Curriculum	South Knoll Elementary utilizes high quality curriculum documents developed by the College Station ISD Teaching and Learning Department that support student success.		
Forms of Academic Assesements	South Knoll Elementary utilizes common formative assessments in every classroom. These assessments provide teachers with information about student mastery of essential learning standards. Additionally, students in grades Kindergarten through fourth grade are administered the MAP test three times annually to track student's growth over time. Students in third and fourth grade are administered the State of Texas Assessments of Academic Readiness or (STAAR test).
