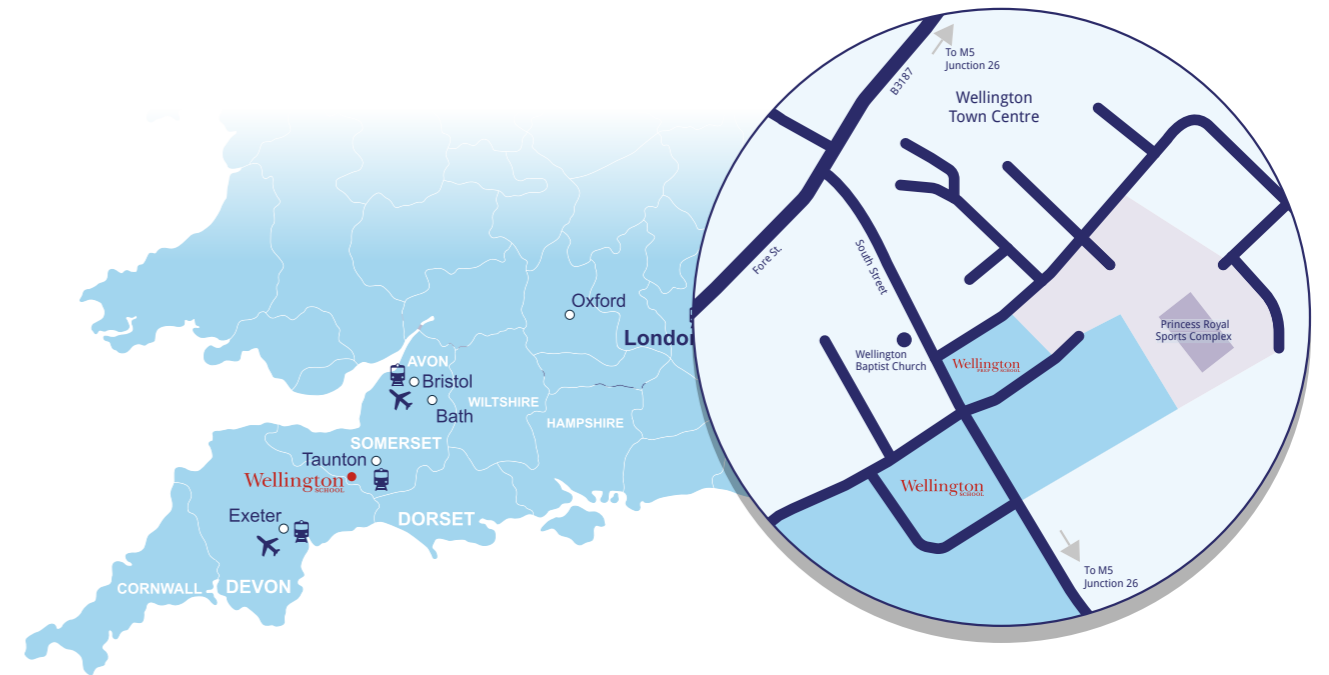

HOW TO FIND US



By Road

From the M5 Northbound and Southbound, leave at junction 26 (signposted Wellington) then at the slip-road roundabout, take the exit signposted Taunton and Wellington. At the next roundabout, take the 1st exit onto West Buckland Road (A38 - signposted Exeter and Tiverton). Continue 1 mile until you enter the 40mph speed restriction zone. At the staggered junction, turn right into Pyles Thorne Road (signposted Wellington – light vehicles only). Go through the traffic calming systems and over the first mini roundabout, Wellington Senior School is on your left – turn in through the gates and park at Reception on the right.

For Wellington Prep School, continue to the second mini roundabout and turn right. The Prep School is on the corner.

By Air

Bristol International Airport and Exeter Airport are both less than one hour's drive from the School. London Heathrow Airport has a direct National Express coach service linking it to Wellington (journey time 3 hours).

By Rail

Rail links from London Paddington to Taunton Station are excellent. (15 minutes by taxi to the School.)

