Alexis Tapia, CSEA, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts and the economic impact it would have on her and her family. 2) Classified employees worked hard and made sure the district stayed functioning during the COVID-19 closure.

Nora Arocho, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts affecting her family financially and emotionally.

Pablo Sainz, Classified Employee, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about how budget cuts would severely affect his family and his mental health. 2) Since the school closures, he hasn't stopped working and neither have his fellow classified employees. 3) Classified employees are the backbone of the district and should not be impacted by budget cuts.

Carmina Chavira, Employee, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about possibly losing her job and not being able to help the children because of budget cuts. 2) Classified employees do so much for the district and should not lose their jobs.

Karo Moreno, Commented: 1) Budget cuts should start with management. Why always classified employees?

Ian Gutierrez, Commented: 1) Budget cuts should start with management. Why are classified employees the first to be let go?

Claudia Contreras, Commented: 1) Believes that there are unnecessary management positions and budget cuts should start with management. 2) Think carefully about the decisions you will make because the children will be the most affected.

Alejandra Contreras, on behalf of Classified Employees, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts to classified employees. 2) Parents don't understand technology and wait until the last minute to register their children. This should be considered before cutting the core of our district. 3) If cuts are necessary, make them with the ones that are not in the classroom or helping the students.

Karina Aguilar, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts always starting with classified and not with management.

Irene E. Lopez, CSEA, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about possible cuts and the impact it would have on employee families. 2) Classified employees are the backbone of the district and should not be cut.

Juan Carlos Mendez, Commented: 1) His neighborhood caretaker is a classified employee who has worked in the San Ysidro School District for seventeen years with special needs students. 2) Everyone should be wondering how these children are going to be affected if positions are trimmed. It would be a major disservice to them. 3) This will also affect employees and some of them might have to take another job to make ends meet. 4) It saddens him to hear that the district is facing budget cuts during this turmoil. The district should be asking how we can protect the employees so they can come back stronger and build the community from the ground up, one child at a time.

Adriana Garcia, CSEA, Commented: 1) Would like to remind everyone that classified employees are the backbone of the district. 2) They have been feeding the community, registering students, making home visits and cleaning so everyone can be safe. 3) Some of the classified employees are living on one salary because their spouse lost their job. 4) Urged the Board to stop any kinds of cuts and no more cuts to classified.

Enriqueta Mendea, Classified Employee, Commented: 1) She has worked for the district for seventeen years in different positions and puts her heart into it every day. 2) She's worked with children with many behaviors, but the children keep her strong. 3) COVID-19 has changed lives and hearing about possible cuts is devastating for her and her family. 4) Classified employees are an essential part of the San Ysidro School District and are there for the children preparing them to become great citizens.

Marisol Charles, Classified Employees, Commented : 1) Classified employees are a part of students' path to success. 2) She understands that there will be cuts to education but aren't classified employees essential for students?

Marisela Gonzalez, Commented: 1) Students are struggling adjusting to distance learning on top of families being under a lot of stress because of the COVID-19 crisis. 2) Budget cuts will add more emotional and financial hardship to families, students and employees. 3) Asked the Board to take these factors into consideration before eliminating classified jobs.

Brenda Lopez, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts. 2) Students are a priority and we need our teachers. Students need to be in school getting one to one attention in a classroom. 3) Teachers and staff are affected as well. Let's work together to minimize the cuts in the wrong places.

Carmen Contreras, Community Member, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts to classified employees. They are a great help inside and outside the classroom. 2) I've seen how money gets lost at the district office with contracts that never happen. This affects the employees and children. 3) Many parents do not understand technology and register their children at the last minute. 4) Asked the Board to please consider this and not make budget cuts with classified employees. They don't deserve this.

Maria del Rocio Diaz, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about budget cuts. 2) Since she is the only provider in her family, it would be a huge impact.

Yolanda Olszewski, CSEA, Commented: 1) Asked the Board and Superintendent to consider what all the families are going through with the pandemic. 2) Possible layoffs to certificated and classified were proposed too early in her opinion.

Jaime, Commented: 1) Classified employees are the backbone of the district. 2) If cuts need to be done, they should start from the top, management and administrative positions that get paid much more than instructional aides and teachers who spend valuable time with students. 3) Asked the Board to please consider keeping classified employees working.

Xochitl Campillo, Commented: 1) Shared concerns about possible cuts to classified employees during the COVID-19 pandemic. 2) Classified employees are always in the front of any situation especially, in emergencies. 3) Administrative salaries can be lowered. Asked the Board to take this into consideration.

Member I. Lopez, Commented: 1) It's hard for us to make decisions. 2) There are a lot of things we can't provide because we don't have the money. We need to listen, work together and put pressure on the state and federal legislators. 3) Hopes we will be able to open safely for our students and staff.

Clerk R. Lopez, Commented: 1) We as a school district are statutorily required to adopt a budget before June 30th whether or not we know definitively what the state and federal will give us. 2) We are continuing to monitor and advocate at both levels. 3) We are hoping that the legislator successfully negotiates their version of the budget with the Governor and that the federal government passes another stimulus funding bill.

Vice-President Martinez, Commented: 1) Thanked everyone for the public comments. 2) We were in a good position in February and March going to positive certification. Because of COVID, every school district was affected. 3) Gave direction to the administration to communicate with classified and teachers what we are going to do to resolve this together. Work together to ensure that we save as many jobs as possible. 4) Agrees with the comments, the ones that make the most should take the biggest hits and go down the ladder. 5) Let's stick together and work together to get through this.

President Gurmilan, Commented: 1) Thanked everyone that submitted comments. 2) He is very proud that we closed the school year successfully. Thanked everyone for the hard work. 3) Commended the [Reopening Schools] Task Force for coming together to make sure our schools open safely. 4) He understands the comments. He is also going through the same as a community college teacher. Lives will be impacted. 5) The Board is fighting for you. 6) Invited parents, teachers and classified to write letters and contact our officials. We need everyone to come together and communicate that we need funding for our schools because ultimately, the students will be the most affected. 7) Let's have an open line of communication with each other.

Superintendent Potter, Commented: 1) Thanked the Board for their leadership during this difficult time. 2) It was difficult to see the Governor's State May Revise and the assessment to reduce public education's budget by almost ten percent for two years in a row. We were months away from fiscal stability. 3) Asked everyone to fight with us and communicate with our state and federal leaders that education be protected during this crisis. 4) Stay safe and healthy. 5) She can't be more proud that everyone worked together as a team to help our children and their families. Thanked teachers and the classified staff. 6) It looks like August 17 will be the start date of school. The Board will take action to amend the calendar at the June 25th Board meeting. 7) It's sad that we lost George Floyd and others before him as well. She comes from a racially diverse family who has fought racism for decades. 8) Our country's strength rests on the pillar of culture diversity and our children deserve a country free from racial harm and free from inequity.

Business and Noninstructional Operations

On and after January 1, 1976, the Board of Education of any school district may initiate and carry on any program, activity, or may otherwise act in any manner which is not in conflict with or inconsistent with, or preempted by, any law and which is not in conflict with the purposes for which school districts are established.

The Board approves the use of purchasing cards for permissible purchases to provide a convenient means with which to make purchases. The Board directs the administration to establish internal controls and user guidelines to prevent the misuse of such cards.

Delegation of Responsibility

A limited list of authorized administrative users of purchasing cards shall be maintained in the Business Services Department and shall include employees in designated positions.

All purchasing cards shall be supervised and monitored on a regular basis by the Chief Business Official or designee, who shall ensure the use of such cards is in accordance with the funds budgeted for this purpose.

Proper accounting measures for the use of purchasing cards shall be developed, distributed, implemented, and monitored by the Chief Business Official or designee.

An employee authorized to use a purchasing card shall maintain adequate security of the card while it is in his/her possession. Under no circumstances may the card be used by another individual.

Guidelines

Each employee using a district purchasing card shall complete a purchasing card application, sign a cardholder agreement, and receive mandatory training on applicable policies and procedures prior to issuance of their assigned purchasing card. After issuance of their assigned purchasing card, each active cardholder must attend annual training sessions.

Purchasing cards shall be used for authorized district purchases and shall not be used for personal purchases. The district retains the authority to revoke any purchasing card used for unauthorized personal purposes.

A cardholder who makes an unauthorized purchase with the purchasing card or uses the

purchasing card in an inappropriate manner will be subject to disciplinary action that can include card cancellation and termination of employment at the district.

The established procedures for purchases made with a purchasing card shall be as follows:

The cardholder deals directly with the vendor. Confirm that the vendor accepts the purchasing card.

The cardholder is responsible for obtaining all documentation related to the purchases and verifying that the documentation complies with the requirements for support documentation.

Cardholders are accountable for all charges made with their purchasing cards. Verification should be done regularly using the purchasing card's online transaction review system, Smart Data Online, and the cardholder's printed biweekly Smart Data report.

The biweekly Smart Data report and attached receipts should be forwarded to the Business Services Department.

Purchases on his/her assigned purchasing card by an individual employee shall not exceed the following: single transaction dollar limit established by the district.

Purchasing cards shall not be used to circumvent the bidding process required by the Public Contract Code. Purchases must be made in accordance with established Board policy and procedures.

Organized Student Body

AR 3452.1

Business and Noninstructional Operations

Any group of students may organize a student body association within a school with the approval and subject to the control and regulation of the Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District. Any such organization shall have as its purpose the conduct of activities on behalf of the students adopted: Any student body organization may be granted the use of school premises and properties without charge subject to such regulations as may be established by the Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District.

The Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District may authorize student organizations to sell food on school premises, subject to policy and regulations of the State Board of Education.

The Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District may authorize any organization composed entirely of pupils attending the schools of the district to maintain such activities, including fund-raising activities, as may be adopted.

The funds of any student body organization established in the San Ysidro School District shall, subject to approval of the Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District, be deposited or invested in one of more of the following ways:

Deposited in a bank or banks whose accounts are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Investment certificates or withdrawable shares in a state-chartered savings and loan associations provided such associations are doing business in this state and have their accounts insured by the Federal Savings and Loan Insurance Corporation.

Purchase of United States savings bonds (Series F and G) as authorized for investment by subdivision (a) of Section 16430 of the Government Code.

Shares or certificates for funds received or any form of evidence of interest or indebtedness issued by any credit union in this state, organized under the provisions of Division 5 (commencing with Section 14000) of the Financial code or the statutes of the United States relating to credit unions insured by the administrator of the national Credit Union Administration or a comparable agency as provided by a state government.

The funds shall be expended subject to such procedures as may be established by the student body organization subject to the approval of each of the following three persons which shall be obtained each time before any of such funds may be expended: the school principal, the ASB

advisor of the particular student body organization, and a student body officer of the particular student body organization. All expenditure requests and receipts for services or materials obtained will be submitted to the District's Business Office.

In addition to deposits or investments, the funds of a student body organization may be loaned or invested in any of the following ways:

Loans, with or without interest, to any student body organization established in another school of the district for a period not to exceed one year.

Invest money in permanent improvements to the San Ysidro School District property including, but not limited to, buildings, automobile parking facilities, gymnasiums, swimming pools, stadium and playing fields, where such facilities, or portions thereof, are used for conduction student extracurricular activities or student spectator sports, or when such improvements are for the benefit of the student body.

The Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District shall provide for the supervision of all funds raised by any student body organization using the name of the school. The cost of supervision may constitute a proper charge against the funds of the district. The school district may also provide for a continuing audit of student body funds with school district personal.

Within the associated student body are activity accounts as well as trust accounts. Activity accounts are for the activities of the general student body. The balances of these accounts are closed out at the end of the year. Trust accounts are monies held by the student body organization as trustee and are therefore, liability accounts (accounts of which the balance is carried over the next year). These accounts are categorized into three main groups.

Scholarship Accounts

These are scholarship grants which may be accepted by the student council with the approval of the district Board of Trustees or its delegate. The acceptance should be in writing and include all conditions prescribed by the donor for the administration of the scholarship and disposition of any balance remaining at the close of the period for which the scholarship was established. Separate bank account.

Class Accounts

Separate accounts for classes can be established. They are allowed to raise funds and expend funds within the general regulations of the associated student body.

Club Accounts

All student clubs must be composed entirely of students enrolled in the schools of the San Ysidro School District. Any group of student may apply for permission to form a club by submitting for approval by the Superintendent or designee, a proposed constitution, specifying among other things, 1) the title, power and duties of various officers, and how elected, 2) the scope of

proposed activity and 3) the name of the advisor.

The class of club accounts are subject to the same standard procedures for cash receipting and cash disbursement for the general associated student body and must be handled through the associated student body bookkeeper. Proper records must be maintained and minutes showing approval for all transactions must be kept.

The balance of inactive trust accounts must be transferred to the general surplus of the student body fund unless authorization for specific provision made in view of future plans.

The following steps are to serve as regulations in setting up and accounting for organized student body funds. (Organized student body rules are to be followed by grades 7th-8th). It is the intent of the district that students, as well as teachers, administrators, and classified staff be involved in the operation of the student body organization. Questions regarding any specific are should be directed to the Business Office.

Approval

Per the Education Code, the Board of Trustees of the San Ysidro School District must approve the organization of a student body.

Purpose

Per Education Code 48930, "Any such organization shall have as its purpose the conduct of activities on behalf of the students approved by the school authorities and not in conflict with the authority and responsibility of the public school officials." The basic purpose of raising and expending money by a student body is to promote the general welfare, morale and educational experiences of the student body.

Deposit of Funds

All monies collected for the student body will be deposited in an account with the school's name by bringing it to the District's Business Office by the end of the business day.

Expenditure Approvals

Funds shall be expended subject to the approval of each of the following three persons which shall be obtained each time before any of such funds may be expended: the school principal, the associated student body advisor of the particular student body organization, and a student body officer of the particular student body organization. The request must have three signatures. All expenditure request will be submitted to the District's Business Office.

Constitution

A constitution must be established for each student body, which must state the name and purpose of the organization and must present the framework within which the organization will operate.

Student Council and Minutes

The student body council and each club within the organization shall keep minutes for each meeting. The minutes shall include details of proceedings, including financial matters pertaining to the budget, approval of fund-raising ventures, and expenditure authorizations.

Clubs

Each club must be composed entirely of students enrolled in district schools. Each club shall have a certificated employee of the district as its advisor.

Budgets

A budget shall be developed for the upcoming year and submitted to the District's Business Office by October 1st.

Collections and Verifications

It is extremely important to have proper controls over the collection of monies to assure that all cash shall be turned in and deposited by the end of each business day. An audit trail is most important.

At the commencement of every school year the appropriate student body officials shall meet with the District's Business Office staff for the purpose of developing an accounting system that will assure that all revenues and expenditures are accounted for in the appropriate manner. No activities may commence in a school year until this accounting plan is adopted.

All money collected must be substantiated by a pre-numbered receipt, class log, pre-numbered ticket or other auditable record. The following is suggested for cash receipting:

Records must be maintained of all receipt books and other numbered forms used in acknowledging the receipt of cash.

All copies of voided receipts must be retained.

Issuance of receipt books, listing sheets, and sub-receipt books to individuals and activities shall be properly recorded.

