The LASSO Early Childhood program is designed for young learners who demonstrate characteristics of autism. The program provides a highly structured and visually supported environment that fosters communication, social interaction, and early learning skills. Using the principles of structured teaching, LASSO EC helps students develop foundational skills that support growth, independence, and positive engagement in school settings.

ABOUT SEDOL & LASSO EC

SEDOL is a dynamic and comprehensive cooperative educational system partnering with 31 local school districts to serve their students facing physical, cognitive, emotional, and other learning challenges. Our mission is to provide "Exceptional Services for Exceptional Students by Exceptional Staff."

The LASSO EC program is a SEDOL program that has been designed for those students who exhibit characteristics of Autism. A LASSO EC student requires a highly structured and visual environment that utilizes the structured teaching methodology.



INSTRUCTION

- **Gross Motor Opportunities:** Utilize the shared building amenities of the hosting district building. Students have access to a gross motor room and playground.
- **Student-to-Staff Ratio:** Students receive instruction in a maximum class size of 8 students with 1 teacher and 1-2 paraprofessionals. This small staff-to-student ratio provides a level of support needed to make gains based on the needs of the students.
- **Structured Teaching:** Rotations-based instruction in a highly visual environment
- **Direct Instruction:** Evidence-based teaching focused on skill mastery
- **Push-In Model:** Related Services provide services directly in the classroom setting to support skill generalization in real environments
- **Dynamic Program Design:** We build programs that grow with students, adjusting supports and goals to meet their evolving needs and strengths.