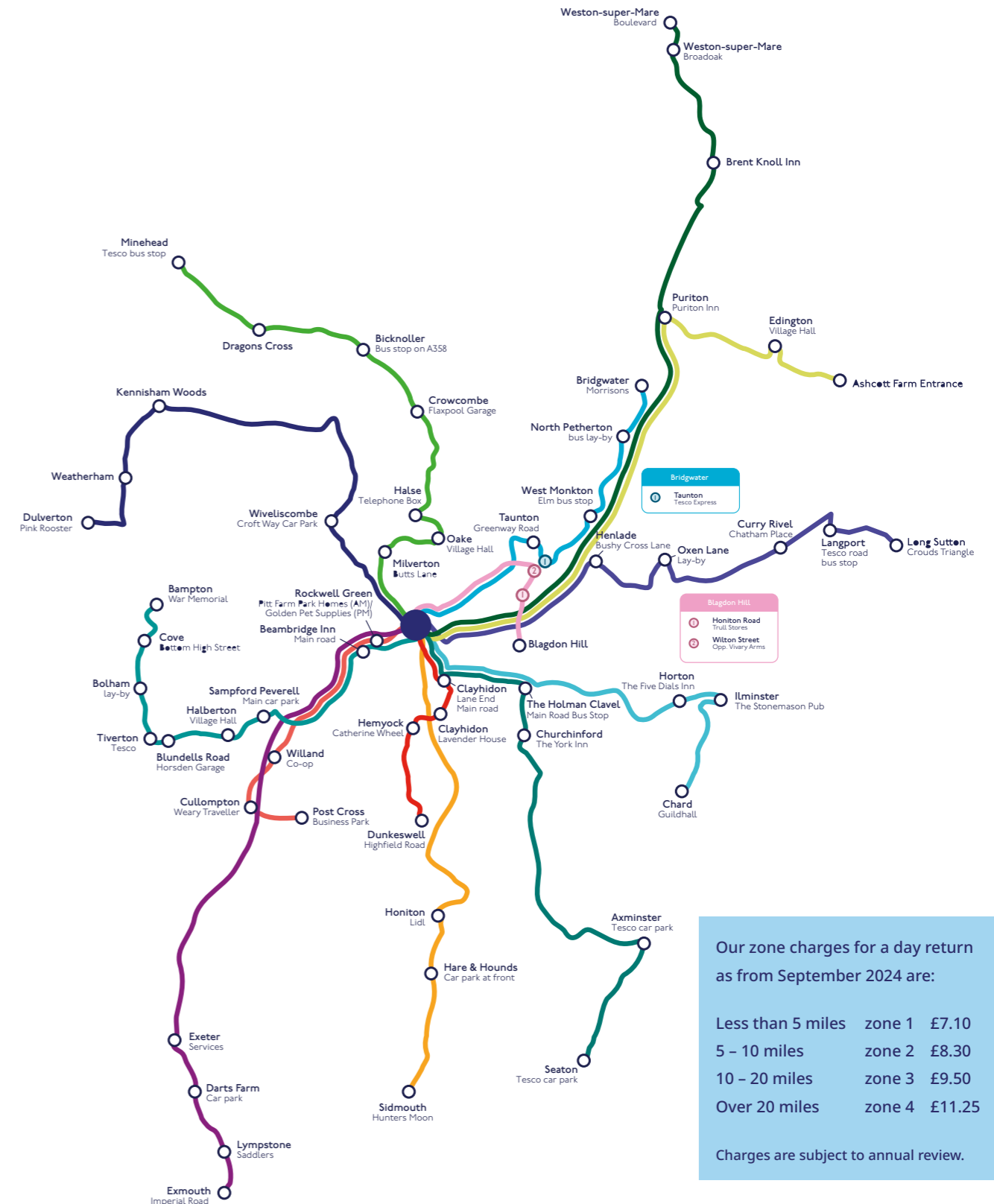

SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

Scholarships

Each year, the School offers a number of scholarships for those entering Year 7, 9 and the Sixth Form. These consist of fee remissions of typically between 5-20%.

Scholarships are available in the following disciplines

Academic, Sport, Music (including Choral), Drama, Performing Arts, Art / Design Technology. For each discipline, assessments, auditions or further interviews will take place. Please ask for specific details of each level of entry.

Music Exhibitions

A number of music exhibitions are awarded each year. These are open to all ages and consist of free tuition in one instrument while the pupils remain at the School. Auditions for these are held at the same time as the scholarship assessments.

Bursaries

Means-tested bursaries are available to all parents and are allocated according to need and individual financial circumstances. Bursary forms are available from the Director of Finance

Forces bursaries are also available to pupils whose parents are current serving members of HM Forces.

