Our School

Mira Loma High School, a California Distinguished School educating International Baccalaureate students since 1991, is one of nine high schools in San Juan Unified School District. MLHS prides itself on its seven distinctive programs including: International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program (MYP), International Baccalaureate Diploma (DP), International Baccalaureate Career-related Programme (IBCP), International Studies (IS), Career Technical Education (CTE), English Learner (EL) and Special Education. MLHS serves 475 EL students (majority Middle Eastern, Russian and Ukrainian refugees), and 145 Special Education students. MLHS’s programs have created a dynamic magnet for students in our neighborhood as well as it’s surrounding cities. Known for our inclusive environment, MLHS brings together the brightest and hardest working students in the region with the most diversity of thought and background. Through our work with Equal Opportunity Schools (EOS), we are proud of our growing number of student enrolling in challenging advanced level courses. MLHS is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, receiving a 6-year accreditation in 2023. In 2023 MLHS began receiving additional funding to bridge educational gaps through the Federal Title 1 program.

Our Community & Students

MLHS is a comprehensive public high school, serves 1695 students, 385 of whom are in our Class of 2026. Mira Loma prides itself on its ethnic and culturally diverse community, made up of approximately 25+ ethnicities and 38 languages. MLHS sits in a well-established neighborhood with a mixture of urban and suburban areas. Adding to our diversity is our districts “Open Enrollment” policy that allows students to attend any of the nine high schools in the district. 62% of students come from a socioeconomically disadvantaged background. MLHS IB students are academically driven in the rigorous IB coursework and their independent MYP Personal Projects and DP extended Extended Essays. IB students show compassion and global awareness through their Creativity, Action & Service hours. Approximately a third of the IB students travel from other communities to belong to the MLHS IB Program, the **most well established and successful IB Program in the region.**

IB Diploma: Test in 6 IB Diploma subjects; complete 150 Creativity, Action and Service Hours; write original Extended Essay (4,000 words).

IB MYP: Complete 8 subjects; complete 40 community service hours; create an original Personal Project and Report.

International Studies Diploma: Complete all IS coursework; complete all A-G coursework; complete 100 Community Service Hours.

Grading

Class Ranking: Mira Loma High School **does not rank** it's students.

GPA: Classes are graded on a four-point scale (A=4, B=3, C=2, D=1). IB Courses are graded to align with internationally established standards. For IB, Honors and AP courses, one point is added (A=5, B=4, etc.). Weighted and unweighted grade point averages are reported on the transcript. If a course is repeated, the higher grade is calculated into the GPA.
