WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

MONEY THAT THE FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT GIVES OR LOANS TO STUDENTS

The financial information provided on applications is used to calculate a family's Student Aid Index (SAI). The SAI, in combination with the student's Cost of Attendance (COA), is used to determine financial aid eligibility/need.

FAFSA VS CADAA

FREE APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STUDENT AID


- Financial Aid from the federal government
- For students with SSN or eligible non-citizens
- Access to Cal Grant, Pell Grant and direct loans

CALIFORNIA DREAM ACT APPLICATION

- Financial Aid from the state government
- For students without SSN, or with Temporary Protected Status (TPS), or U-Visa holder [with AB540 status]
- Access to Cal Grant and some institutional scholarships

CSS PROFILE

COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP SERVICE

- 
- Additional application required by Private or Out-of-State colleges to determine a student's eligibility for non-federal institutional aid
 - Asks for additional information
 - Home equity, income and assets from non-custodial parents
 - Retirement plans
 - cssprofile.collegeboard.org

TYPES OF AID & THEIR DIFFERENCES



WHAT ARE THE TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID?

SCHOLARSHIPS

- based on need or merit
- does not need to be paid back
- usually an application process

GRANTS

- does not need to be paid back
- each grant has different requirements
- some are granted without an application process

WORKSTUDY

- students work part-time and use their income to pay tuition, fees, etc.
- allows students to gain experience while in school

LOANS

- borrowed money, needs to be paid back
- can be private or federal; subsidized or unsubsidized

SUBSIDIZED & UNSUBSIDIZED LOANS

SUBSIDIZED

Given to undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need

Federal Government pays for the interest while student is in school



UNSUBSIDIZED

Offered to all students (undergraduate, graduate, etc.)

Interest is paid by the student/borrower while in school



CAL-GRANT A

CAL-GRANT A

- GPA Minimum: 3.0
- Degree Requirement
 - B.A. Degree Program
- Pays tuition & fees for UP TO 4 YEARS at eligible schools in CA
 - 48 semester units
- Students attending Community College can reserve \$ until they transfer

Maximum Yearly for Cal Grant A

Community College: Reserve to \$6,000

CSU: \$6,084

UC: \$12,570* and up

Private/non-profit: \$9,358

(Non-WASC) For Profit: \$4,000

(WASC) For Profit: \$8,056

CAL-GRANT B

DISCLAIMER: These numbers are not guaranteed for all students. These are the ABSOLUTE MAXIMUM a student MAY receive under this grant.

CAL-GRANT B

- GPA Minimum: 2.0
- Degree Requirement
 - 24 Semester Units (1 Yr. Program)
 - Certificate, Associate, or Baccalaureate Degree
- Pays tuition & fees in years 2, 3, and 4 at eligible schools in CA
 - Can be renewed up to 8 yrs with current or former Foster Youth

Maximum Yearly for Cal Grant B

Community College: \$1,648 up to 2 years

CSU: \$6,084 + \$1,648

UC: \$12,570* + \$1,648

Private/non-profit: \$9,358 + \$1,648

(Non-WASC) For Profit: \$4,000 + \$1,648

(WASC) For Profit: \$8,056 + \$1,648

CAL-GRANT C

DISCLAIMER: These numbers are not guaranteed for all students. These are the ABSOLUTE MAXIMUM a student MAY receive under this grant.

CAL-GRANT C

- GPA Minimum: none!
- Degree Requirement
 - At least 4 months in length up to 24 months
 - Occupational or technical program
- Award covers up to:
 - CA CC: \$1,656 (books/supplies)
 - CTE: \$2,462 (tuition/fees) + \$547 (books/supplies)
- Must be used at eligible school in California

Maximum Yearly for Cal Grant C

Community College: \$1,094

CSU: N/A

UC: N/A

Private/non-profit: B/S \$547, T/F: \$2,462

Private For profit: B/S \$547, T/F: \$2,462

STUDENT SUCCESS COMPLETION GRANT

If you are a FULL TIME STUDENT (12 units or more) at a community college, you may be eligible for up to \$8,000/year in aid!

How to get this grant:

- Complete the FAFSA or CADAA and receive Cal-Grant B or C
- Have a minimum 2.0 GPA and maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress
- Have sufficient unmet financial need
- Maintain Full Time Attendance (12+ Units)

12-14.99 units/semester
= \$1,298/semester
(\$2,596 per year)

15+ units/semester =
\$4,000/semester
(\$8,000 per year)

CALIFORNIA PROMISE GRANT

Want to have two, free years of higher education? If you're attending a CA Community College, remember to fill out your CCPG Application!

How to get this grant:

- Ensure your CC is CCPG Eligible
- Complete the FAFSA or CADAA
- Apply for the Promise Grant at your Community College
- Must be a California Resident

SPECIFIC GRANT ELIGIBLE SCHOOLS

GAVILAN PROMISE

SALINAS VALLEY PROMISE

Gavilan College Eligibility.