Cash turned in by individuals and activities shall be identified by the fund-raising activities, there is to be no commingling of fund deposits.

All cash receipts shall be recorded promptly when received.

Checks held for deposit shall be endorsed by the bank endorsement stamp at the time they are received.

Personal checks shall not be cashed from associated student body funds.

Cash receipts from student fund-raising activities shall be turned into the District's Business Office by the end of the business day.

The ASB bookkeeper is responsible for depositing cash collected as verified with the activity sponsor.

A receipt is used to document a sale to an individual student for such items as **yearbooks** and student body cards.

The report of Ticket Sales documents the sales of tickets for activities such as athletics games, dances and drama activities. This report is the responsibility of the activity sponsor.

Approval of Fund-Raising Activity

Purpose of fund-raising

Fund-raising activity

Time period for fund raising activity

Names of responsible staff members for fund-raising activity.

A payment shall never be written without supporting documentation such as an invoice. All goods received shall be signed by whom it was received and the date. When the payment is made, the invoice shall include the date of payment and check number.

Prohibited Expenditures

The following expenditures are prohibited:

Equipment, supplies forms, and postage for curricular or classroom use, or for district business.

Repairs and maintenance of district-owned equipment.

Salaries or supplies which are the responsibility of the district.

Articles for the personal use of district employees.

Loans, credit or the purchase of accommodations for district employees or others.

Equipment Purchases

It is recommended that a student body formally donate to the school district equipment

purchased. This will transfer the responsibility of setting up appropriate records, maintaining the equipment, and obtaining insurance coverage to the district.

Audits

The Board of Trustees will provide for an annual audit which is required per the Education Code. Records should be maintained per the above regulations to assure that they are auditable.

On motion of Member _____, seconded by Member _____, the following Resolution is adopted:

WHEREAS, the GOVERNING BOARD of the SAN YSIDRO SCHOOL DISTRICT, CALIFORNIA, (hereinafter referred to as the "legislative body"), has initiated proceedings, held public hearing, conducted elections and received favorable votes for the qualified electors relating to the levy of special taxes in a community facility district, as authorized pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982", being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California. The Community Facilities Districts are known and designated as follows:

COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 1
COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2
COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 3

(hereinafter referred to as the "CFD No. 1," "CFD No. 2," and "CFD No. 3", collectively "Districts"); and,

WHEREAS, the legislative body, by Ordinances adopted for the Districts as authorized by Section 53340 of the Government Code of the State of California, has authorized the levy of special taxes to pay for costs and expenses related to each such District, and this legislative body is desirous to establish the rate of the special taxes to be collected within CFD No. 1, CFD No. 2, and CFD No. 3 for the next fiscal year.

BE IT RESOLVED:

- Section 1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.
- Section 2. That the specific rates and amounts of the special taxes to be collected to pay for the costs and expenses for the next fiscal year (2020-2021 for the referenced Districts are hereby determined and established as set forth in the attached, referenced and incorporated Exhibit "A".
- Section 3. That the rates as set forth above do not exceed the amounts as previously authorized by the Ordinances of this legislative body and are not in excess of that as previously approved by the qualified electors of the Districts.
- Section 4. That the proceeds of the special taxes shall be used to pay, in whole or in part, the costs of the following as they pertain to the Districts, in the following order of priority:
- A. Payment of principal and interest on any outstanding authorized bonded indebtedness.

B. Necessary replenishment of bond reserve funds or other reserve funds,

C. Payment of costs and expenses of authorized public facilities and public services, as applicable;

D. Repayment of advances and loans, if appropriate.

Section 5. The special taxes shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary ad valorem property taxes are collected, and shall be subject to the same penalties and same procedures and sale in cases of any delinquency for ad valorem taxes, and the Tax Collector is hereby authorized to deduct reasonable administrative costs incurred in collecting any said special taxes.

Section 6. All monies above collected shall be paid into the respective District funds, including any bond fund and reserve fund.

Section 7. A listing of all parcels subject to the special taxes, together with the applicable tax to be levied for the next year, shall be filed with the County Auditor on or before the 10th day of August of this year. It is hereby further directed that a certified copy of this Resolution also be filed with the County Auditor on or before the 10th day of August of this year.

Section 8. The Auditor of the County is hereby directed to enter in the next County assessment roll on which taxes will become due, opposite each lot or parcel of land affected in a space marked "public improvements, special tax" or by any other suitable designation, the installment of the special taxes.

Section 9. The County Auditor shall then, at the close of the tax collection period, promptly render to this Agency a detailed report showing the amount and/or amounts of such special tax installments, interest, penalties and percentages so collected and from what property collected, and also provide a statement of any percentages retained for the expense of making any such collection.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Section 65995, et seq., the District is required to adopt a school fee justification study(ies) ("Fee Study") in order to justify the levy of statutory school fees on new residential and/or commercial/industrial developments. The maximum allowable statutory school fees are adjusted every two years by the State Allocation Board in January. The Fee Study, prepared by the California Financial Services, demonstrates that the District may impose the increased statutory school fees (maximum allowable due to the District's fee sharing agreement with Sweetwater Union High School District) in the amount of \$2.49 per square foot for new residential development and \$.40 for new commercial/residential development. These funds generated are for the Community Facilities District to be used on capital facility improvements.

Prior to adopting the Fee Study and approving the fee increase, the Governing Board ("Board") agendized a public hearing for the proposed Fee Study and fee increase at a regularly scheduled public meeting and will respond to any comments it receives. Two Notices of Public Hearing were published in the San Diego Union Tribune on July 2nd and July 10th. The District's Fee Study was made available for public review as required by law for the adoption of the increased statutory school fees.

RECOMMENDATION:

Open/Close public hearing and approve Resolution No. 20/21-0009 adopting a fee justification study and approving the levy of increased statutory school fees on new residential and commercial/industrial development pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 and Government Code Section 65995.

RESOLUTION NO. 20/21-0009

**A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE
SAN YSIDRO SCHOOL DISTRICT
ADOPTING A FEE JUSTIFICATION STUDY AND APPROVING THE LEVY OF
INCREASED STATUTORY SCHOOL FEES ON NEW RESIDENTIAL AND
COMMERCIAL/INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT PURSUANT TO EDUCATION CODE
SECTION 17620 AND GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 65995**

WHEREAS, the Governing Board ("Board") of the San Ysidro School District ("District") provides for the educational needs for students in grades K-8 within the City of San Diego ("City"), as well as the unincorporated areas of San Diego County ("County"); and

WHEREAS, Education Code Section 17620 et seq. and Government Code Section 65995 authorize the governing board of any school district within the State of California ("State") to levy a fee against new residential, commercial and industrial development projects within the school district for the purpose of funding the construction and reconstruction of school facilities; and

WHEREAS, the Board has previously adopted and imposed statutory school fees on new residential and commercial/industrial development pursuant to Education Code Sections 17620 ("Statutory School Fees"); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code Section 65995(b)(3), the State Allocation Board, at its January 22, 2020 meeting, set the maximum amount of the Statutory School Fees to \$4.08 per square foot of new residential development and \$.66 per square foot of new commercial/industrial development as provided in Government Code Section 65995(b)(1) and (2); and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that the school facilities of the District continue to operate at overcapacity and that the educational programs are seriously impacted by the increasing student population caused by new residential and commercial/industrial development within the boundaries of District; and

WHEREAS, new development continues to generate additional students for the District's schools and the District is required to accommodate such students; and

WHEREAS, the District does not have sufficient funds available for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities, including acquisition of school sites, construction of permanent

school facilities, and interim school facilities to accommodate students generated from new development; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed, considered, and based its findings on the school fee justification report prepared by *KeyAnalytics*, a division of California Financial Services(the “Report”), which analyzes the District's current school facilities, the estimated number of students which will be generated by new residential and commercial/industrial development within the District, and the estimated costs which will be required to construct permanent school facilities to accommodate the students generated by such new development; and

WHEREAS, the findings in the Report demonstrates that the estimated costs of providing school facilities for students generated by new development will exceed the maximum amount of revenue which will be collected from increased Statutory School Fees levied pursuant to Education Code Sections 17620 et seq., and Government Code Section 65995; and

WHEREAS, the Report justifies the District's imposition of the increased Statutory School Fees on new residential and commercial/industrial construction as set forth in this Resolution by analyzing specific categories of commercial/industrial development which were determined to impact the District's school facilities based upon the square footage of the construction, the anticipated number of employees and the number of new students generated by such employees; and

WHEREAS, this Board deems it to be necessary, desirable and in the best interest of the students, teachers, parents and electorate of the District that the Statutory School Fees levied by the District under Education Code Sections 17620, and Government Code Section 65995 be levied in the maximum amount possible, 61% of the current maximum set by the State Allocation Board, which is \$2.49 per square foot of new residential development and \$.40 per square foot of new commercial/industrial development (\$0.1462 per square foot for new self-storage); and

WHEREAS, the Statutory School Fees levied against new residential and commercial/industrial development will be used to finance school facilities necessary to accommodate students generated from such new development, including but not limited to, acquisition of new school sites, remodeling of existing school facilities, acquiring and installing additional portable classrooms and related facilities in accordance with Education Code Section 17620; and

WHEREAS, the Report has been reviewed by the Board and District staff in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"); and

WHEREAS, no city or county may issue a building permit for any new residential, commercial or industrial development within the District absent a certification by the District of compliance by the owner/developer with the requirements regarding school facilities fees as set forth in Education Code Section 17620 et seq., and Government Code Section 65995; and

WHEREAS, the appropriate land use jurisdictions will be notified of the adoption of the Study and the increased Statutory School Fees levied by the District; and

WHEREAS, the District (1) has made available to the public, at least ten (10) days prior to its public meeting, the Report and data indicating the estimated cost required to provide the service for which the increased Statutory School Fees are levied and the revenue sources anticipated to provide the service as demonstrated in the Report; (2) has mailed notice at least fourteen (14) days prior to this meeting to all interested parties who have requested in writing notice of adoption of a fee justification study for the levy of Statutory School Fees pursuant to Government Code Section 65995; and (3) has held a duly noticed, regularly scheduled public meeting at which oral and written testimony was received regarding the Report and the proposed increase in Statutory School Fees.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE SAN YSIDRO SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board has reviewed the Report and hereby adopts and approves the Study and the findings contained therein.

Section 2. The Board approves the imposition and increase of Statutory School Fees to be levied against all new development at the rate of 61% of the current maximum statutory amount which is \$2.49 per square foot of new residential development and \$.40 per square foot of new commercial/industrial development (\$0.1462 per square foot for new self-storage), as provided in Government Code Section 65995(b) (1) and (2).

Section 3. The Board has reviewed the Report and finds, based upon the Report, information and testimony presented in conjunction therein, as follows:

Section 4. New residential and commercial/industrial development will result in a substantial increase in student enrollment which will require the District to provide additional school facilities to accommodate new growth, and therefore a reasonable relationship exists between the District's Statutory School Fees, which are necessary to fund the construction and reconstruction of school facilities to accommodate such new growth, and the types of development on which the Statutory School Fees will be imposed.

Section 5. New residential and commercial/industrial development will result in a substantial increase in student enrollment which will require the District to provide additional school facilities and therefore a reasonable relationship exists between the District's need for new and reconstructed school facilities and the types of development on which the Statutory School Fees will be imposed.

Section 6. Statutory School Fees levied on new residential and commercial/industrial development will be used to finance school facilities necessary to serve students generated from such development.

Section 7. The Board finds that a separate account has been established for the deposit of Statutory School Fees imposed on new residential and commercial/industrial development and that said account has at all times since been separately maintained, except for temporary investments, from other funds of the District.

Section 8. The Board finds that the funds of the account, described in Section 4, consisting of the proceeds of Statutory School Fees have been imposed for the purposes of constructing and reconstructing those school facilities necessitated by new residential and commercial/industrial development, and that, these funds may be expended for those purposes. The Statutory School Fees may also be expended by the District for the costs of performing any study or otherwise making the findings and determinations required under subdivisions (a), (b), and (d) of Section 66001 of the Government Code. In addition, the District may also retain, as appropriate, an amount not to exceed in any fiscal year, three percent (3%) of the Statutory School Fees collected in that fiscal year pursuant to Education Code Section 17620 for reimbursement of the administrative costs incurred by the District in collecting the Statutory School Fees.

Section 9. The Board hereby establishes a process that provides the party against whom the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees are imposed an opportunity for a hearing to appeal the imposition of Statutory School Fees on a commercial/industrial development project as required by Education Code Section 17621(e)(2). The appeal process is as follows:

Section 10. Within ten (10) calendar days of being notified, in writing, by personal delivery or deposit in the U.S. Mail, of the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees to be imposed on a particular commercial/industrial project, or within ten (10) calendar days of paying the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees pursuant to Education Code Section 17620(a)(1)(A), a party shall file a written appeal with the District's Assistant Superintendent of Business Services ("District Representative") regarding the imposition of commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees. The party shall state in the written appeal the grounds for opposing the imposition of commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees and the written appeal shall be served by personal delivery or certified or registered mail to the District Representative.

Section 11. The possible grounds for an appeal include, but are not limited to, the inaccuracy of including the project within the category pursuant to which the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees are to be imposed, or that the employee generation or student generation factors utilized under the applicable category are inaccurate as applied to the project.

Section 12. The District Representative, or his/her designee, shall render a written decision within thirty (30) calendar days following the receipt of the written appeal unless an extension is agreed to by both parties. The District Representative, or his/her designee, shall deliver the written decision by certified or registered mail to the last known address of the party.

Section 13. The party against whom the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees are imposed may appeal the District Representative's decision to the Board. Any appeal to the Board must be filed within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of the District Representative's written decision.

Section 14. The party appealing the District Representative's decision to the Board, shall state in the written appeal to the Board the grounds for opposing the District Representative's

decision. The written appeal shall be served by personal delivery or certified or registered mail to the President of the Board.

Section 15. The possible grounds for an appeal of the District Representative’s decision to the Board include, but are not limited to, the inaccuracy of including the project within the category pursuant to which the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees are to be imposed, or that the employee generation or student generation factors utilized under the applicable category are inaccurate as applied to the project.

Section 16. Within ten (10) calendar days of receipt of the written appeal of the District Representative’s decision to the Board regarding the imposition of commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees, the Board Secretary or his designee, shall give notice in writing of the date, place and time of the hearing before the Board, to the party appealing the District Representative’s decision. The Board shall notice and conduct said hearing at the next available regular or special meeting of the Board, provided that the appealing party is given notice at least five (5) calendar days prior to the meeting of the Board. The Board shall render a written decision on the appeal within thirty (30) calendar days following the Board’s hearing on the party’s appeal, and serve the Board’s decision by certified or registered mail to the last known address of the appealing party.

Section 17. The party appealing the imposition of the commercial/ industrial Statutory School Fees shall bear the burden of establishing that the commercial/industrial Statutory School Fees are improper.

Section 18. No statement or provision set forth in this Resolution, or referred to herein shall be construed to repeal any preexisting fee previously imposed by the District on any residential or nonresidential development.

