- Amherst Regional High School (ARHS) is a four-year comprehensive regional school with an enrollment of 800–850 students and a 12:1 student-faculty ratio. 93% of faculty hold master's or doctoral degrees.
- Amherst is a vibrant college town in the Connecticut River Valley, with a population of 39,263. It is located 87 miles west of Boston and 23 miles north of Springfield. The town is home to Amherst College, the University of Massachusetts, and Hampshire College, with Mount Holyoke and Smith Colleges nearby.

Advanced Programs Offered

- Honors Curriculum/Course offered in all academic classes**

- ARHS offers a rigorous college-preparatory curriculum. Students complete at least **21 credits per year**, including five academic subjects plus health, physical education, and electives
- 4x4 semester block schedule:** *courses offered as quarter, semester, three quarter, or full year options*

- ARHS reports an unweighted GPA (standard 4.0 scale)
- Excludes: Physical Education, ungraded ALPs, academic support courses, 4-year college level courses (OR except community college dual enrollment)
- GPA does not include classes transferred from other high schools