- Graduate HS or Adult School
- 1st time college student
- CA resident or AB540 eligible
- 12+ units, FAFSA/CADAA completion

Hartnell College Eligibility.

- Graduate HS or Adult School
- 1st time college student
- CA resident or AB540 eligible
- 12+ units, FAFSA/CADAA completion

What you get

- 2 free years
- Academic support, Textbook grant, Priority Registration

What you get

- 2 free years
- Professional development, Mentoring, Free laptop or book vouchers

FEDERAL PELL GRANT

Undergraduate students who display exceptional need can be awarded up to \$7,395! This grant is on a first come, first served basis - so be sure to fill out your application ASAP!

How to get this grant:

- Be an incoming undergraduate student
- Complete FAFSA

OTHER GRANTS TO BE AWARE OF!

CHAFEE GRANT FOR FOSTER YOUTH STUDENTS

Eligibility/Requirements:

- Be a verified Foster Youth by CA Dept of Social Services
- Complete the FAFSA/CADAA
- Fill out one-time Chafee Grant App

Note:

The Chafee Grant Pays \$5000 annually to students who were in foster care during ages 16-18.

Maximum Participation: 5 Years

MIDDLE CLASS SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility/Requirements:

- Be a CA resident attending a UC, CSU, or CCC Bachelor's degree program
- US Citizen, permanent resident, or meet AB540
- Must meet certain income/asset and other Financial Aid standards

Note:

Students may receive this award for up to 4 years, depending on their education level when grant is awarded.

CADAA SERVICE INCENTIVE GRANT

CADAA students are encouraged to complete community service and one of 1,667 students to be awarded up to \$4,500 per academic year

How to get this grant:

- Apply to CADAA
- Be awarded Cal-Grant A and/or eligible for Cal-Grant B
- Be enrolled in a qualifying institution
- Volunteer for an eligible organization

WHAT YOU'LL NEED TO COMPLETE YOUR APPLICATION:


FAFSA:

- your Social Security Number
- your parent or guardian's Social Security Number (if applicable)
- your non-school email address
- your parent or guardian's Tax Documents from 2024, 1040 (if filed) or W2s
- student transcripts


CADAA:

- enrollment in a CA High School for 3+ years (AB 540 Status)
- your parent or guardian's Social Security Number (If applicable)
- your parent or guardian's Tax Documents, if applicable



There are three portions you will need to fill out in order to receive Financial Aid.

NOTE: Being a contributor does NOT make you financially responsible for the student's educational fees.

HOWEVER, if a parent/guardian refuses to give their information, the student will be ineligible for any financial assistance.

HOW DOES CADAA DIFFER TO FAFSA?



IF YOU ARE A CADAA RECIPIENT, YOU ARE **ONLY** ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE STATE AID. THIS MEANS YOU ARE ELIGIBLE FOR THESE FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS:



- UC/STATE UNIVERSITY GRANTS
- CA COLLEGE PROMISE GRANT
- STUDENT SUCCESS COMPLETION GRANT
- CHAFEE GRANT
- EOP/EOPS
- CAL-GRANT
- MIDDLE CLASS SCHOLARSHIP
- PRIVATE SCHOLARSHIPS ADMINISTERED BY CAMPUSES

DACAA recipients might be eligible for some work-study programs, check with your school!

AB 540 – CA STATE REQUIREMENTS

- HIGH SCHOOL

OPTION B

3 YEARS ATTENDANCE (OR EQUIVALENT) AT ANY OF THESE SCHOOLS IN CALIFORNIA:



- ADULT SCHOOL
- COMMUNITY COLLEGE

FULFILL ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- GRADUATE FROM A CALIFORNIA HIGH SCHOOL
- OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION, GED, HISET OR TASC IN CALIFORNIA
- ATTAIN AN ASSOCIATE DEGREE FROM A CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE
- FULFILL MINIMUM TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS FOR A UC OR CSU

- **APPLY TO AT LEAST ONE CALIFORNIA COLLEGE**
 - EVEN IF YOU' RE ABSOLUTELY SURE YOU' LL BE GOING OUT OF STATE!
- **APPLY REGARDLESS OF INCOME**
 - DON' T ASSUME YOU CAN' T OR WON' T GET ANY AID
- **CREATE ONE PROFESSIONAL EMAIL FOR ALL APPLICATIONS**
 - KEEPING ALL IMPORTANT INFORMATION IN ONE AREA MAKES IT EASY TO FIND WHEN NECESSARY
- **APPLY EARLY!**
 - AS OF NOW, STUDENTS CAN APPLY FOR FIN. AID STARTING OCT. FIRST!