Section 19. The Board finds and determines that the adoption or imposition of Statutory School Fees in accordance with Government Code Section 65995 is statutorily exempt from CEQA pursuant to Code Section 17621(a).

Section 20. District staff is directed to file a Notice of Exemption with the San Diego County Clerk's Office.

Section 21. District staff is hereby instructed to work with the appropriate land use jurisdictions to ensure compliance with Education Code Section 17620(b), which provides that no city or county may issue a building permit for any development project within the District without certification by the District of compliance by that development project with the school facilities fee requirements of this Resolution. The Board determines that Statutory School Fees are not subject to Government Code Section 66007, and that a Certificate of Compliance is required, prior to the issuance of any building permit.

Section 22. District staff is hereby instructed to transmit certified copies of this Resolution, accompanied by all relevant supporting documentation including the Study and a map of the boundary area of the District subject to the Statutory School Fees, to all appropriate land use jurisdictions issuing building permits within the District, informing each of them of the District's current school facilities fee for development projects.

Section 23. The Statutory School Fees designated herein shall take effect sixty (60) days from the date of this Resolution.

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Exhibit A: Estimated School Facilities Cost

I. Introduction

In 1986, the Governor signed into law Assembly Bill (“AB”) 2926. AB 2926 provided for the addition of several sections to the Government Code establishing the ability of school districts to impose impact fees on new residential development (“Future Residential Development”) and commercial/industrial development (“Future Commercial/Industrial Development”) for the construction or reconstruction of school facilities (“School Fees”).

AB 2926 also established cities or counties may not issue a building permit for a development project unless such School Fees have been paid and set the maximum level of School Fees at \$1.50 per square foot for residential development and \$0.25 per square foot for commercial/industrial development. Initially these maximums were subject to increase each year based on a statewide cost index, as determined by the State Allocation Board (“SAB”); however, the adjustment provisions were subsequently extended to every other year by AB 181. Pursuant to AB 2926 a school district wishing to impose School Fees must determine that the School Fees “are reasonably related and limited to the need for school facilities caused by the development”.

In 1987 AB 1600 was enacted providing additional guidance regarding the establishment of School Fees. Specifically, AB 1600 requires that public agencies satisfy the following requirements when establishing and imposing an impact fee as a condition of approval for a development project:

- Determine the purpose of the fee;
- Identify the facilities to which the fee will be applied;
- Determine that there is a reasonable relationship between the need for public facilities and the type of development on which a fee is imposed;
- Determine that there is a reasonable relationship between the amount of the fee and the public facility of portion of the facility attributable to the development on which the fee is imposed; and

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- Provide an annual accounting of any portion of the fee remaining unexpended, whether committed or uncommitted, in the school district's accounts five (5) or more years after it was collected.


The purpose of this School Facilities Fee Justification Report (the "Report") is to provide the information necessary to satisfy these requirements for the imposition of School Fees, pursuant to AB 2926, by the San Ysidro School District (the "District").

II. The School District

The District serves Preschool through 8th grade students in the southern most portion of the County of San Diego (“County”). The community of San Ysidro is located 15 miles south of downtown San Diego and lies adjacent to the United States-Mexico International Border. Often described as “The Gateway to Mexico,” San Ysidro attracts a tremendous number of tourists annually, making it the busiest border crossing in the world.

The District has a student population of approximately 4,500 students in grades Kindergarten through 8th. Currently, the District operates seven (7) schools.

San Ysidro School District Boundary Map




III. District Facilities Needs

In order to identify the impact of Future Residential Development on the facilities of the District this Report (i) evaluates the District’s current and projected enrollment, (ii) establishes the capacity of the District’s existing facilities and (ii) identifies a plan to meet the District’s facility needs.

A. Enrollment

1. Historical Enrollment – This Report uses the California Basic Educational Data Systems (CBEDS) to identify the District’s enrollment over the past ten (10) years. Even though the District saw significant enrollment increases between 2009/2010 and 2012/2013 subsequent declines in enrollment due to the economic recession and the resulting slowdown in residential development resulted in flat/slightly declining enrollment over the last ten (10) years. Chart 1 shows the historical enrollment during this period.

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2. Enrollment as a Result of Future Residential Development –

a. Future Residential Development - To evaluate the enrollment expected as a result of Future Residential Development, this Report must first determine the number of units that are expected to be constructed within the District’s boundaries.

According to San Diego Association of Governments (“SANDAG”), a total of 13,589 residential units are expected to be built within the boundaries of the District (“Future Units”) by 2050. Of these 13,589 Future Units, 318 have already mitigated their impact on the District through participation in one of the three (3) Community Facilities Districts located throughout the District (“Mitigated Future Units”). For the purpose of identifying the appropriate level of School Fees, this Report only includes the impact of Future Units subject to School Fees (“Non-Mitigated Future Units”). Table 1 outlines the Future Residential Development.

b. Reconstruction - Reconstruction means the voluntary demolition of existing residential dwelling units or commercial/industrial construction and the subsequent construction of new residential dwelling units (“Reconstruction”).

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The District acknowledges that Reconstruction projects may occur. In such a situation, the District shall levy School Fees if there is a nexus established between the impact of the new residential dwelling units in terms of a net increase in students generated and the fee to be imposed. In other words, the School Fees must bear a nexus to the burden caused by the Reconstruction project.

- i. **Existing Residential Dwelling Units** - To the extent Reconstruction increases the residential square footage beyond what was demolished ("New Square Footage"), the increase in square footage is subject to the applicable School Fee as such construction is considered new residential development. As for the amount of square footage constructed that replaces only the previously constructed square footage ("Replacement Square Footage"), the determination of the applicable fee, if any, is subject to a showing that the Replacement Square Footage results in an increase in student enrollment and, therefore, an additional impact being placed on the District to provide school facilities for new student enrollment.

As of the date of this Report, the large-scale Reconstruction of residential development within the District has not occurred to the point where statistically significant data can be utilized to determine if Replacement Square Footage increases student enrollment. Therefore, prior to the imposition of School Fees on Replacement Square Footage, the District may undertake an analysis on any future proposed project(s) and may amend/update this Report. Such analysis will examine the extent to which an increase in enrollment can be expected from Replacement Square Footage due to any differential in student generation rates as identified in the Report for the applicable unit types between existing square footage and Replacement Square Footage. To the extent it can be demonstrated that Replacement Square

Footage will increase student enrollment, the District may then impose a fee on the Replacement Square Footage. This fee amount on Replacement Square Footage shall be calculated by determining the cost impacts associated with any growth in student enrollment from the Replacement Square Footage. Any such fee that is calculated for the Replacement Square Footage shall not exceed the School Fee that is in effect at such time.

- ii. **Existing Commercial/Industrial Construction** - As with Reconstruction of existing residential dwelling units, there is not significant information regarding (i) the amount of Commercial/Industrial Reconstruction planned within the District over the next five years or (ii) historical levels, which might indicate the amount to be expected in the future. Due to the lack of information, the District has decided to evaluate the impacts of Commercial/Industrial Reconstruction projects on a case-by-case basis and will make a determination of whether a fee credit is justified based on the nature of the project.

The fee credit determination will be based upon a comparison of the impacts of the planned residential project and the existing land use category (i.e. retail and services, office, research and development, industrial/warehouse/manufacturing, hospital, or hotel/motel). The actual impacts of the planned residential project (taken from Table 11) will be reduced by the impact of the existing commercial/industrial category (derived from calculations contained in this Report). Any reduction to the School Fee would only occur if the reduced amount falls below the School Fee. In such a case, the District would levy the reduced amount per square foot of new residential construction for the subject Reconstruction project.

- c. **Student Generation Factors** - To estimate the impact on the District's enrollment of Non-Mitigated Future Units, Student

Generation Factors (“SGFs”) must be established. CFS calculated SGFs for each of the following land use categories:

- **Single Family Detached (“SFD”)** – Units are stand-alone structures on their own lot with a unique Assessor’s parcel number.
- **Single Family Attached (“SFA”)** – Units share common walls, usually on both sides of the property, where each is assigned a unique Assessor’s parcel number (e.g. townhomes, condominiums, duplexes).
- **Multi-Family Attached (“MFA”)** – Units share common walls in a building or structure designed to house several families in separate housing units.

The process of determining SGFs involved cross-referencing the District’s enrollment data against the County Assessor residential data. Sorting and extracting the County Assessor records by land use, CFS developed a database of residential units. This database was then compared with the District’s student enrollment database to identify address matches. Table 2 outlines the results of this analysis.

Due to incomplete and incorrect address information in both the student enrollment and residential databases, CFS was unable to match all of the District's students. The results are SGFs that understate the number of students that will be generated by Non-Mitigate Future Units.

After accounting for incoming inter-district transfer students that reside outside of the District's boundaries, there were 375 students that were not matched. CFS adjusted the SGFs listed in Tables 2A, 2B and 2C based on a rate which considers the number of students successfully matched at each school level and land use. The adjusted SGFs for each land use by school level are shown in Table 3.

The SGFs shown above and the analysis of facilities impact that follows reflect the grade configuration used by the State's School Facilities Program ("SFP"). Though the District's current grade level configuration is different, the Report utilizes the SFP configuration to provide clarity in the calculation of the School Fees.

- d. **Projected Enrollment** - When these SGFs are applied to the projected Non-Mitigated Future Units the resulting enrollment impact is 6,966 students. Table 4 outlines this calculation.

B. Capacity of District Facilities

The District currently operates seven (7) campuses serving students Kindergarten through 8th grade. To establish the capacity of the District’s facilities, this Report multiplies the number of classrooms within the District by the SFP loading standards of 25 students for grades K-6 and 27 students for grades 7-8. Table 5 summarizes the District’s current capacity.

C. District Facility Needs

To evaluate the school facilities needed as a result of Non-Mitigated Future Units, this Report must first determine if there is any existing capacity that can be used to house future enrollment. This Report has determined there are 1,882 existing seats that may be utilized to house students expected to be generated by Future Units. In order to identify

the impact associated with Non-Mitigated Future Units this excess capacity has been allocated between Mitigated Future Units and Non-Mitigated Future Units. As a result of this allocation CFS has identified 1,854 existing seats that may be utilized to house students expected to be generated by Non-Mitigated Future Units. Table 6 outlines the determination of surplus capacity and the allocation of such surplus over the Future Units.

To determine the number of unhoused students expected to be generated by Non-Mitigated Future Units, CFS subtracted the Excess Capacity listed in Table 6B from the Projected Enrollment listed in Table 4. Table 7 outlines this calculation.

D. Plan to Provide for District Facility Needs

Though the District may house students generated from Non-Mitigated Future Units in existing facilities over the short term, the District plans to construct new Kindergarten thru 8th grade school facilities.

The timing of these improvements is unknown and rely heavily on the District’s ability to access both local and State funding for such projects and the pace of Future Residential Development. Table 8 outlines the number of facilities needed by the District to house the projected unhoused students resulting from Non-Mitigated Future Units.

IV. Financial Impact of Residential Development

As outlined in Section III, Non-Mitigated Future Units are expected to generate additional enrollment for the District resulting in the need to construct new school facilities. This Section quantifies the financial impact of the additional enrollment resulting from Non-Mitigated Future Units.

A. Cost of School Facilities

School facilities cost estimates were prepared by CFS. The school facilities costs represent the full cost of site acquisition, site development, construction, furniture and equipment, as well as technology stated in 2020 dollars. The estimated site acquisition and facility construction costs are shown in Table 9. A more detailed breakdown of the costs is listed in Exhibit A.

The costs in Table 9 do not include costs associated with Central Administrative and Support Facilities. As indicated in Table 7, Non-Mitigated Future Units will cause the enrollment of the District to increase by approximately 5,243 Unhoused Students. In accordance with the provisions of Chapter 341, Statutes of 1992, SB 1612, the SAB adopted a report on January 26, 1994, requiring approximately four (4) square feet of central administrative and support facilities for every student. Based on this report and the estimated cost per square foot to construct and furnish these types of facilities, the Report incorporates a Central Administrative and Support Facilities cost impact of \$800 per student.

B. Cost of Providing School Facilities

This Report determines the cost of providing school facilities to house unhouse students resulting from Non-Mitigated Future Units by (i) multiplying the number of facilities needed, listed in Table 8, by the Estimated School Facilities Cost, listed in Table 9 and (ii) multiplying the number of Unhoused Students listed in Table 7 by the central administrative and support facilities cost per student. Table 10 outlines the total cost of providing school facilities to house unhouse students resulting from Non-Mitigated Future Units.

C. Cost of Providing School Facilities per Sq. Ft. of Future Residential Development

To determine the cost of providing school facilities per square foot of Future Residential Development, this Report first allocates the Total Cost of Providing School Facilities to the Non-Mitigated Future Units based on land use. Table 11 show the calculation of the Cost of Providing School Facilities per Non-Mitigated Future Unit.

The Cost of Providing School Facilities per Non-Mitigated Future Unit is then divided by the average square footage of Non-Mitigated Future Unit for each land use category.

To determine the average square footage of a Non-Mitigated Future Unit this Report utilizes building permits issued within the boundaries of the District over the last five (5) years and information provided by developers within the community. Table 12 shows the cost of providing school facilities per square foot of Non-Mitigated Future Unit.

V. Comparison of Impact and School Fee Revenue from Future Residential Development

As noted in the introduction to this Report, the maximum level of School Fee that may be imposed by a school district on Future Residential Development is set by the SAB. In order to impose School Fees at this level, the District must demonstrate that the cost of providing school facilities equals or exceeds the amount of the School Fee to be imposed. This section compares the maximum School Fee that may be imposed by the District with the cost of providing school facilities per square foot of Future Residential Development as established in Section IV.

A. Maximum Residential School Fee

On January 22, 2020, the SAB approved an increase to the maximum School Fee that may be imposed by a unified school district on Future Residential Development to \$4.08 per square foot.

In the District's case they must share this maximum School Fee with the Sweetwater Union High School District ("High School District"), which provides education in grades 9 through 12 to students residing within the boundaries of the District. Based on the District's fee sharing agreement with the High School District, the District can collect 61 percent of the maximum School Fee with the balance being collected by the High School District. Table 13 show the allocation of the current maximum School Fee.

B. Comparison of Financial Impact and Maximum School Fee Revenues Per Square Foot

This Report identifies in Section IV that the cost of providing school facilities per square foot of Future Residential Development ranges from \$7.81 - \$20.35. Since the current maximum School Fee is less than the cost of providing school facilities per square foot of Future Residential Development, the District is justified in imposing their portion of the maximum School Fee of \$2.49 per square foot for all Future Residential Development within its boundaries.

VI. Financial Impact of Commercial/Industrial Development

This Section analyzes the financial impact on the District resulting from students that are generated by Future Commercial/Industrial Development.

Future Commercial/Industrial Development will attract additional workers to the District. Because some of those workers will have school-age children, such Future Commercial/Industrial Development will generate additional enrollment for the District. The District is also likely to experience additional enrollment as a result of new workers who do not live within the District's boundaries, but whose children attend the District's schools as a transfer student.

A. Employees Per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development

To identify the impact of Future Commercial/Industrial Development this Report must first estimate the number of employees that will be generated by such development.

