Grade Point Averages

Cumulative GPA is computed over all upper school courses. Numeric grades reported on transcripts are unweighted. Honors courses are weighted with .5 quality point and AP courses with 1 quality point in GPA calculation.

Grade Point System

Student GPA is weighted on a 5.0 scale.

Examples:

100%: AP = 6, Pre-AP/Honors = 5.5, College Prep = 5
95%: AP = 5.5, Pre-AP/Honors = 5, College Prep = 4.5
90%: AP = 5, Pre-AP/Honors = 4.5, College Prep = 4

The Academic Program

Woodlands Christian maintains a rigorous college preparatory curriculum. 100% of our graduates are admitted to four-year colleges or universities. The curriculum in the upper school includes college preparatory, honors, Pre-AP and Advanced Placement courses. Students must maintain a minimum average grade of 85% in Honors and Pre-AP courses or 93% in a college prep course for AP course consideration. *The Woodlands Christian Academy is designated as an AP Gold Honor Roll School by College Board.
