
Module 4: Letter Sounds

Letter	Sound
Uu	/u/ (short u sound) as in up 
Kk	/k/ as in kangaroo 
Ss	Plural /s/ as in sun Plural /z/ as in dogs 
Yy	/y/ as in yarn 
Xx	/ks/ as in box 
Ee	/e/ (short e sound) as in echo 



Practice Strategies:

- Create a letter scavenger hunt! Place letter cards around the house and have your child look for the letters. When they find each letter, have them say the sound and name of the letter. For extra fun, play this game using flashlights!
- Write a letter on a piece of paper or index card. Have your child build the letter using small objects such as cereal, legos, or any small toy. When they create each letter have them say the letter sound and letter name.



Module 4: Focus Words



Below you will find the focus words for Module 4 as well as some practice strategies to deepen their understanding. It is important to remember to still continue to practice previously taught words, even as new words are introduced. This will continue to strengthen your child's reading and writing skills.

Practice Strategy:

- Take your learning outside! Have your child practice writing the words in sidewalk chalk. When they spell each word, ask them to tell you the part they need to learn by heart.

Practice Strategy:

- Make the Modules words using magnet letters or letter cards. Have your child use some small objects and place them under each sound when they sound them out. Get creative with the objects. You can use small blocks, cereal, or mini erasers!