- 1. Employee Generation Rate** - As permitted by State law, this Report estimates the number of employees to be generated by Future Commercial/Industrial Development by utilizing the generation factors set forth San Diego Association of Governments ("SANDAG"). Table 14 shows these generation rates.

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2. Percentage of Employees Residing Within the District - To accurately identify the number of employees that will reside within the District, this Report adjusts the Employee Generation Rates list in Table 14 to account for employees that may not live within the District.

To estimate the percentage of employees that will reside within the District this Report utilizes data collected by the US Census Bureau measuring individual’s commute time. Based on this information, approximately 18.50 percent of employees with the District are likely to reside within the District. Table 15 show the Resident Employee Generation Rates.

B. Household Impact

As noted in Section III, the SGFs calculated for the District is based on the number of students generated per housing unit. Therefore, this Report must convert the number of resident employees into the resulting number of new households to estimate the number of students to be generated.

1. Average Number of Employees per Household - To estimate the number of households to be generated by these resident employees, this Report utilizes information collected by the US Census Bureau.

According to the US Census Bureau the average number of employed persons per household within the District is 1.5013.

- 2. Household Impact Per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development** - The Household Impact per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development is calculated by dividing the Average Number of Employees per Household by the Resident Employee Generation Rates listed in Table 15. Table 16 summarizes this calculation.

- 3. Net Household Impact Per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development** - To identify the Net Household Impact per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development this Report must account for employees that will reside within existing residential units.

Based on home sales information and the number of building permits issued over the last five years within the District, new home sales in the District are estimated to equal 20.49 percent of the total housing units which will experience occupant turnover during the period considered in this Report. Multiplying the Household Impact per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development shown in Table 16 by 20.49 percent results in the Net Household Impact per 1,000

Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development shown in Table 17.

Only the Net Household Impacts are assumed to generate potential new students, thereby increasing school facilities costs to the District.

C. Student Generation Impact

This Report recognizes that employees may impact the District in two (2) ways. First, some of the employees will reside within the District and have school aged children who attend the District’s schools. Secondly, of those employees that do not reside within the District some will have school aged children who choose to attend the District’s school as transfer students.

- 1. Resident Student Generation Impact** - To estimate the number of resident students to be generated per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development this Report multiplies the SGFs, outlined in Section III, by the Net Household Impacts listed in Table 17. The resulting Resident Student Generation Impact per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development is listed Table 18.

E. Residential School Fee Revenue Offset

A portion of the Cost of Providing School Facilities per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development will be mitigated through the collection of School Fees from Future Residential Development. To estimate the amount of these School Fees that will be collected, this Report multiplies the estimated average square footage of a Non-Mitigated Future Unit, by the District’s Residential School Fee of \$2.49.

This amount is then multiplied by the Net Household Impacts listed in Table 17. Table 22 outlines this calculation.

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VII. Comparison of Impacts and Fee Revenue from Commercial/Industrial Development

As with Future Residential Development the maximum level of School Fee that may be imposed by a school district on Future Commercial/Industrial Development is set by the SAB. In order to impose School Fees at the maximum level the District must demonstrate that the cost of providing school facilities does not exceed the amount of the School Fees to be imposed. This section compares the maximum School Fee that may be imposed by the District, with the cost of providing school facilities as a result of Commercial/Industrial Development, as established in Section V.

A. Maximum Commercial/Industrial School Fee

On January 22, 2020, the SAB approved an increase to the maximum School Fee that may be imposed by a unified school district on Commercial/Industrial Development to \$0.66 per square foot.

In the District’s case they must share this maximum School Fee with the Sweetwater Union High School District (“High School District”), which provides education in grades 9 through 12 to students residing within the boundaries of the District. Based on the District’s fee sharing agreement with the High School District, the District can collect 61 percent of the maximum School Fee with the balance being collected by the High School District. Table 24 show the allocation of the current maximum School Fee.

B. Comparison of Financial Impact and Maximum School Fee Revenues Per Square Foot of Commercial/Industrial Development

This Report identified in Section VI that the Remaining Cost of Providing School Facilities per 1,000 Square Feet of Commercial/Industrial Development ranges from \$146.22 to \$7,958.88. Table 25 compares these costs to the maximum School Fee for Commercial/Industrial Development.

Since the District's share of the current maximum School Fee is less than the Remaining Cost of Providing School Facilities per Square Foot of Commercial/Industrial Development in each category, except Self-Storage, the District is justified in imposing a School Fee of \$0.40 per square foot for all Future Commercial/Industrial Development within its boundaries. The justified School Fee for Self-Storage would be \$0.14662 per square foot.

VIII. Conclusion and Statement of Findings

Based on the findings of this School Facilities Fee Justification Report (“Report”), the San Ysidro School District (“District”) is justified in collecting their portion of the legal maximum fee (\$4.08) which is \$2.49 per square foot of residential development as authorized by Government Code Section 65995, as future residential development creates a school facility cost impact greater than the legal maximum fee. The District is also justified in collecting their portion of the legal maximum fee (\$0.66) which is \$0.40 per square foot of commercial/ industrial development on all categories of commercial/ industrial development.

The findings of this Report are based on the following:

- According to SCAG there are 13,589 residential units planned to be built within the District.
- 13,271 of the residential units planned to be built within the District have not mitigated their additional school facilities impact on the school facilities of the District.
- These residential units are expected to generate 6,966 students. The District expects these students will require the District to construct new school facilities.
- Each square foot of future residential development creates an estimated school facility cost impact between \$7.81 - \$20.35.
- If the District collects their portion of the maximum school fee which is \$2.49, fee revenue will offset between 12.23 – 31.88 percent of the school facility cost impact of such residential development.
- Future commercial/industrial development will create the need for additional school facilities by increasing the number of households within the District and the number of inter-district transfer students.
- After accounting for the collection of the maximum school fee from residential development the remaining school facilities cost impact of commercial/ industrial development ranges between \$0.1462- \$7.96 per square foot depending on the category of development.

- If the District collects their portion of the maximum school fee which is \$0.40 per commercial/ industrial square foot, fee revenue will offset between 5.03 – 15.50 percent of the school facility cost impact of such development, unless it is categorized as Self-Storage than the maximum school fee justified is \$0.1462 per square foot which will offset 100% of the school facility cost impact.

ARMORED CAR SERVICE AGREEMENT

This Agreement is made on August 01, 2020 by and between Garda CL West, Inc., Hereinafter called "CARRIER") and San Ysidro School District whose address is 4350 Otay Mesa Road, San Ysidro, CA 92173 (Hereinafter called "CUSTOMER").

SECTION I: BASIC AGREEMENT

The Parties both agree as follows:

1. **Service:** CARRIER agrees to render Services to CUSTOMER at the locations, times, prices, frequencies and liability limits set forth on Schedule A attached hereto and made a part hereof and upon such other terms and conditions as are set forth on Schedule A.
2. **Insurance:** During the Term of this Agreement, CARRIER shall maintain the insurance in the amounts and types set forth herein.
3. **Maximum Liability:** The Maximum Shipment Liability shall be as set forth on Schedule A hereof.
4. **Term:** The Term for Services under this Agreement shall be as set forth on Schedule A.
5. **Payment for Services:** CUSTOMER agrees to pay CARRIER for the Services, the sum set forth on Schedule A per month, plus all additional charges associated with special Service requests and any applicable surcharges pursuant to Schedule A.
6. **Entire Agreement:** This agreement includes the terms hereof, and the terms of service contained in Schedule A.

SECTION II. DEFINITIONS.

- (a) The word "Holiday" as used in this Agreement shall mean the days designated on Schedule A. Holiday Service will be provided at the prices set forth on Schedule A.
- (b) The word "Property" shall mean currency, coins, precious metals, checks, notes, bonds, negotiable instruments, securities and all other things of value but excluding hazardous materials or materials for which transport is legally prohibited or restricted by applicable State or Federal Law.
- (c) The word "Sealed" as used in this Agreement shall mean closed in a manner that is reasonably designed to prevent easy access to the Property and that under normal circumstances would tend to reveal evidence of tampering or manipulation if unauthorized access were attempted.
- (d) The word "Service" shall mean to call for Sealed Shipments said to contain Property, to receipt therefore, and to deliver the same in like condition to a designated consignee, and to perform any other Services set forth on Schedule A.
- (e) The word "Shipment" as used herein shall mean the total Property in Sealed containers received by CARRIER at a single location from a single consignor for delivery to one other location to a single consignee.
- (f) The words "Reconstruct", "Reconstructed" and "Reconstruction" shall mean to identify checks only to the extent of determining the face amount of said checks and the identity of the maker and/or check numbers, account numbers, routing numbers, financial institution, and the identity of the maker and the endorser of each.

- (b) Non-deliverables: When delivery of a Shipment cannot be made for any reason, CARRIER shall notify CUSTOMER and return the Shipment to CUSTOMER or to CARRIER'S vault for storage. Notification of such return shall be promptly given to CUSTOMER.

- (e) Payment for Services: CUSTOMER agrees to pay CARRIER for the Services at the prices set forth in the attached Schedule A, in the event CUSTOMER uses the Even Exchange Service. (The first such usage indicates agreement with the rates as set forth on Schedule A), plus all additional charges associated with special Service requests, as requested by CUSTOMER. Payment is due net thirty (30) days from the date of any invoice.

SECTION IV. INSURANCE.

- (a) All Risk Insurance: CARRIER agrees at all times during the life of this Agreement to purchase and maintain insurance with a responsible insurance company to cover the loss or destruction of Property handled or protected by CARRIER, its agents or employees, on behalf of CUSTOMER pursuant to this Agreement. CARRIER agrees to furnish CUSTOMER with written evidence of compliance with this provision. It is understood and agreed that CARRIER shall not be liable in any capacity for loss or harm to CUSTOMER'S Property or for damages directly and/or proximately flowing from loss or harm to CUSTOMER'S Property while said Property is in the possession of CARRIER, nor shall CARRIER'S insurance carrier be required to cover such damages when same are caused by any of the following:
 - 1.  - 2. Any weapon of war employing atomic fission or radioactive force whether in time of peace or war;
 - 3. Any accident or catastrophe occurring at a government or private facility employing the use of atomic fission or radioactive energy whether in time of peace or war;
 - 4. Insurrection, rebellion, revolution, civil war, usurped power, or action taken by government authority in hindering, combating, or defending against such an occurrence, seizure or destruction under quarantine or customs regulations, confiscation by order of any government or public authority, or risks of contraband or illegal transport or trade.
- (b) Other Insurance: CARRIER shall maintain during the performance of the Services the following insurance.
 - (i) Worker's Compensation and Employers' Liability Insurance as prescribed by applicable law.

- (ii) Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance (bodily injury and property damage), the limits of liability of such Insurance shall not be less than \$ 1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence.
- (iii) Automobile Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability Insurance, covering owned, non-owned and hired automobiles, the limits of which shall not be less than \$ 1,000,000 combined single limit per occurrence.

SECTION V. CUSTOMER INDEMNITY

- (a) Indemnity: CARRIER agrees to defend, indemnify and hold harmless CUSTOMER from all claims, demands, actions and causes of action for damage or injury, including death, that are hereafter made or brought against CUSTOMER by any third party for the recovery of actual damages to the extent caused by reason of the negligence or willful misconduct of CARRIER, its employees or agents. CARRIER shall have no defense or indemnification obligation to CUSTOMER to the extent such damage or injury is caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of CUSTOMER, its employees or agents. In no case shall CARRIER be liable for or owe any duty of indemnification with respect to any exemplary, punitive or consequential damage claims by CUSTOMER or any third party arising from the loss or destruction of Property. CARRIER'S obligation with respect to any claim for damages by CUSTOMER or any third party with respect to any Property shall not exceed the Maximum Shipment Liability.

SECTION VI. CARRIER LIABILITY

- (a) Maximum Shipment Liability: Except as provided above, it is understood and agreed that CARRIER and its insurance company will be liable for loss of or damage to CUSTOMER Property inclusive of Reconstructive damage up to the maximum sum for each Shipment as set forth in Schedule A, which sum is the agreed maximum value of any single Shipment ("Maximum Shipment Liability"). The Service and liability obligations assumed by CARRIER and the rates charged by CARRIER are based, in part, upon the values of Shipments as declared herein by CUSTOMER, for the safe delivery or return of any Shipment of CUSTOMER'S in the possession of CARRIER, or in the possession of the agents or employees of CARRIER pursuant to the terms of this Agreement, it is therefore expressly agreed by the CUSTOMER that the provisions of this Agreement dealing with Maximum Shipment Liability to be accepted by CARRIER from the CUSTOMER for delivery to consignee, or from consignee, may not be waived or amended by any agent of CARRIER, but that such waiver or amendment may be made only with the written consent of an officer of CARRIER. CARRIER will not be liable for loss or damage to Property consigned to it in excess of the Maximum Shipment Liability unless CUSTOMER has paid all excess liability charges to the CARRIER for all Shipments of Property with a value in excess of the Maximum Shipment Liability amount.
- (b) Force Majeure: CARRIER shall not be in breach of this contract nor be liable in any capacity for damages, including but not limited to loss of interest, directly and/or proximately flowing from any delay in or failure to make pickups or deliveries on CUSTOMER'S behalf pursuant to the terms of this Agreement due to causes beyond CARRIER'S reasonable control, including strikes, work stoppages, lockouts, epidemics, pestilence, strikes by CUSTOMER or consignee's employees, work stoppages by CUSTOMER or consignee's employees, lockouts by CUSTOMER or consignee, war, rebellion, insurrection, hostilities, legal process, court action, mechanical failure, accidents, fires, acts of God, storms, flood, closed transportation routes or other causes beyond CARRIER'S reasonable control. It is understood and agreed that CARRIER is not a guarantor of any pickup or delivery times that may be established from time to time by custom, practice or agreement. Any such times are mere approximations or estimates, however, CARRIER agrees to use reasonable efforts to accommodate pickup and delivery times requested by CUSTOMER and agreed to by CARRIER.
- (c) LIABILITY CAP: EXCEPT IN THE CASE OF A SHIPMENT, WHEREIN THE MAXIMUM SHIPMENT LIABILITY LIMIT SET FORTH IN SCHEDULE A SHALL APPLY, CARRIER'S LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES (WHETHER A CLAIM THEREFOR IS BASED ON WARRANTY, CONTRACT, TORT (INCLUDING NEGLIGENCE OR STRICT LIABILITY), STATUTE, OR OTHERWISE) CONNECTED

WITH, OR ARISING UNDER, THIS AGREEMENT WILL BE LIMITED IN THE AGGREGATE FOR ALL CLAIMS TO AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE TOTAL AMOUNT OF FEES PAID BY CUSTOMER TO CARRIER FOR SERVICES UNDER THIS AGREEMENT DURING THE TWELVE (12) MONTHS PRIOR TO THE OCCURRENCE OF THE FIRST EVENT THAT IS THE SUBJECT OF THE FIRST CLAIM (OR, IF TWELVE (12) MONTHS HAVE NOT YET ELAPSED SINCE THE EFFECTIVE DATE, THEN THE TOTAL AMOUNT ACTUALLY PAID BY CUSTOMER TO CARRIER UNDER THIS AGREEMENT).

