School Community. Robbinsdale Cooper High School [RCHS] is a four-year, comprehensive high school located in New Hope, MN, a first ring, northwest suburb of Minneapolis, Minnesota. RCHS is one of two high schools in the Robbinsdale Area School District and is accredited by the North Central Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools. The two high schools serve students in the following communities: Brooklyn Center, Brooklyn Park, Crystal, Golden Valley, Minneapolis, New Hope, Plymouth, and Robbinsdale.

RCHS offers programs to prepare students for technical, two-year and four-year colleges, as well as employment directly after high school. Serving a diverse student population of approximately 1500 students, areas of study include general courses, college preparatory courses, special education courses, International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program, and International Baccalaureate Diploma Program [IB]. Students may also choose to participate in the Post-Secondary Education Options Program [PSEO], attending technical, two- or four-year colleges. Robbinsdale also offers multiple opportunities for apprenticeships and college in the schools (CIS) through our R Pathways Program.

Curriculum. A comprehensive curriculum is available to students. Areas of study include: art, business and marketing education, English and language arts, family and consumer science, global languages, health, mathematics, music, theater, physical education, science, and social studies.

Transcript Information. Information on the transcript is listed by school year. The year earned, course number, class title, grade, and credits earned are listed for each class. Information included is cumulative GPA and class rank.

Ranking

A final grade is assigned at the end of the semester for each course. All grades are **unweighted**. We do not report rank unless requested by the student. All grades are figured into the GPA, with the exception of the P grade, which counts as a credit, but is not figured into the GPA. Honor Rolls are calculated by semester.

Honors- Top 20% of students based on cumulative GPA [Gr 9-12]

High Honors- Top 10% of students based on cumulative GPA [Gr 9-12]

Highest Honors- Top 1% of students based on cumulative GPA [Gr 9-12]

Testing

Copies of students' PSAT, ACT, SAT I & II, AP, and IB scores can be sent to colleges with the application for admission upon request of the student. All students in 11th grade have the opportunity to take the ACT. The mean ACT scores for the graduating Class of 2025 are: English 14.9, Math 15.7, Reading 17.7, Science 17.6, and Composite 16.6. Average IB score for 2024-25 for all students is 3.85 on 1 – 7 scale.
