Students who are eligible to request honors should consider the additional rigor when making course decisions.

Science Placement

- Students eligible for Algebra 2 Honors, Algebra 2 CP, or Geometry Honors in 9th grade, or who are eligible for Grade 9 ELA Honors, are offered the opportunity to enroll in Biology Honors in 9th grade.
- Upon request, students who are not eligible for Algebra 2 Honors, Algebra 2 CP, or Geometry Honors in 9th grade or Grade 9 ELA Honors and who have a Semester 1 Science average of 98 or higher will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis.

Social Studies Placement

- Students eligible for ELA 9 Honors in 9th grade are offered the opportunity to enroll in Modern World History Honors in 9th grade.
- Upon request, students who do not qualify for ELA 9 Honors and are interested in taking MWH Honors will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. This review will include their Social Studies Semester 1 average, SS teacher recommendation, and the NJSLA ELA 8 score.
- Students who are currently enrolled in ELA 8 Advanced and meet **additional** requirements may choose to enroll in AP World History.