SECTION VII. PROCEDURES.

- (a) Authorized Messengers: CARRIER agrees to furnish CUSTOMER the CARRIER's secure Authorized Agent Card procedure to conduct deposit pickup and change order delivery. CUSTOMER may rely upon the Authorized Agent Card as evidence of authority of the messenger. CARRIER assumes no liability for Property delivered to any employee or other person, except those who display an Authorized Agent Card and arrive in full uniform.
- (b) Shipment Requirements: CUSTOMER agrees to cause all Shipments to be made by means of CUSTOMER placing CUSTOMER'S Property in Sealed packages or containers, of a mutually agreed upon type and design, which clearly and distinctly indicates the name and address of the consignor as well as the name and address of the consignee. CUSTOMER further agrees to clearly and distinctly set forth the value of each Shipment on the outside of the Sealed packages or container. CUSTOMER agrees that CARRIER, its agents or employees, shall have the right to refuse to pickup Shipments of Property which are not Sealed and properly marked by CUSTOMER as set forth above and that CARRIER assumes no liability for any damages or loss which may result as a consequence of such refusal to make a pickup. CUSTOMER further agrees that CARRIER shall not be liable for any mysterious disappearance of, shortage or damage to the contents of any Shipment unless the Shipment was properly Sealed at the time of delivery to CARRIER and shows evidence of tampering at the time CARRIER delivers said package to the consignee and the consignee immediately notes, in writing, the evidence of tampering on CARRIER'S receipt document. Absent notation on CARRIER'S receipt document by the consignee at the time of receipt, the burden of proof shall be on the CUSTOMER to show the CARRIER is responsible for such loss or claim related to a Sealed container said to contain Property. The parties agree that, while CUSTOMER may keep its own receipt and log book for its own internal purposes, CARRIER's receipt document shall be deemed the sole controlling document with respect to all Services rendered, including, without limitation, deposits delivered and received, timing, losses, shortages, overages, investigations, claims or litigation.
- (c) Duration of Shipment Liability: CARRIER'S possession of CUSTOMER'S Shipment begins only after an authorized messenger employed by CARRIER signs a receipt for and receives said Shipment into his/her physical custody, thereafter CARRIER'S possession of CUSTOMER'S Property terminates when and as an agent or consignee designated by CUSTOMER receives physical custody (i.e. physical possession or control) of the Shipment. It is understood and agreed that CARRIER'S liability for the handling or protection of CUSTOMER'S Property arises and exists solely and concurrently with CARRIER'S possession thereof.
- (d) Consequential Damages: It is understood and agreed that under no circumstances or theory of liability shall CARRIER and/or CARRIER'S insurance company be liable for any incidental or consequential damages to CUSTOMER or any third party directly or on behalf of CUSTOMER resulting from or occasioned by the loss of or damage to any Shipment of Property delivered to CARRIER pursuant to this Agreement
- (e) Claims: It is understood and agreed that under no circumstances shall CARRIER and/or CARRIER'S insurance company be liable or responsible for any claim for loss of or damages to CUSTOMER'S Property which is not submitted in writing to the CARRIER within the greater of ninety (90) days after the date that said loss or damage purportedly occurred or the minimum notice requirement under the law of the jurisdiction where the Service took place. Within thirty (30) days after the giving of written

notice of a claim of loss or damage, CUSTOMER agrees to furnish CARRIER a detailed written statement of the circumstances surrounding such loss or damages as well as detailed written proof of such loss or damages in form reasonably satisfactory to CARRIER, which proof of loss shall be substantiated by the books, records and accounts of CUSTOMER and shall be subscribed and sworn to by CUSTOMER or its duly authorized officer. Failure of CUSTOMER to comply with the foregoing shall relieve and release CARRIER of any liability to CUSTOMER with respect to such claimed loss or damage.

- (f) Checks. CUSTOMER shall maintain an accurate record of all checks placed in any Shipment given to CARRIER and in the event of a loss, CUSTOMER agrees to promptly, diligently and completely cooperate with CARRIER in the Reconstruction and replacement of lost, destroyed or stolen checks which had been contained in any such Shipment. CARRIER'S sole liability shall be the payment to CUSTOMER of: (i) reasonable costs necessary to Reconstruct the checks plus any necessary costs because of stop payment procedures; (ii) the face value of checks that cannot be Reconstructed, provided adequate proof of the value thereof is presented to CARRIER, except those checks which would not be collectable at the time of loss, but not to exceed the limit of \$5,000.00 per Shipment for the unidentified checks. The maximum liability of CARRIER for the checks shall in no event exceed the Maximum Shipment Liability limit set forth in Schedule A which includes the aforesaid \$5,000.00 for the unidentified checks. Complete cooperation shall include but not be limited to, recovery of hard copy or electronic records of checks including, without limitation, point of sale information created by its employees, agents or customers; as well as, requests by CUSTOMER to makers of the missing checks to issue duplicates and in the event the makers refuse to do so, then to assert all of its legal and equitable rights against said makers. CUSTOMER agrees that CARRIER and CARRIER'S insurance company shall not be liable for damages directly or proximately flowing from CUSTOMER'S breach of this provision. Upon payment of a loss pursuant to this Agreement, CARRIER or its insurance company shall be subrogated to all CUSTOMER'S rights and remedies of recovery therefore. The CUSTOMER shall assign to the CARRIER, CUSTOMER'S right to receive payment under any check(s) for which CARRIER has reimbursed CUSTOMER and CUSTOMER shall execute any document necessary or reasonably desirable to perfect and accomplish such assignment.
- (g) Even Exchange Procedures: Intentionally Omitted

SECTION VIII. GENERAL.

- (a) Payment for Services: BANK agrees to pay CARRIER for the Services, the sum set forth on Schedule A per month, plus all additional charges associated with special Service requests. After the first year of the Term, Service rates will automatically increase annually by the greater of CPI or three percent (3%). For the purposes hereof, the term "CPI" means the Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Transportation services [CUUR0000SAS4], Index 1982-1984=100, Not Seasonally Adjusted, as reported by the US Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. Payment is due net 30 days from the date of any invoice. BANK understands and agrees that CARRIER reserves the right to charge the lesser of 1.5 percent or the highest rate permitted by applicable law, per month or fraction thereof, finance charge on all balances that are not paid within 30 days of the date of invoice. BANK further understands and agrees that CARRIER shall not be responsible to issue credits for erroneous billings that are more than ninety (90) days old as of the date the credit is requested. The prices quoted on Schedule A do not include state sales and transportation related taxes, local sales and transportation-related taxes or federal sales and transportation related taxes. The parties agree that all invoices for Services hereunder will also be provided to **Mission Federal Credit Union (BANK)** who has agreed to make payment for Services hereunder. If Bank does not make payment, CUSTOMER is required to make all payments for Services hereunder.
- (b) Cost Increases: After the first year of the Term, Service rates will automatically increase annually by the greater of CPI or three percent (3%). For the purposes hereof, the term "CPI" means the



Consumer Price Index for All Urban Consumers: Transportation services [CUUR0000SAS4], Index 1982-1984=100, Not Seasonally Adjusted, as reported by the US Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics. CARRIER shall have the right to charge a surcharge for fuel as set forth in the matrix below.

Custom Fuel Surcharge Index and Methodology

Our fuel surcharge calculation method is based on the 3 week rolling average of the U. S. Energy Information Administration (eia.doe.gov). The Department of Energy website is updated every Tuesday and the National average is the benchmark used.

Each month, the 3-week rolling average will be recalculated and the surcharge will be adjusted up or down based on the following matrix:

For any 3-week U.S. National Average Diesel Fuel price over \$4.00 add an additional 1% for every \$0.25 per gallon increase.

- (c) Integration, etc.: This Agreement shall become effective only when approved and signed by authorized representatives of the parties hereto. This Agreement, including all attachments, schedules and exhibits constitutes the entire agreement and understanding between the parties related to the subject matter hereof, and no representations, inducements, promises or agreements not embodied herein shall be of any force and effect. This Agreement shall be binding in accordance with its terms upon the parties hereto and their respective transferees, assigns and successors in interest; provided, however, this Agreement may be assigned by CARRIER to any parent, subsidiary, or affiliated corporation which it may hereafter acquire or with which it may be merged or consolidated, or to any corporation acquiring the business and assets of CARRIER, but this Agreement shall not be otherwise assigned by either party hereto without the prior express written consent of the other party, which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld. This Agreement may be altered, amended, or superseded solely by means of a writing signed by the parties hereto. The headings hereof are for convenience only and have no bearing on the interpretation of the terms of the Agreement.
- (d) Jurisdiction. The parties agree that the terms of this Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the State of California with the venue is San Diego County.
- (e) Change in Conditions. CARRIER may increase the charges set forth in Schedule A upon written notice to CUSTOMER in the event of a change in economic conditions beyond CARRIER's reasonable control that increases the operating costs incurred by CARRIER.
- (f) Termination for Breach. Either party may terminate this Agreement in the event of a material breach of this Agreement as follows: The non-breaching party shall give the breaching party a written notice specifying the alleged breach and thirty (30) days to cure the breach. If the breach is not cured within said time, the non-breaching party may terminate the contract effect the next day by giving a written notice of termination.
- (g) Confidentiality. The parties as part of the performances hereunder, during the Term of this Agreement,



will have access to and become acquainted with various trade secrets including, without limitation, processes, programs, systems, software, compilations of information, records, specifications, financial information, marketing plans and customer lists which are owned by a party and which are regularly used in the operation of the business of a party ("Confidential Information") and data belong to clients of CUSTOMER, including non-public consumer information. Neither party shall disclose any of the aforesaid Confidential Information, directly or indirectly, or use them in any way either during the Term of this Agreement or at any time thereafter, except as required in the course of its Services under this Agreement. All Confidential Information shall remain the exclusive property of the disclosing party or its customers and clients and shall not be used or reproduced except in the sole interest of the disclosing party and with its prior consent and shall be immediately returned or destroyed upon request of the disclosing party or at the termination of Services hereunder.



Imagine Learning Privacy Policy

At Imagine Learning, we believe every child deserves the chance to enjoy learning and the right to fulfill their unique potential. To that end, we recognize our moral and legal responsibilities to protect student privacy and ensure data security. This Privacy Policy provides basic information on our use of data, details our data stewardship and security practices, and outlines Imagine Learning's compliance with federal privacy laws.

Key Terms

Certain terms, when used throughout this document, are intended to have the specific meanings as defined below:

- **"Services"**: all websites, applications, and services owned and operated by Imagine Learning. A comprehensive list of Services may be viewed via the Imagine Learning Services section of the [Imagine Learning Privacy Policy FAQ](#).
- **"School"**: a school, a school district, or other entity or organization that uses the Services.
- **"User" or "you"**: anyone who accesses the Services, namely schools, school districts, other entities or organizations that use the Services, teachers, administrators, non-School visitors of the Services, students, parents or legal guardians of students, and all others who use or access Imagine Learning services at any time.
- **"Authorized Person"**: an authorized School official, such as a school administrator or teacher, who enrolls a student or other User within the Services.
- **"PI"**: personal information (also commonly known as PI, personal data, personally identifiable information, or PII) collected from Users who access the Services.

Policy Scope

This Privacy Policy applies to all Imagine Learning Services and benefits you.

The data covered by this Privacy Policy applies only to information collected by Imagine Learning from you or an Authorized Person. This Privacy Policy does not apply to information obtained or disclosed through offline correspondence or personal contact with Imagine Learning's representatives.

By using Imagine Learning's Services, you represent that you agree to this Privacy Policy. **If you do not agree to this Privacy Policy, or if you have questions regarding the use of your personal information, contact your teacher or school administrator.**

Data Stewardship

This section provides information about how we collect, use, maintain, and destroy the data we collect.

Data Collection

All PI is handled by Imagine Learning with care and is protected by the policies, procedures, and safeguards described in this Privacy Policy. We collect PI either: (i) directly through forms or data entry fields on our Services, or (ii) through passive collection through use of the Services. To prevent unauthorized collection of PI, particularly from children, students and parents **cannot create student accounts** for Services without a sponsoring School or Authorized Person.

Student Account Data

When a student account is created, Imagine Learning begins to collect information about the student. Portions of this data are personally identifiable.

We will never condition a child's participation in an activity (such as contests) on the child's disclosure of more PI than is necessary to participate in the activity. This means if we don't need a specific piece of information (such as the child's email address) to allow the child to participate in a contest, we will not ask for it.

The following is a list of **required** information necessary to create a student account:

- Student first and last name
- Grade level
- Language
- Student number
- Student username and password for our Services
- School or district name

The following is a list of **optional** student information that may or may not be populated by an Authorized Person:

- SSO ID (for single sign-on functionality)
- Birth date (often used to help distinguish between students with the same name)
- Demographic information (for reporting purposes, such as gender, IEP status, ELL status, etc.)
- Organization number (e.g., School or district identifier, state ID, or other number)

As students use the Services, additional collected data may include:

- Assessment results and scores, including:
 - Academic performance and placement
 - Psychographic information (e.g., emotionality, confidence)
 - Screening results (optionally administered by the School or Authorized Person; e.g., dyslexia, cognitive, social, and physical development)
- Curriculum progress
- Audio recordings (e.g., students reading passages aloud)
- Responses to writing prompts
- Math journals
- Chat text logs between students and our certified teachers
- Certificates of achievement and curriculum completion
- Analytical data measuring a student's usage of and engagement with our Applications and learning activities (e.g., login frequency, click frequency, time between responses, time spent using the Applications, etc.)

Teacher and Administrator Account Data

Imagine Learning also collects a limited amount of information about teachers and administrators. This information includes:

- Teacher first and last name
- Email address
- School or district name

- State
- SSO ID (for single sign-on functionality)

As teachers and administrators use the Services, additional data collected may include:

- Certificates of completion for online training
- Analytical data measuring a User’s usage of and engagement with our Applications and learning activities (e.g., login frequency, click frequency, time between responses, time spent using the Applications, etc.)

Data collected by Our Websites, Applications, and Online Services

Contact data provided by you (or an Authorized Person) voluntarily may be collected with comments or requests for information. This information may include:

- First and last name
- Email address
- Phone number
- State and Zip code
- Title and organization name

Additionally, the following data may be collected and generated automatically:

- Device data (such as hardware model and operating system version)
- Analytical data (such as click frequency, time between responses, and time spent using the Services)
- Behavioral data (such as pages visited, interactions with our social media offerings)
- Log data (such as browser type, language preference, time zone, log-in and log-out times, internet connection information)
- Cookie data

Data Control

You always remain in control of the information you provide to Imagine Learning. **If you are a student who was enrolled by an Authorized Person, you must contact the School or Authorized Person regarding any questions or concerns related to your PI.** PI obtained by Imagine Learning from a School or Authorized Person continues to be under the ownership and control of that School or Authorized Person. For more detailed information about Imagine Learning’s compliance with various state and federal laws and regulations, see the [Imagine Learning Privacy Policy FAQ](#).

