Enter one or more pieces in these three categories:

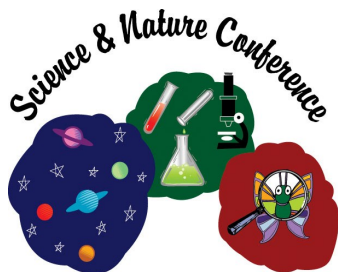

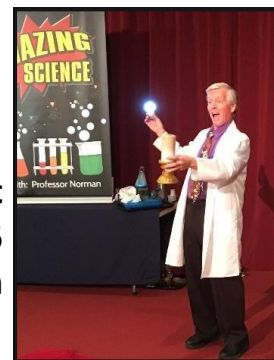