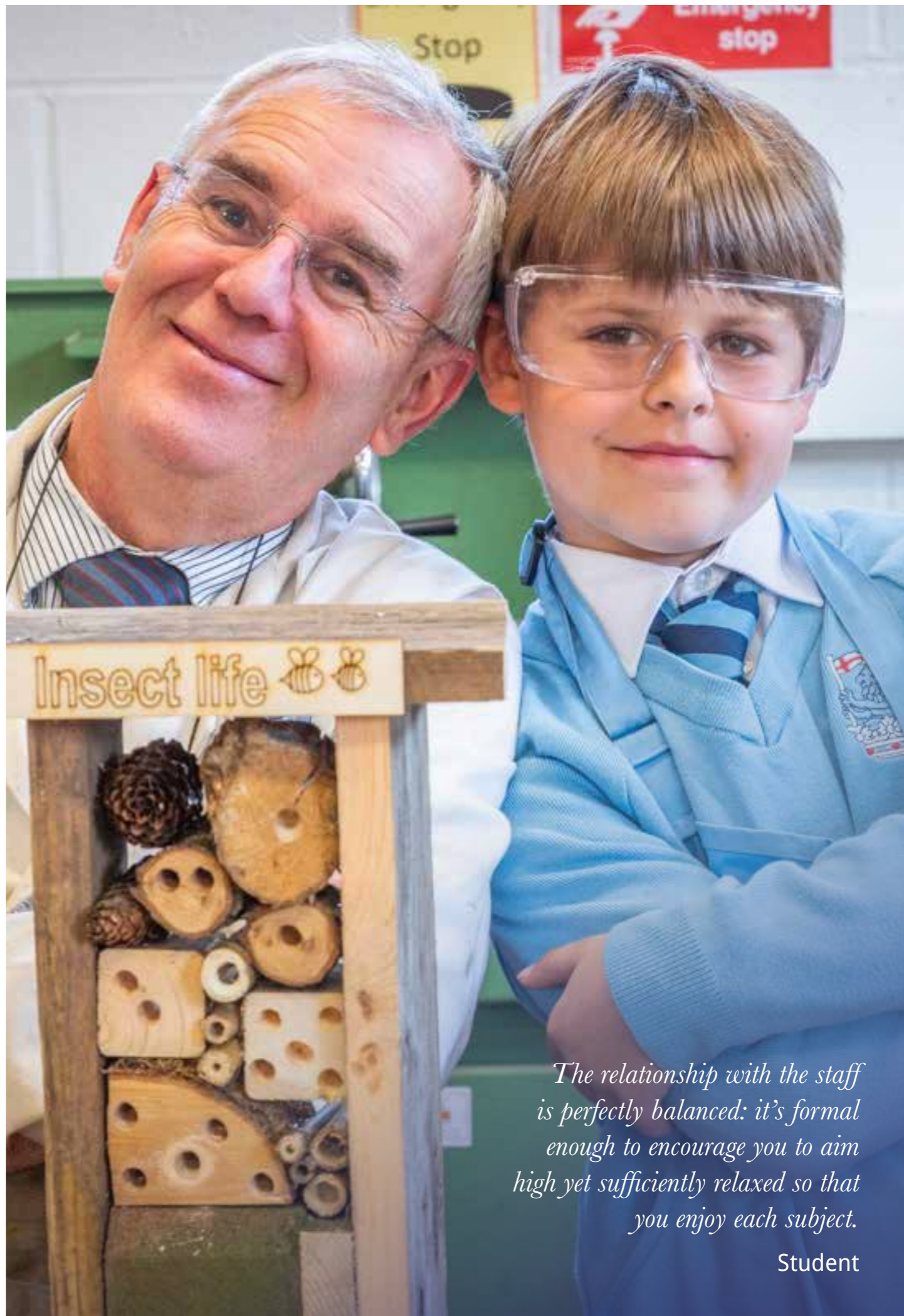
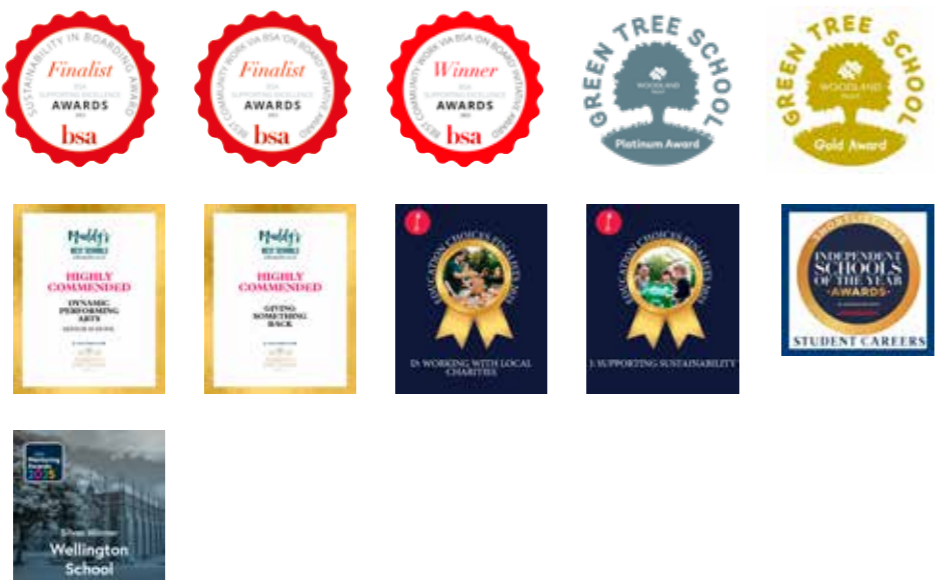