Parents and Legal Guardians

Imagine Learning acknowledges the rights of parents and legal guardians to review any educational data pertaining to their children under FERPA. Imagine Learning promptly routes requests made by parents or legal guardians to the School or Authorized Person for verification of the requester’s identity. Imagine Learning will assist the School or Authorized Person as needed to provide parents and legal guardians access to the requested information within a reasonable time frame.

Data Use

Imagine Learning’s primary purpose for collecting and processing PI is to provide, maintain, and operate educational services, as well as for general business purposes.

Data Collection for Educational Services

Information we collect (student, teacher, and administrator data) is used to provide educational services. For example, Imagine Learning may, as part of the Services, record audio of a child reading and speaking. The audio recording is played back to the child through the Services so she hears how she sounds, which improves student reading and language fluency. Teachers may later choose to listen to these audio files for an accurate and descriptive measure of student progress.

Other data are similarly collected to enhance the teaching and learning outcomes of both students and educators. Imagine Learning tracks and assesses a student's development as he progresses through the curriculum. Reports generated by this information enable teachers to evaluate student progress, to identify students who need intervention, and to discover students that can be taught together as a group.

Imagine Learning may use PI it collects, either separately or in combination with pre-existing data, for the following educational purposes:

- To provide, maintain, secure, and operate the Services (such as authenticating users and troubleshooting problems as requested by an Authorized Person or User);
- To develop and improve our Services for you;
- To customize your experience or content within our Services;
- To track and assess student development and progress through our Applications;
- To generate reports that allow parents, teachers, and other Authorized Persons to evaluate student progress, identify students who need intervention, and discover students who can be taught together as a group;
- To email parents, teachers, and other Authorized Persons about new features and other information related to our Services;
- To conduct aggregate statistical studies and perform research for Authorized Persons;
- To protect Imagine Learning and our Users, such as conducting audits or notifying Schools of inappropriate or potentially harmful behavior;
- To assist students who request online help from our state-certified, security-cleared teachers who are employed by Imagine Learning to provide individualized instruction; and
- Other educational purposes requested and sanctioned by an Authorized Person.

Like many online service providers, we also collect device, analytical, and log data about how Users use and engage with our Services. This information helps us maintain and improve the consistency, performance, and availability of our Services across platforms and devices.

Browser session cookies are used in our student-facing Services. These temporary cookies are erased from your device's memory when you close your Internet browser or turn off your computer. We also utilize persistent cookies, which are stored on your device until they expire or until you delete them. These cookies and other data collection technologies help you more easily navigate our Services. For example, a cookie may be used to store a School's site code to eliminate a student's need to enter it each time he logs in. No marketing or advertising cookies are used in the Services used by students. For additional information about cookies and how to opt out, see the Cookies section of the [Imagine Learning Privacy Policy FAQ](#).

Data Collection for General Business Purposes

In our non-student Websites and Services, we use website tracking tools such as Google Analytics, Eloqua, Google reCAPTCHA, and Social Media widgets for analytics, behavior tracking, lead

management, tag management, and protecting our Services from spam and abuse. We also use these technologies for the following business purposes:

- To analyze which pages you visit, and which features you use in our Services;
- To provide features such as social sharing widgets and videos;
- To measure advertising and promotional effectiveness;
- To assess which areas of our websites you visit to remarket to you after you visit our site; and
- To provide content to you from our third-party content partners.

Our web forms, which allow visitors to express interest in our Services, collect contact information and other PI. Completed forms include data used by Imagine Learning to respond to requests.

[Sale of Data, Marketing, or Targeted Advertising](#)

Imagine Learning does not sell PI or disclose collected PI. Imagine Learning does not market to or survey students, nor is PI used or disclosed for behavioral targeting of advertisements to students. School staff may be invited to provide feedback about their experiences, but participation is never required. Students are occasionally asked to provide feedback on their enjoyment level of various aspects of the Services.

[Data Access and Sharing with Third Parties](#)

Access to PI collected by Imagine Learning is restricted to a limited number of Imagine Learning employees who need such access to perform their job.

Imagine Learning may, at times, share certain pieces of PI with third parties that help us provide our Services. These third-party suppliers are considered "sub-processors" under applicable data protection laws because they process (e.g., store) personal data. We expect and require that these sub-processors implement appropriate security measures to safeguard personal data, and that they comply with applicable data protection laws. Imagine Learning discloses personal data to public authorities ONLY IF required by law. In the event of a required disclosure, Imagine Learning will notify affected Schools or Authorized Persons.

Data maintained by Imagine Learning are protected in a secure environment. See the **Security Overview** section of this document for more information about Imagine Learning security practices.

All PI held by Imagine Learning is destroyed or de-identified upon one of the following (i) after termination of our relationship with a School or Authorized Person, (ii) when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was provided, (iii) when advised to do so by the School or Authorized Person, or (iv) as directed by agreement with the School.

De-identified data (anonymous data with all PI removed) is maintained and used for reporting, analytics, and statistical research. This research helps us evaluate the effectiveness of Imagine Learning and improve our Services for you and other customers. We do not attempt to re-identify information that has been de-identified.

Data Return

Under the direction of the School or Authorized Person, data are returned to the School or Authorized Person as directed by the agreement between Imagine Learning and the School. If no specific instructions are included in the agreement, the data will be returned or destroyed upon one of the following (i) after termination of our relationship with a School or Authorized Person, (ii) when it is no longer needed for the purpose for which it was provided, (iii) when advised to do so by the School or Authorized Person, or (iv) as directed by agreement with the School. Data are returned in a digital, machine-readable format via a secure means of transmission.

Data Destruction

Imagine Learning employs United States Office of Education best practice recommendations for data destruction, as follows:

- Personal information is de-identified or destroyed after the termination of a contract, when it is no longer needed, or when advised to do so by the School or Authorized Person. In cases of de-identification, identifiable information is purged or obscured in such a way that the remaining data cannot be re-identified alone or in combination with other data. See also 'Data Retention and Management'.
- Where possible, personal information is destroyed using National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) clear method sanitization that protects against non-invasive data recovery techniques.
- The individual who performs the data destruction signs a certification form describing the destruction.
- Occasionally, non-electronic media used within Imagine Learning might contain personal data. When these documents are no longer required, the non-electronic media is destroyed in a secure manner (most typically using a shredder) that renders it safe for disposal or recycling.

We recognize the right of Users to review, amend where incorrect, request a copy of, and request destruction of their personal information. Imagine Learning promptly routes such requests to the School or Authorized Person for verification of the requester's identity. Imagine Learning will assist the School or Authorized Person as needed to respond to authorized requests within a reasonable time frame and in compliance with applicable laws and regulations.

Security Overview

Imagine Learning takes data stewardship responsibilities seriously. We have implemented several security measures to protect personal information from unauthorized disclosure.

Software Security

Imagine Learning's privacy and security practices utilize industry-standard tools and techniques to protect your personal information. However, to achieve comprehensive protection of personal information, each School needs to use secure practices as well. We host our Services from within Amazon Web Services (AWS) and Microsoft Azure, both of which are compliant with industry-recognized standards for security and privacy.

In addition to the protections afforded by our cloud hosting providers, Imagine Learning employs other practices to protect personal data. See the Security Practices section of the [Imagine Learning Privacy Policy FAQ](#) for detailed information.

Data Security

Personal information collected and processed by Imagine Learning is encrypted in transit and at rest. It is also stored within the continental United States. See the Security Practices section of the [Imagine Learning Privacy Policy FAQ](#) for additional details.

Compliance with Privacy Laws and Standards

Imagine Learning recognizes the preeminence of federal, state, and local laws, regulations, and policies that govern the privacy and security of your personal information. This section outlines Imagine Learning's compliance with several privacy laws and standards, including FERPA, COPPA, California Education Code § 49073.1 and SOPIPA, the Student Privacy Pledge, and the European Union GDPR.

FERPA

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) provides parameters for what is permissible when sharing student information. Imagine Learning is authorized by schools and districts under the FERPA "school official" exception to receive and use educational data to provide educational services. This information has significant educational value. Apart from enabling the creation of accounts with which students access our Services, this information enables teachers to track student growth and identify students who need intervention. We do not collect data for collection's sake, and access is limited and appropriate. DISTRICT EDUCATIONAL PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

This educational professional services agreement (this “Agreement”) is dated July 1, 2020 and is entered into between TEACH FOR AMERICA, INC. (“Teach For America”), a Connecticut non-profit with regional office located at 9393 Lightwave Ave, San Diego, CA 92123 and San Ysidro School District, a political subdivision of the state of California (“School District”) (each individually “a Party” and collectively “the Parties”).

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Teach For America is a national leader in recruiting, selecting, training and providing ongoing professional development to individuals committed to closing the achievement gap by serving as effective classroom teachers specifically equipped to enhance student achievement in under-resourced school systems.

WHEREAS, San Ysidro School District seeks to recruit new teachers who are trained to lead students to academic achievement and to equip such teachers with ongoing professional development and support to further develop and sustain their professional practice.

NOW THEREFORE, School District and Teach For America agree to be bound by the terms and conditions of this Agreement.

AGREEMENT

I. TEACHER CANDIDATE RECRUITMENT, SELECTION AND HIRING:

School District Responsibilities:

A. Hiring Commitment.

- i. Teach For America will use its reasonable efforts to provide the number of teacher candidates for employment with School District (“Teachers”) (the “Agreed Number”), but Teach For America cannot and does not guarantee its ability to provide the full Agreed Number of Teachers to School District. In the event that Teach For America supplies the School District with any Teachers above the Agreed Number, School District agrees to pay the fee for

each additional Teacher. Each cohort of Teachers employed pursuant to this clause is in addition to the Teachers from prior cohorts.

- a. teachers for the 2020-21 academic school year.
 - b. teachers for the 2021-22 academic school year.
 - c. teachers for the 2022-23 academic school year.
- ii. Whether or not Teach For America is able to provide the full Agreed Number, School District shall consider for hire each Teacher provided by Teach For America who meets the district eligibility requirements.
 - iii. Any Teach For America Teacher hired by the School District shall be hired as the classroom teacher of record and not for substitute, auxiliary, resource or teacher's aide positions.
 - iv. Teach For America Teachers will be hired by School District for vacancies across the full range of grades and subject matters.
 - v. To the extent reasonably practicable, School District will employ two or more Teachers per individual Partner School.
 - vi. School District and Teach For America shall collaborate in good faith to identify individual schools within School District appropriate for Teachers. In order to be considered an appropriate school (a "Partner School") for placement of a Teacher, the school's student population must be considered high poverty relative to the student population elsewhere in the district or that fifty percent or more of the school's student population receives free or reduced lunch.

B. Hiring Process.

- i. School District and Teach For America will collaborate in good faith to facilitate the efficient hiring of individual Teachers.
- ii. School District shall use its reasonable efforts to hire Teachers in a timely manner throughout the preceding spring and summer. School District agrees that where possible, Teach For America shall be informed of individual Teacher's grade and subject level assignments prior to the start of their Pre-Service Training (as defined below).

iii. Subject to its obligations under pre-existing collective bargaining agreements, contracts, or applicable law, School District will offer alternative employment to any Teacher who is not employed by the first day of the academic school year. "Alternative employment" includes, but is not limited to substitute teaching positions, "pool" teaching positions, classroom aides or other temporary category of employment available within School to individuals with teaching credentials. The purpose of an alternative employment placement is to provide a salary until such time as School District can secure permanent employment as a full-time classroom teacher of record.

II. TEACHER CANDIDATE RECRUITMENT, SELECTION AND HIRING:

Teach For America Responsibilities:

- A. Candidate Recruitment and Selection. Teach For America will utilize its reasonable efforts to recruit, select for participation in the Teach For America program, and present to the School District for employment Teachers from a broad range of academic majors and career fields. Teach For America will use reasonable efforts to recruit Teachers from diverse backgrounds. In connection with the foregoing, Teach For America will not knowingly engage in any unlawful acts of discrimination in its recruiting or selection of candidates.
- B. Pre-Service Training. Prior to entering the classroom, all Teachers will undergo pre-service training with Teach For America ("Pre-Service Training), which is provided by Teach For America in order to prepare Teachers for this work.
- C. Certification Status. Teach For America will provide the Pre-Service Training to Teachers presented to School District for the purpose of ensuring that such Teachers meet applicable federal, state and/or local educational standards or requirements such as those set forth in the federal Every Student Succeeds Act and other applicable state certification regulations (together, the "Requirements"). For purposes of this Section, only those

Requirements in effect at the time that the Teacher is offered employment by School District will be applicable.

III. TEACHER PLACEMENT AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITMENTS:
School District Responsibilities

A. Employment Status.

- i. Every Teacher employed by School District as described in this Agreement shall be a full-time employee of School District with all of the rights, responsibilities and legal protections attendant to that status and not an employee of Teach For America. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to grant additional employment rights to individual Teachers.
- ii. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to make Teach For America party to any Teacher employment agreement or permit Teach For America to interfere in the employment relationship between School District and an employed Teacher.
- iii. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to imply that an employer-employee relationship exists between Teach For America and any individual Teacher.
- iv. Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to imply that any Teacher employed by the School District is an agent of Teach For America or has any right or authority to create or assume any obligation of any kind, express or implied, on behalf of Teach For America.
- v. Notwithstanding the foregoing, School District may continue to employ individual Teacher(s) beyond the two-year commitment by mutual agreement between School District and such Teacher(s).

B. Compensation of Teachers. School District shall provide to every Teacher employed by School District pursuant to this Agreement the same salary and benefits as are provided to other teachers employed by School District who are similarly situated under factors routinely used by School District in making such decisions. Notwithstanding the above,

Teach For America acknowledges it exercises no control of the salary and benefits offered to Teachers per this Agreement.

C. Reductions in Force. Subject to its obligations under pre-existing labor agreements and applicable municipal and state laws and regulations, School District shall use reasonable efforts not to terminate any employed Teacher from their teaching position in the event of a reduction in force (RIF), layoffs, “leveling” or other elimination or consolidation of teaching positions within School District. School District shall treat any Teacher employed in connection with this Agreement whose teaching position is eliminated at least as favorably as other teachers with the same job classification, certification status, and/or seniority rights.

D. Compliance with Anti-Harassment and Non-Discrimination Regulations. Teach For America believes all Teachers should be able to work in a safe, inclusive and equitable environments free from all forms of unlawful discrimination based on characteristics or protected status, To that end, School District will provide a copy of their internal harassment policies and/or procedures prior to signing this Agreement. School District acknowledges that not consistently enforcing their policies and procedures constitutes a breach of this Agreement, and that such judgment is at the sole discretion of Teach For America.

