

## Senior High School - Registration Instructions

Please refer to the **Seneca Valley Graduation Requirements** on the Senior High Counseling website to review the 24 required credits.

1. Students will enter the registration screen from their portal and be asked to identify a Pathway that aligns to future career interests.
2. Once a Pathway is indicated, students must schedule a minimum of 6.0 credits (**not including Summer School enrichment credit**). The computer will automatically enter a study hall on any schedule under 8.0 credits.
3. Many lab science courses are 1.4 credits - the theory portion requires a full year class period (1.0 credit) along with an additional 2-day per lab period (0.4 credits). Students registering for 7.4 or more credits without choosing cyber courses will need to select a lab/study hall, or split their physical education class opposite a lab, a jazz class opposite a lab, or a lab opposite a lab.
4. **Vo-Tech** - Students requesting a **Vo-Tech** program may need to schedule more than the minimum 6.0 credits to stay on track to meet graduation requirements. Enter the Vo-Tech program name and course # on your registration as one of your elective choices. **New applicants must complete a separate Vo-Tech application [HERE](#).**
5. **Internship and Employment**
  - **Seniors** will register for 5651 Fall SR Internship and Employment (1.0 elective credit) and 5652 Spring SR Internship and Employment (1.0 Social Studies credit).
  - **Juniors** will register for 5649 Fall JR Internship and Employment (1.0 elective credit) and 5650 Spring JR Internship and Employment (1.0 elective credit).
6. All required graduation courses failed or postponed in previous grades should be scheduled unless you plan to attend summer school at the end of the current school year.
7. Please click on the course description to be sure you meet all prerequisites and/or corequisites before selecting a class. Also, some courses require an application or instructor permission/audition. This must be completed before choosing the course.
8. Refer to the **Academically Advanced Courses** link to see the listing of all classes that provide additional weight to the GPA formula.
9. The substitute course section of the registration is to be filled in **completely**. Substitute courses must be different than the original requests and may be used if a scheduling conflict occurs or if a selected course is closed.
10. Students requesting a **Cyber or Cyber Blended** course(s) during the school year need to indicate the course number(s) on their registration form - **choice of semester for cyber courses cannot be guaranteed since not every cyber class is offered each semester**. If requesting **Full-time Cyber**, enter your cyber course numbers and choose the **Full-time Cyber & Early Release** box on the registration form to indicate the semester(s) you are selecting.
11. Students requesting a **Summer School Cyber** course for Acceleration or Credit Recovery need to complete the separate online Summer School Cyber application indicating the cyber classes they intend to take. Do not list the course on the school year registration form. Initially, students can only request up to 1.0 credit. Additional Summer School classes may be scheduled once successfully completing the initial credit. Refer to the **Seneca Valley Cyber Program** link for specific directions for online registration procedures.
12. **Early Release** requests are **Senior Year only** options for a 9<sup>th</sup> period OR 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> period early release - choose the **Full-time Cyber & Early Release** box on the registration form and indicate your selection. Although efforts will be made to grant this request, some course selections/class schedules will not work with an early release.
13. Course selection changes may be made through **the last day of school**.

\* Arts and humanities include courses in the following departments: foreign languages, art, music, family and consumer sciences, industrial technology, English and/or social studies.

\*\* Electives are available from all departments but may not duplicate those credits used to fulfill the two (2) credits in arts or humanities.

\*\*\* The three (3) credits of the Science requirement will consist of biology, chemistry, and a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) course.
