The first day in the beautiful athletics stadium was unusually cold, but the action soon heated up as the Hawks took flight on the track. Thrilling sprint finishes, powerful throws and impressive jumps led to multiple visits to the FOBISIA podium. In the pool, our swimmers quickly found their rhythm, and the growing team spirit helped push many into medal positions.

Year 5 - Our Community's Water Story

We were very pleased to welcome Victor's dad, Mr. Harald Elisson to Year 5 recently. As the Managing Director at Black Mountain Golf Club, he shared insights into how the club manages and supplies water - not only for the golf course, but also for the surrounding villas and for our school.

His presentation gave the children a clearer understanding of where our local water comes from, how it is stored, and the careful processes involved in treating and distributing it. He also explained the challenges of managing water in a sustainable way, especially during the dry season, linking perfectly to our Big Idea: "Water is a limited resource that people use in different ways."

It was a brilliant opportunity for the students to connect their learning to our local context. We are very grateful to Mr. Elisson for taking the time to support our inquiry and deepen the children's understanding.



Primary Acts of Kindness

In PSHE this term, the children have been exploring the importance of kindness and how small actions can make a big difference. Through discussions, stories and role-play, they have learnt that being kind not only helps others feel valued and supported, but also has a positive impact on their own wellbeing.

The classes talked about how kindness can strengthen friendships, create a happier school environment, and help everyone feel safe and included. The children also shared examples of "random acts of kindness" they could try at school and at home - such as offering help to someone who is struggling, including others in games, or giving a genuine compliment. Lara, Leo and Jerran, in Year 2, were all caught bee-ing kind, while Kirill, Noah and Miron, in Year 6 managed to complete 100 acts of kindness!