IV. TEACHER PLACEMENT AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT COMMITMENTS: Teach For America Responsibilities

A. Professional Development and On-Line Data Storage Services.

- i. Teach For America shall provide on behalf of School District various professional development services and activities for participating Teachers as well as on-line data storage services to facilitate such professional development services during the Teachers first two years in the classroom (the “Professional Development Services”). These services may include periodic classroom observations by regional staff, videotaping of instruction with

review of instructional technique, co-investigative discussions to facilitate Teacher capacity for self-reflection and evaluation of instructional practice using student achievement data, and content area/grade-level workshops facilitated by veteran teachers. In addition, Teach For America shall facilitate Teacher access to an assortment of resources including sample instructional materials or assessment systems. These professional development services will be available to all Teachers during their first two years in the classroom. If professional development services must be provided virtually, at Teach For America's discretion, Teach For America shall provide equivalent services to the extent possible. To facilitate provision of these professional development services, Teach For America may provide on-line data storage services, including transfer and storage of identifiable student information on Teach For America's proprietary software and servers.

- ii. To facilitate provision of the Professional Development Services, School District may disclose to Teach For America student-related records and personally identifiable information contained in such records (collectively, "Student Records"). Pursuant to its obligations under the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, 20 USC §1232g, and its implementing regulations, 34 CFR pt. 99, as each may be amended from time to time ("FERPA"). In the course of providing the Professional Development and Data Storage Services, Teach For America is a school official with legitimate educational interests in the Student Records disclosed to Teach For America, pursuant to 34 CFR §99.31(a)(1).
- iii. Teach For America agrees to use, maintain, and redisclose Student Records only in accordance with the requirements of FERPA, as permitted by this Agreement and/or otherwise authorized by the School District or by law, and only for the purposes for which disclosure was made.
- iv. Teach For America may re-disclose Student Records to third parties pursuant to Teach For America's provision of the Professional Development and Data Storage Services, as provided in 34 C.F.R. § 99.33(b), provided that Teach For America shall, in advance, provide the names of such parties and a brief

description of such parties' legitimate educational interest in receiving such information.

- v. Pursuant to 34 CFR § 99.7(a)(3)(iii), School District shall include, in its annual notification of rights under FERPA, criteria that qualify Teach For America, in its capacity as a provider of professional development and data storage services, as a school official with a legitimate educational interest.

B. Certification and Credentialing Services.

- i. Teach For America shall facilitate the enrollment of individual Teachers in an alternative certification/licensure program that will enable the individual Teacher to obtain appropriate credentials to be a classroom teacher of record according to applicable state regulations in existence at the time of signature of this agreement.
- ii. Teach For America shall not be responsible for, and shall not be in breach of any provision of this Agreement, in the event of any failure by an individual Teacher to fulfill their obligations to maintain their teaching credentials or obtain necessary waiver(s) to remain a classroom teacher of record.

V. GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. Fees-for-Service.

- i. School District shall pay Teach For America an annual fee for each Teacher employed under this Agreement to defray expenses Teach For America incurred in recruiting, selecting, providing Pre-Service Training and continuing professional development services to the Teachers employed by School District under this agreement. All payments for fees shall be in the form of check delivered to Teach For America or wire transfer to an account designated by Teach For America in writing.
- ii. With respect to each Teacher whose employment by School District is to commence in the 2020-21 academic year, School District shall pay Teach For

America an annual amount of \$5,000 for each year in which such Teacher is employed by School District, up to two years from the date such employment is to commence; and

iii. With respect to each Teacher whose employment by School District is to commence in the 2021-22 academic year, School District shall pay Teach For America an annual amount of \$5,000 for each year in which such Teacher is employed by School District, up to two years from the date such employment is to commence; and

iv. With respect to each Teacher whose employment by School District is to commence in the 2022-23 academic year, School District shall pay Teach For America an annual amount of \$5,000 for each year in which such Teacher is employed by School District, up to two years from the date such employment is to commence.

B. Non-refund. Teach For America shall have no obligation to refund to School District any amount paid by School District in respect of any Teacher for any reason whatsoever.

C. Invoicing and Payment. Teach For America will invoice School District for all amounts due hereunder with respect to any academic year within sixty (60) days of the start of the academic school year, provided that Teach For America's failure to timely do so, will not constitute a waiver of any of Teach For America's rights or constitute a breach by Teach For America. For the avoidance of doubt, School District shall pay all invoices within 60 days of the date of the invoice.

D. Term. The term of this Agreement will cover all Teachers who's employment begins with the School District during the 2020-21, 2021-22, and 2022-23 academic years. This Agreement will expire on the last school day of the June 30, 2024 academic year and may be renewed at the end of the term on the same or substantial similar terms by mutual agreement of the parties.

- E. Termination. This Agreement may be terminated as follows:
- i. at any time by mutual written agreement of the Parties;
 - ii. by either Party, upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the other Party, provided that the terminating Party provides that notice no later than 120 days prior to the end of the current academic year; or
 - iii. by either Party upon written notice to the other Party in the event of a material breach of this Agreement that is incapable of being cured or, if capable of being cured, is not cured within thirty (30) days following receipt by the breaching Party of written notice of such breach from the non-breaching Party.
- F. Survivability and Effect of Termination. Except as otherwise specifically provided, if this Agreement expires or is terminated by either party it shall become void. In the event that this Agreement expires or is terminated by either party, Sections regarding the Compensation of Teachers, and Reductions in Force shall survive and will remain in effect until such time as there are no Teachers in their second year of employment in School District. Sections related to the Effect of Termination, No Warranty, Mutual Indemnification and Limitation of Liability shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement indefinitely. Additionally, Teach For America will be entitled to all outstanding amounts due up to the date of expiration or termination.
- G. No Warranty. School District hereby agrees and acknowledges that Teach For America does not make and has not made any representation and warranty (express or implied) as to the fitness of any Teacher presented or provided by Teach For America and School District shall indemnify and hold harmless the TFA Indemnities (as defined below in the Section related to Mutual Indemnification) from and against any Losses (also defined below in the same Section below) resulting from any claim related to the services provided by Teach For America, including, but not limited to, claims that any Teacher presented or provided by Teach For America was unfit for the position for which he or she was hired by School District.

H. Mutual Indemnification.

- i. Each Party shall indemnify and hold harmless the other party and its officers, directors, employees and agents (the " Indemnitees") from and against any and all losses, liabilities, claims, damages, costs and expenses (including attorneys' fees) ("Losses") to which such Indemnatee may become subject arising out of a breach of this Agreement by the indemnifying party, except to the extent such Losses result from the willful misconduct or gross negligence of such Indemnatee.
- ii. To the extent permitted by applicable state laws and regulations, neither Party shall have any liability to the other Party with respect to Losses asserted after 6 months of the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

I. Limitation of Liability. Neither Party nor any of its officers, directors, employees or agents shall be liable to the other Party in connection to this Agreement, except for a Loss resulting from willful misconduct or gross negligence on the part of such Party; provided that in no event any such liability be in excess of the aggregate amount of the value of this Agreement.

J. Surveys. School District acknowledges that Teach For America may survey individual constituents, teachers, etc. at the partner school sites regarding its programming and professional development of Teachers in the classroom.

K. Amendment/Modification. Any amendment/modification or waiver must be in writing and signed by each Party.

L. Counterparts. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts (including by electronic transmission).

M. Governing Law. This Agreement and all matters relating hereto shall be governed by, construed and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California.

N. Severability. If any term or provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, unenforceable or invalid in whole or in part for any reason, such provisions or part thereof shall be stricken from this Agreement, and such provision shall not affect the legality, enforceability or validity of the remainder of this Agreement. Such stricken provision shall be replaced, to the extent possible, with a legal, enforceable and valid provision that is as similar in tenor to the stricken provision as is legally possible.

O. Notices. Any notices to either Party under this Agreement shall be in writing and delivered by hand or sent by nationally recognized messenger service, or by registered or certified mail, return receipt requested, to the addresses set forth below or to such other address as that Party may hereafter designate by notice.

P. Waiver. A waiver or a breach or default under this Agreement shall not be a waiver of any other subsequent breach or default. The failure or delay in enforcing compliance with any term or condition of this Agreement shall not constitute a waiver unless expressly waived in writing .

Q. Authority. This Agreement supersedes all communications between the parties related to the subject matter of this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties agree as follows:


Article 1. CONSULTANT's Services:

In the event a claim under the provisions of the California Worker's Compensation Act is filed against DISTRICT, CONSULTANT agrees to defend and hold harmless the DISTRICT from such claim. Article 7. Ownership of Work Product All products of work performed pursuant to this Agreement will be the sole property of DISTRICT and no reproduction of any portions of the work product may be made in any form without the express written consent of the DISTRICT.

Article 8. Termination of Agreement DISTRICT may terminate this Agreement and will be relieved of all obligations under this Agreement should CONSULTANT fail to perform any of the terms and conditions hereof at the time and places set forth herein. In the event of such termination, CONSULTANT shall be paid the reasonable value of the services rendered up to the date of such termination, less any payments theretofore made, as determined by DISTRICT, and the CONSULTANT hereby expressly waives any and all claims for damages or compensation arising under this Agreement in the event of such termination, except as set forth herein.

DISTRICT may also terminate this Agreement at any time and for any reason by giving written notice to CONSULTANT of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, at least thirty (30) days before the effective date of such termination. If the Agreement is terminated by DISTRICT as provided in this Section, CONSULTANT shall be entitled to receive compensation for any satisfactory work completed up to the receipt by CONSULTANT of notice of termination and for satisfactory work completed between the receipt of notice of termination and the effective date of termination pursuant to specific request by DISTRICT for the performance of such work.

Article 9. Status of CONSULTANT It is expressly understood that at all times while rendering the services described herein and in complying with any terms and conditions of this Agreement CONSULTANT is acting as an independent CONSULTANT and not as an officer, agent, or employee of DISTRICT. CONSULTANT shall be responsible for all salaries, payments and benefits for all of its officers, agencies, assigns, subcontractors and employees in performing services pursuant to this Agreement. The CONSULTANT understands that he/she and all of his/her employees are not entitled to benefits of any kind or nature normally provided to employees of the District.

Article 10. Assignment No portion of this Agreement or any of the work to be performed hereunder may be assigned by CONSULTANT, without express written consent of DISTRICT, and without such consent all services hereunder are to be performed solely by CONSULTANT.

Article 11. Alterations or Variance No alterations to this Agreement or variance from the provisions hereof shall be valid unless made in writing and executed by both of the parties hereto.

MINI PITCH PROGRAM
PARTNERSHIP AGREEMENT

Pursuant to this Mini Pitch Partnership Agreement (“Agreement”), dated as of July 17, 2020 (“Effective Date”), the United States Soccer Federation Foundation, Inc. (“Foundation”) agrees to partner with the San Ysidro School District (“District”), in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein. The Foundation and the District are collectively referred to herein as “the Parties.”

1. **Foundation:** **U.S. Soccer Federation Foundation, Inc.**

2. **Acrylic Mini Pitches:** Consistent with the Foundation’s interests in promoting youth soccer, particularly within vulnerable communities in urban areas, this Agreement will provide **three (3)** acrylic mini pitch surfaces with goal installation (“Mini Pitches”), to be supplied by the Foundation, which shall be valued by Foundation, in its sole and absolute discretion, in an amount not to exceed **\$60,000 per Mini Pitch**. The Mini Pitches will be installed by the Foundation and/or its designated contractor at the following property owned by the District (the “Mini Pitch Project”) in calendar year 2020:

- SITE 1 - La Mirada Elementary School
- SITE 2 – Ocean View Hills School
- SITE 3 – San Ysidro Middle School

3. **District Covenants:** In order to induce the Foundation to enter into this Agreement, and to receive the aforementioned Mini Pitches, the District covenants as follows:

- (a) The Foundation’s afterschool soccer program, *Soccer for Success*, will receive scheduling priority on the Mini Pitches for a minimum of to be determined (TBD) weeks per year, TBD days per week in accordance with the District’s standard facilities use permitting process pursuant to Education Code Section 38130 et seq. (the “Civic Center Act”). The program will be run in two sessions, one in the fall, and one in the spring, and will be operated by a mutually-agreed upon local program operator, who will enter into Memorandum of Understanding or similar agreement with the District and also agree to abide by the District’s standard facilities use requirements pursuant the Civic Center Act. The District agrees to permit *Soccer for Success* programming to be housed on the Mini Pitches for the anticipated lifespan of the Mini Pitches which is TBD years. Unless mutually agreed to in writing by the parties, this Agreement will expire at that time. Should the District elect to run the *Soccer for Success* program, a separate agreement will be initiated to enumerate the parties’ obligations for program operation.
- (b) When not in use for programming by the District, the Mini Pitches will be open and accessible to the general public during all reasonable, playable hours, including weekends subject to the District’s standard Civic Center Act use of facilities process.
- (c) The Foundation will be granted usage of each Mini Pitch for one (1) day per year over the first five (5) years following each completion, including, without limitation, for Special Events (as defined below) that are organized by the Foundation. The Foundation shall ensure that the schedule for such usage for dates and times is mutually agreed upon with the District, and the District will not unreasonably withhold play space time for such usage. However, the scheduling

of Special Events shall be in the District's sole discretion so as not to conflict with school operations. For purposes of this Agreement, "Special Events" shall be defined as tournaments, clinics, events, training sessions, media functions and any other similar event the Foundation so determines.

- (d) Upon completion, the Mini Pitches will be maintained in accordance with the Foundation's installation vendor's recommendations for user safety, to be provided by the Foundation. The District acknowledges and agrees that it will be responsible for regular maintenance of the Mini Pitches following their completion, which includes regular cleaning of the surface and inspection of all Mini Pitch elements. The District is responsible for providing regular updates to the Foundation on the status of the Mini Pitches, including status of the goals and windscreens.
- (e) The District presently owns the property on which the Mini Pitches will be built.
- (f) Prior to commencing installation of the Mini Pitches, the Foundation and/or its designated contractor will obtain, or shall assist (where necessary) in obtaining, all permits, authorizations and consents from third parties, including governmental entities, necessary for the installation and construction of the Mini Pitches.

4. **Facts and Representations True and Correct:** The District hereby affirms the representations made in conversations and communications with Foundation are true and correct and that the Foundation may rely upon the truth and correctness of the representations made in all conversations and communications regarding this Mini Pitch Project, without further independent investigation. The District further affirms that it has not omitted any material facts, the knowledge of which would adversely impact the awarding of the Mini Pitches to the District. The District avows that no adverse events have occurred since the latest communication which have materially and adversely altered the truth or reliability of the Mini Pitch Project, including the tax status of the District. The Parties agree to immediately inform each other within five (5) business days of any material change which might affect any terms of this Agreement.

5. **Books and Records:**

- (a) The District agrees to maintain sufficient operating and financial books, records and related documentation regarding the activities of the District and other evidence sufficient for the Foundation to satisfy its fiduciary, public and governmental responsibilities and duties. The Foundation shall have reasonable access to the books and records of the District for inspection purposes and shall be entitled to copies, as they relate to this Agreement and the Mini Pitch Project.
- (b) The Foundation agrees to maintain sufficient operating and financial books, records and related documentation regarding the activities of the Foundation and other evidence sufficient for the District to satisfy its fiduciary, public and governmental responsibilities and duties. The District shall have reasonable access to the books and records of the Foundation for inspection purposes and shall be entitled to copies, as they relate to the Mini Pitch Project.

