



# THE REDDING REDISTRICTING IMPACT ON BSD

The Redding Consortium for Educational Equity is recommending changes to school district boundaries in Northern New Castle County. This decision will significantly impact BSD students and families.

## BSD STATED CONCERNS



### GOVERNANCE

Redding Consortium proposes to reduce the number of school districts serving students currently residing in the City of Wilmington from five (5) to two (2) or three (3). The Consortium is not proposing to make any changes to the 16 charter schools or 4 vo-tech schools that serve students in the City of Wilmington. Why?



### FUNDING

What is the fiscal impact to Brandywine taxpayers? Will it lead to a local tax increase or spreading out existing resources without additional funding?



### BSD FEEDER PATTERNS

Considering BSD's successful integration model of diverse schools, and that many of our school buildings are at capacity, will the expansion of our school district boundaries force us to redraw feeder patterns and create new integration plans?



### DATA & PLAN

Where is the data showing that changing school district boundaries and/or consolidation of school districts improves outcomes for students and families? Where is the comprehensive plan for families and educators to read?

## Redding Consortium / Redistricting Proposals

**Northern New Castle County Consolidated School District**

Merges all 4 districts and Wilmington into 1 school district.

**Metropolitan Wilmington School District**

Merges Brandywine & Red Clay, plus Wilmington portions of Christina and Colonial.

Brandywine and Red Clay would combine to be 1 school district.

Existing Boundaries      River Model      MODIFIED River Model

Brandywine & Red Clay remain as separate school districts.
