FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

Full tuition is provided to NROTC-hosted colleges and universities to include many non-hosted. Coverage also includes all mandatory fees imposed by the school on full-time undergraduate students. Stipends in the amount of \$750 a year will be provided per academic year. Students will receive uniforms and will attend three summer cruises. Students will receive a monthly stipend based on their class status: Freshmen - \$250, Sophomore - \$300, Junior - \$350, Senior - \$400.




MORE THAN A COLLEGE DEGREE

The benefits of NROTC are much farther reaching than the substantial financial assistance. The program also gives its participants direction, purpose and, most importantly, a future career. As a Marine option midshipman, you will take additional naval science courses that will teach you the intricacies of naval and amphibious warfare. You will spend your first two summers learning about the Navy and Marine Corps. In your third summer, you will spend six weeks attending Marine Officer Candidates School in Quantico, VA.

REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for NROTC, you must:

- Be a citizen of the United States
- Be eligible for a security clearance
- Have reached your 17th birthday by September 1st of your high school graduation year
- Not have reached your 21st birthday by June 30th of the year you begin participation in NROTC (age waivers must be granted on a month-by-month basis for those with prior active military service)
- Be physically qualified in accordance with the standards prescribed for midshipmen (the nature of the NROTC Scholarship Program requires the highest medical standards)
- Be a high school graduate or possess an equivalent certificate
- Plan to participate in no less than four years in the program and meet all requirements for commissioning
- Have no moral obligations or personal convictions that will prevent your conscientiously bearing arms and supporting and defending the Constitution of the United States against all enemies, foreign and domestic

THE BASIC SCHOOL

At OCS, you will have learned that desire coupled with the right tools makes for a powerful leader. At The Basic School, you will become an expert in the use of those tools. You will spend six intense months learning everything you need to know to be a combat leader of Marines. From classroom setting to practical applications, the training will be thorough. Only then can you be sure you will make the right decisions when you only have a split second to do so. Because in a real-life situation, you are not dealing with hypotheticals. You are guarding people's lives.

GROUND

This is the backbone of the Marine Corps. We respond quickly with decisive force, and have never returned from battle without a victory. Protecting that legacy will require you to act quickly, and think even faster. Our primary mission is close combat ground war, so this is where the majority of Marines operate. From start to finish, every Marine in your command will look to you for instruction and guidance. It is a take-charge job with a lot at stake, but that's the essence of leadership in the Corps.



AIR

As a Marine Corps Aviator, you will be among the few people in the world qualified to wear the wings of gold. You will push your own limits and those of our aircraft as you carry out the mission of Marine Aviation - that of close air support for ground troops. With some aircraft capable of doubling the speed of sound, and often no more than 500 feet off the ground, you will help clear the way for Marines advancing toward a target. Our ground troops are known as the tip of the spear, which means our pilots are at the forefront of every operation.