6. **Mini Pitch Reports:**

- (a) **Impact Reports:** Following completion of the installation of the Mini Pitches, the District shall provide to the Foundation a report, produced and distributed by the Foundation, describing the impact of the Mini Pitches. Such report shall be submitted to the Foundation within thirty (30) days of receipt of the report form, distributed annually for three (3) years after completion of installation of the Mini Pitches. This report shall include photographs of the Mini Pitches in use by youth soccer players and provide information on play space usage rates, stories of impact on the community, and any other information reasonably requested by Foundation.

- (b) **Site Visits:** The District will use its best efforts to accommodate any representative of the Foundation, or of the Foundation’s funders, who requests to conduct a site visit, at the sole cost of the Foundation or its funders, for the purposes of collecting information about the Mini Pitch Project’s impact.
- (c) **Photographs/Videos/Stories/Testimonials:** In addition to submitting digital photographs, videos, stories and testimonials relating to the Mini Pitch Project in the aforementioned reports, the District shall submit the same to the Foundation upon request by the Foundation, including before and after photographs, both in daytime and at night, of the Mini Pitches site area.

7. Publicity Material and Recognition:

- (a) The Foundation shall have the right to publicize, show photographs of, and use the name of the Mini Pitches and otherwise promote its contributions in any and all media. The District authorizes the Foundation to utilize those logo or logos, owned or controlled by the District and associated with the Mini Pitch Project, for related marketing and/or publicity, copies of which shall be provided to the District.
- (b) The District agrees to fully assist and cooperate in a mutually acceptable dedication event, should the Foundation request such, which may include appearances by athletes affiliated with the Foundation. In order to assist the District, the Foundation will provide copies of the Foundation’s logo(s) and a standard press release for the District to share with local media.

8. Awareness Opportunities: The District grants to the Foundation the right to permanently place the Foundation’s trademark, trade name or any design/logo owned or controlled by Foundation (each, a “Mark” and together, the “Marks”), and that of its funding partners, on the surface of each completed Mini Pitch, per the rendering found in Attachment A. Additionally, the District grants to the Foundation the right to place the Foundation’s Marks, and the Marks of its funding partners, on signage at each Mini Pitch.

Unless the Foundation chooses to forego the right, standard Marks will be included during installation of the Mini Pitches, per the rendering found in Attachment A. Each Mark will remain at the site of the Mini Pitches, unless removed by the Foundation or unless the Foundation otherwise gives its written consent to the removal of such Mark.

Additionally, the District will allow the Foundation to install wind screens and signage on the premises on which the Mini Pitches are built in order to promote and recognize local community artists, as well as recognize the Project partners and promote community unity and history.

9. Mini Pitch Project Not Assignable: The Mini Pitch Project is intended solely for the benefit of the District. No benefit of the Mini Pitch Project may be delegated, assigned or otherwise transferred without the advance, written consent of the Foundation, which consent shall be in the sole and absolute discretion of the Foundation.

10. Proper Authority: Each of the Parties and its officers represent and warrant that they are authorized to enter into this Agreement and execute the same without further authority.

11. Warranties: The Foundation and/or its contractor shall warrant that the Mini Pitches have been appropriately and safely constructed in accordance with all applicable laws and are fit for the purpose for which they are being provided to the District, including but not limited to use by the District’s students and the general public, and that the Mini Pitches do not violate any applicable law, regulation, ordinance,

lease, or otherwise violate the rights of any person or entity. The Foundation may require its contractors to provide such a construction warranty/guaranty, so long as such warranty is appropriately assigned to the District and/or is made enforceable by the District in a written form that allows the District to ensure the construction/installation work was properly completed.

12. **Assumption of Risk:** Except as otherwise set forth herein, the District hereby agrees to assume all risks and liabilities associated with the use, operation, maintenance, safety and condition of the Mini Pitches upon its installation and acceptance by the District. The Foundation assumes all risks during the construction and installation process.

13. **Indemnification:**

(a) **Foundation's Indemnification of the District:** The Foundation agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the District, its governing board, and employees, from any and all claims, demands, causes of action, costs, expenses (including reasonable legal/attorneys' fees and expenses arising out of or related to any legal proceeding and any legal appeal), liability, loss, damage or injury, in law or equity, to property or persons, including wrongful death (collectively "Claims"), in any manner arising out of or incident to any act, negligence or misconduct of the Foundation, its contractors or subcontractors, arising out of or related to the construction and installation of the Mini Pitches on the District's property by the Foundation, its contractors and/or subcontractors.

(b) **District's Indemnification of the Foundation:** The District agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the Foundation, its parent, subsidiary and affiliated companies, sponsors, benefactors, donors, officers, directors, employees, accountants, attorneys, agents, successors and assigns ("Foundation Parties") from and against any and all third party claims, demands, losses, damages, liabilities, costs and expenses (including reasonable legal/attorneys' fees and expenses arising out of or related to any legal proceeding and any legal appeal) (collectively "Claims") related to the use of the Mini Pitches after they are properly installed on the District's property, with the exception of Claims arising out of the negligence and/or misconduct of the Foundation with regard to the installation and/or manufacture of the Mini Pitches.

The Parties' indemnification obligations hereunder shall survive the expiration or earlier termination of this Agreement.

14. **Insurance Requirements:**

(a) **Insurance Requirements of the Mini Pitches.** During construction/installation of the Mini Pitches, the Foundation and/or its contractor shall provide and maintain, at its expense, the following insurance, or equivalent in self-insurance, which shall include the District as an additional insured, on a primary basis from any and all Claims arising out of or in connection with the construction/installation of the Mini Pitches pursuant to this Agreement. At all times after the Mini Pitches are in place, the District shall provide and maintain, at its expense, the following insurance, or equivalent in self-insurance, which shall protect the District and the Foundation on a primary basis from any and all Claims arising out of or in connection with the operations and maintenance of the Mini Pitches to this Agreement:

- i. **Commercial General Liability** insurance with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each occurrence and \$2,000,000 in the aggregate. Such insurance shall include coverage for contractual liability, premises liability, products-completed operations, personal and advertising injury, property damage and bodily injury liability (including death). Said policy shall be endorsed to name the District, the Foundation and Foundation Parties as Additional Insureds respectively.

- ii. Automobile Liability insurance covering liability arising out of the Foundation's or the District's applicable construction/installation, use, operation and/or maintenance of any auto (including trucks and other construction vehicles), with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each accident combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage.
- iii. Workers' Compensation insurance covering employees of the District or the Foundation and/or its designated contractors involved with the regard to the parties respective activities as applicable for construction/installation or maintenance of the Mini Pitches on the District's property, with limits as required by statutory law, including Employer's Liability coverage with limits not less than \$1,000,000 each accident, \$1,000,000 disease-each employee and \$1,000,000 disease-policy limit. A Waiver of Subrogation endorsement in favor of the San Ysidro School District is to be provided.
- iv. Umbrella and/or Excess Liability insurance with limits not less than \$2,000,000 each occurrence shall apply in excess of the Commercial General Liability, Automobile Liability and Employer's Liability policy limits.

All such insurance required above shall be (1) considered primary with respect to Claims arising out of the installation, use and maintenance of the Mini Pitches; and (2) shall be written by insurance companies that are satisfactory to the District and that are licensed to do business in the state in which the Mini Pitches are located, California. The Foundation shall not allow any of the required policies to be materially changed, reduced or cancelled unless the Foundation provides thirty (30) days prior written notice thereof to the District.

Upon execution of this Agreement, the Foundation shall provide the District with a certificate of insurance confirming that the appropriate insurance is in place and that the policies have been properly endorsed to meet the insurance requirements as set forth above.

- 15. **Participant Waiver and Release Forms:** To the extent that the District requires participants in its programs or others who use the Mini Pitches to sign waiver and release forms, the District shall include the Foundation and the Foundation Parties as released parties in the form.
- 16. **Use of Mark:** Notwithstanding anything in this Agreement to the contrary, in the event the District desires to use a Mark owned or controlled by the Foundation in a manner consistent with this Agreement, the District shall first submit a sample of the concept of the proposed use to the Foundation for prior written approval, which approval may be withheld in the sole discretion of Foundation. Any such use by the District shall create no rights for the District in or to the Mark. Each Mark shall remain at all times the sole and exclusive intellectual property of the Foundation, and the Foundation shall have the right, from time to time, to request samples of use from which it may determine compliance with these terms and conditions. Notwithstanding any provision of this Agreement to the contrary, the Foundation reserves, in its sole and absolute discretion, the right to prohibit use of its Marks.
- 17. **Applicable Law; Jurisdiction:** This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the state of California, without regard to principles of conflict of laws. Each Party agrees that any action or proceeding with respect to this Agreement may only be brought in a federal or state court situated in the state of California, and by execution and delivery of this Agreement, such party irrevocably consents to jurisdiction and venue in each such court within the County of San Diego.
- 18. **Third Party Beneficiaries:** It is expressly agreed and by this statement specifically intended by the Parties that nothing within this Agreement shall be construed as indicating any intent by either Party to benefit any other entity or person not a party signatory to this Agreement by any provision or to entitle any such third party to any right of action on account hereof.

19. **Notices:** Any notices or communications given under this Agreement must be made in writing (a) if to the Foundation, at the address of the Foundation as hereinabove set forth or at such other address as the Foundation may designate by notice, or (b) if to the District, at the address of the District as hereinabove set forth or at such other address as the District may designate by notice.
20. **Entire Agreement; Modifications:** This Agreement contains the entire agreement between the Foundation and the District and cannot be changed, modified, amended, waived or canceled except by an agreement in writing and executed by each of the Parties hereto.
21. **Counterparts and Facsimile Signatures:** This Agreement may be executed in one or more counterparts each of which shall be deemed an original but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument. This Agreement may be executed by facsimile signature by any Party and such signature will be deemed binding for all purposes hereof without delivery of an original signature being thereafter required.
22. **Miscellaneous Right to Access/Construction Terms.** In addition to the above obligations, the Foundation's right to access the District's property pursuant to this Agreement for the purpose of constructing and installing the Mini Pitches, shall also be subject to the following terms and conditions.
- (a) **Construction Cost.** The Foundation and/or its contractor will be solely responsible for all costs associated with such design, construction, and installation of the Mini Pitches subject to the following requirements for construction/installation:
 - (b) **Survey.** If needed, the Foundation and/or its contractor will perform a survey at its cost for purposes of specifically locating the Mini Pitches on the District's property and documenting the agreed upon location's suitability for installation of the Mini Pitches. A copy of the survey shall be provided to the District if prepared.
 - (c) **Compliance with Applicable Laws.** The Foundation and/or its contractor shall comply with all statutes, ordinances, regulations, and requirements of all governmental entities, both federal and state and county or municipal, or regulations relating to its construction and installation work on the District's property, whether those statutes, ordinances, regulations, and requirements are now in force or are subsequently enacted. Furthermore, the Foundation and/or its contractor shall not maintain, commit, or permit the maintenance or commission of any nuisance as now or hereafter defined by any statutory or decisional law applicable to any part of the District's property. The Foundation and/or its contractor's obligations under this section include, but are not limited to the payment of prevailing wage, DIR registration and any other public works requirements as applicable to any work undertaken by Foundation and/or its contractor on District's property as well as ensuring compliance with all applicable requirements of the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) and for providing all related documents and approvals to District.
 - (d) **Construction Schedule; Notice.** District shall be given at least ten (10) days' notice of commencement of construction and a proposed schedule of commencement and completion of construction for District's review and approval.
 - (e) **Construction Insurance/Bonds.** The Foundation and/or its contractor shall require all contractors and/or subcontractors involved in design, construction, and/or installation of the Mini Pitches to be appropriately insured and bonded, including payment bonds as required by Civil Code 9550, and shall also include the District as an additional insured on such policies/bonds. District shall be provided appropriate documentation of same.

- (f) Temporary Fencing or Similar Barrier. During the construction phase, temporary fencing or a similar barrier shall be erected to insure the safety and security of the site, and to prevent injury and vandalism.
- (g) Utilities. The Foundation and/or its contractor shall be solely responsible for establishing utility connections required for construction and operation of the Mini Pitches and for all costs of utilities associated therewith. Foundation shall submit its proposed utility pathways, including interconnections, to District for review and approval.
- (h) Interference with District Educational Programs. Construction of the Mini Pitches shall not result in any interference with District's educational programs or activities unless expressly agreed by District in writing.
- (i) Site Access for Construction. District reserves the right to reasonably restrict access to District Property in the event of a conflict within school operations (i.e. state testing days, etc.). If Foundation and/or its contractor requires access to District Property during the typical school hours of 7AM-4PM Monday through Friday when school is in session, and when students may be present on District Property, Foundation and/or its contractor shall notify and obtain the approval of the administrative official in charge of the school prior to entering District Property. In the event of any such conflict, District will permit access as soon as reasonably possible and District shall furnish Foundation and/or its contractor with necessary means of access for the purpose of ingress and egress to District Property. It is agreed, however, that only authorized employees or properly authorized subcontractors of the Foundation or persons under their direct supervision will be permitted to enter District Property. At all times, District, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to require fingerprinting/background checks of Foundation and/or its contractor's subcontractors, employees, volunteers or agents as described in Section (j) below.
- (j) Fingerprinting Requirements/Student Safety. In accordance with the provisions of Education Code Section 45125.1, unless specifically exempted by the District in writing, Foundation and/or its contractor must provide certification of Department of Justice Clearance for employees of the Foundation and all its subcontractors obtained through LiveScan. Local agency clearances including but not limited to DMV, Police Department, and County Sheriff are not acceptable. The Foundation and/or its contractor shall certify that no such employees who have been convicted of serious or violent felonies (as specified in Education Code Section 45125.1) will have contact with pupils. As part of such certification, Foundation and/or its contractor must provide the District with a list of all employees providing services to the Mini Pitches pursuant to the Agreement. In performing the services/work contemplated under the Agreement to the Mini Pitches, Foundation and/or its contractor shall not allow any of its or its subcontractors' employees, volunteers, or agents who are not included on the above-referenced list to enter onto or remain in the vicinity of the District Property. The Foundation and/or its contractor's failure to comply with these requirements shall be deemed and construed to be a material breach of the Agreement.
- (k) Title to District Property. The Parties agree that fee title to all District Property shall at all times remain fully vested in the District. The Foundation and/or its contractor and subcontractors shall neither file, record, nor permit the recording or filing of, any lien, including any mechanics or other lien(s), claim(s) or encumbrance(s) of any nature with respect to any portion of the District Property, nor shall the Foundation and/or its contractor and subcontractors use or permit to be used any portion of the District Property, to be used as security for any transaction of any kind. The Foundation and/or its contractor and subcontractors shall immediately remove any lien(s), claim(s) or encumbrance(s) of any kind, including any security obligation of any nature, which the Foundation and/or its contractor causes or permits to be filed or recorded against any portion of the District Property. The Foundation and/or its contractor and subcontractors shall be liable

to the District for all costs, damages, reasonable attorney's fees, and any amounts expended in defending any proceedings or in the payment of any of said liens or claims or any judgment obtained therefor pursuant to the indemnification provisions of this Agreement

23. **Termination.** This Agreement may be terminated by either party in the event a material breach occurs, that remains uncured after thirty (30) days written notice.
