Students were invited to consider what was in their invisible backpack and to then share what they thought might be in the backpacks of their friends, their parents and also of the maids, guards and a family who is supported by Jungle Aid. This exercise helps us focus on and develop our empathy, and invites us to walk in someone else's shoes. We left the assembly with this message: we all share the privilege of being members of the HHIS community... It's our collective responsibility to ensure our actions leave positive ripples.

That positive action can be as simple as saying good morning to the security guards as we come into school. Or it can be a more concrete positive action like helping others with donations. We have all been moved by the dreadful news of the floods coming from Hat Yai, and other parts of South East Asia. We hope that the friends and families of the HHIS community who may have been affected are safe. Thank you to all our school community for our continued support. The Sawang Hua Hin Tham Satarn Foundation will be collecting your donations tomorrow afternoon to transport them down to the affected communities.

The positive actions of our community have also been demonstrated with the overwhelming number of shoeboxes collected this year - 317 in total! It is a wonderful yearly tradition at HHIS to donate shoeboxes of gifts for children who are less fortunate in support of the Jungle Aid Foundation. Jungle Aid came to collect the boxes this morning and they will all be distributed to children in the villages supported by Jungle Aid. Again, many thanks to our wonderful community for their support for this initiative.

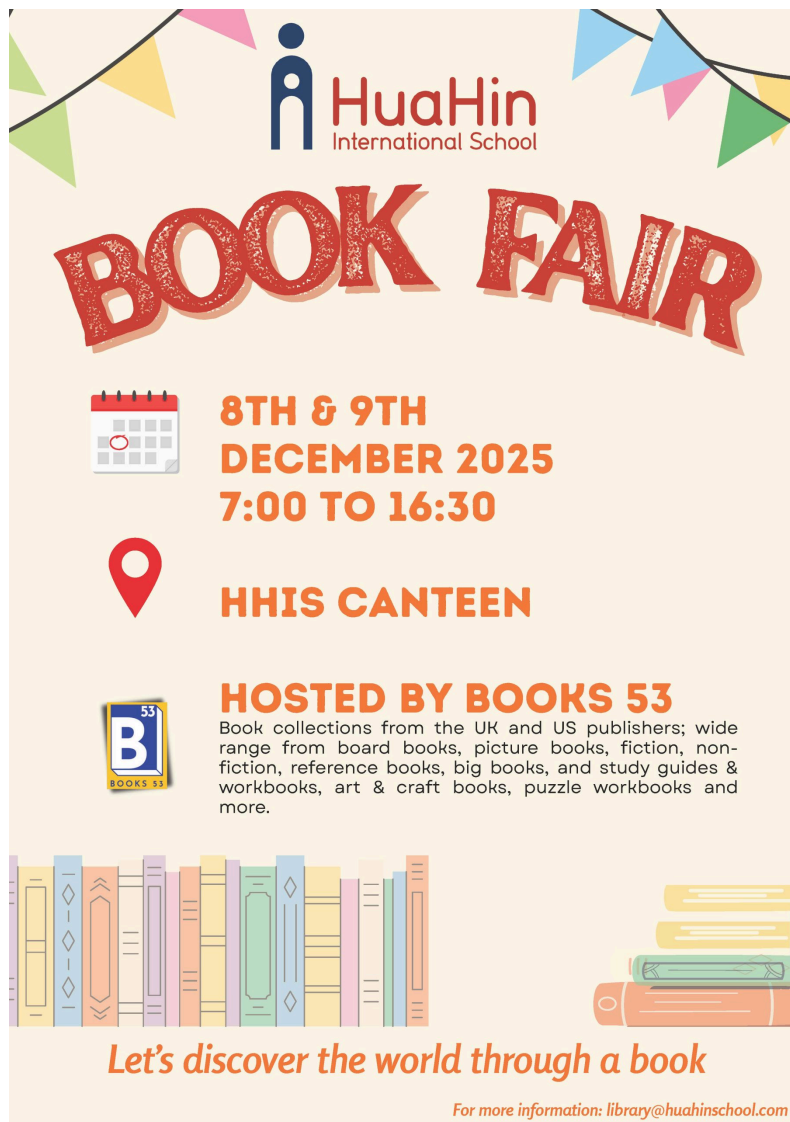

How Unequal Resources Shape Our World: A Year 6 Simulation

Year 6 has been inquiring into the unequal distribution of natural resources around the world. To help make links to the real world and consolidate their learning, they played a Global Trade Simulation Game. The game involved six countries, each with its own different natural resources, strengths, weaknesses, and needs, with the resources being unevenly distributed. Each country had four different representatives with different roles. For each round, the children had to have a domestic meeting to decide what resource they needed to trade and with which country. There was then a period of Open Trading where countries had to agree on the terms of trade and write up a contract. This contract was then taken to the Global Trade Committee for approval or cancellation. Each country had to pay for its food production and energy. After each round, there were also unexpected global events that affected different countries, which were either rewarded or penalised. This simulation provided

students with valuable insight into how the unequal distribution of natural resources affects countries and why they need to engage in trade.
