Job Title: High School Science Teacher

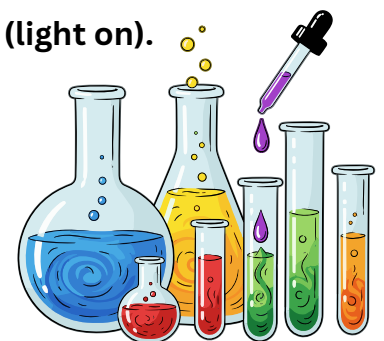
Favorite color- Navy

To see a student's face glow after learned something new (light on).

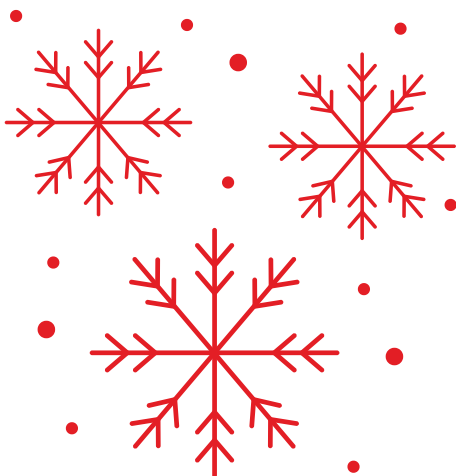




Middle School Social Studies Class: They have been learning about Australia, so they tried using their hands for Aboriginal Dot Art. Look at their work! Amazing!

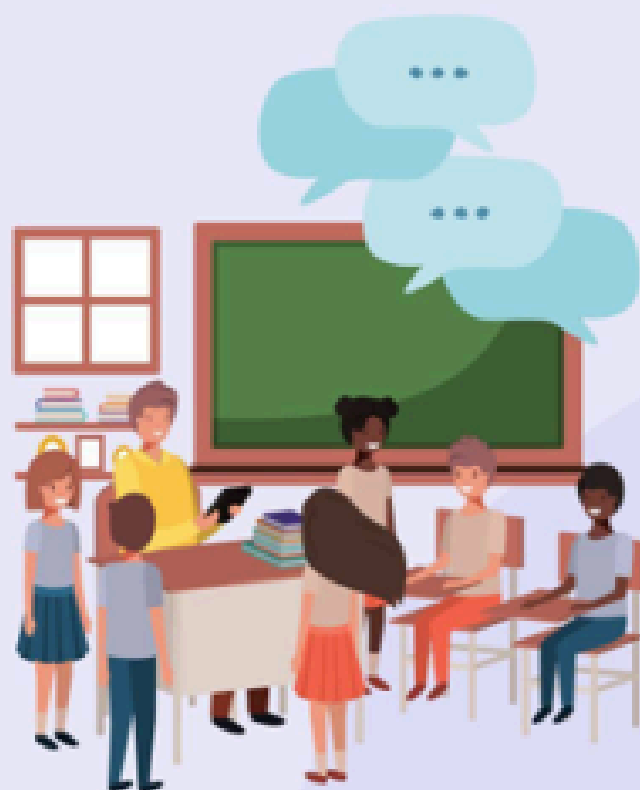
