## *What We Are Learning*

Our theatre students are diving into a cold reading of the hilarious mash-up play “Seussical of Romeo and Juliet.” As they read, they’re learning how to think like real theatre designers—marking lighting and sound cues, and brainstorming everything from costumes and sets to props that would bring this playful story to life on stage.

After exploring the script, students will take their creativity even further by designing their own set, costume, prop, sound, and lighting plots—just like professional theatre designers do in the real world! This hands-on experience helps students understand the full artistic process behind a production.

## *Talk About Learning*

Ask your child to explain their design choices or share their sketches.

Helping them gather inspiration from photos, theatre videos, or live performances.

Donating simple crafting materials (cardboard, fabric scraps, markers, etc.) for classroom design work.
