Grade Level Goals:

Students who complete this course successfully will be able to:

- Math
 - Represent numbers and word problems using a variety of mathematical strategies.
 - Classify and sort 2 and 3 dimensional shapes.
 - Apply basic operations within 20.
 - Count forward and backward to 120, skip count by 2s, 5s and 10s.
 - Compare numbers to 100 using the symbols $>$, $<$ and $=$.
- Reading
 - Listen to, read, and comprehend a variety of genres in grade-level texts.
 - Read 100+ high-frequency words in and out of context with automaticity.
 - Demonstrate print awareness in reading.
- Writing
 - Use correct punctuation, writes legibly, and uses correct letter formation and spacing.
 - Write across genres (narrative, informative, opinion) using appropriate structure and conventions; independently revise and edit to improve clarity, organization, and mechanics.
- Science
 - Conduct scientific investigations safely, ask questions and seek answers and use critical thinking skills.
 - Understand animal and plant life cycles, how objects move, weather and seasons, earth materials, classifying and sorting objects based on their attributes and states of matter.

Student Evaluation:

The grading system for grade level (K-1) is as follows:

- Standards based report card, based on mastery of standards (TEKS) assessed/observed by teacher
- Students will get feedback on report card in the core content areas of Math, ELAR, Science, and Social Studies.
