

How does a student qualify for GATE?

There are several ways a student can qualify for GATE.

A matrix is used to qualify students. Students earn points based on their MAP (Normed Standardized test taken by all CCSD students) scores (Math or English Language Arts) and/or the scores earned from the two tests given to students who are referred for testing.

Tests given by GATE specialists once a student has been referred -

- Naglieri Nonverbal Ability Test (NNAT3). This test is a brief, culturally unbiased, nonverbal measure of general ability.
- The KBIT-2 verbal score contains two subtests: Verbal Knowledge and Riddles. The raw scores on the two subtests are added together to obtain the verbal raw score.

Referrals can be made by anyone. Typically they are done by the classroom teacher, however, students, specialists, and parents can refer a student.
