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MESSAGE FROM OUR FOUNDER

I never dreamed that Capital Prep would become a network of schools across two states, spanning 20 years. When I asked Rich Beganski if he wanted to start a school, I meant it. One school. A single school in Hartford, grades 6 through 12, that would challenge the status quo. One school that would make people stand up and take notice—that Black and Latin children are just as capable as any other children. One school. One city. One state.

In 2011, Capital Preparatory Magnet School expanded to include pre-K through fifth grade. In 2015, we opened Capital Prep Harbor School in Bridgeport, serving grades 6–12. A year later, Capital Prep Harlem Charter School opened. Then came Capital Prep Harbor Lower School, and in 2020, the Capital Prep Bronx Charter School opened its doors. Since then, Capital Prep Middletown has been approved, and Capital Prep New Rochelle is set to open in fall 2026. This was never the dream. This is so much bigger.



EQUITY UNLOCKS EXCELLENCE: ADDRESSING THE OPPORTUNITY GAP

For the past two decades, Capital Preparatory Schools has been driven by a simple yet powerful mission: to close the opportunity gap that continues to define the educational experience for too many children in America.

Historically, education systems have measured progress through what's often called the achievement gap: a surface-level look at academic outcomes. But the achievement gap doesn't tell the whole story. It doesn't account for the inequities that shape those outcomes, or the systemic barriers that prevent children from reaching their full potential.

When we shift our focus to opportunity, we address the systematic inequities that have, for too long, left our most vulnerable children behind.

This is why Capital Prep exists. We dismantle systemic barriers through rigorous academics, social justice education, and an unwavering belief in every scholar's potential.

OPPORTUNITY STARTS EARLY

All 8th grade Capital Prep scholars are now provided early access to Algebra

Research shows that students who complete Algebra in 8th grade are **far more likely** to take Calculus by senior year and pursue advanced STEM pathways.



A three-year pilot at Capital Prep Bronx validated this approach, achieving Algebra proficiency rates of **100%, 100%, and 94%** – clear evidence that early access drives opportunity and long-term academic success.

WE ARE COLLEGEBOUND!

We know that a college degree is a trajectory-changing milestone. This is our North Star. Capital Prep strives to ensure that all scholars can achieve this by offering a rigorous college preparatory curriculum, an eclectic variety of athletic programs, as well as an interwoven, affective approach that allows the development of the whole child for college, career, and beyond.







Our commitment to educator diversity isn't just a matter of representation. It's a matter of results. Research shows that students of color who have even one teacher of the same racial or ethnic background are more likely to achieve academically, remain engaged, and envision a future in which they lead, teach, and succeed.

In 2024-2025, Capital Prep Harbor ranked in the **TOP 10** districts (#7) for Educators of Color in the State of Connecticut, only 7.6 percentage points off from the #1 District.




REPRESENTATION IN THE CLASSROOM ISN'T JUST A GOAL, IT'S A STANDARD.



CAPITAL PREP BRONX RECEIVES ITS FIRST FULL FIVE-YEAR RENEWAL

In 2025, the State University of New York (SUNY) granted our Capital Preparatory Bronx Charter School a five-year renewal. This significant milestone reaffirms our ongoing commitment to educational excellence and social justice.

The renewal reflects our strong academic performance, our culture of care, and our steadfast dedication to preparing scholars for college and leadership. Since opening our doors in August 2020, at the height of the global pandemic, we have built a rigorous, socially conscious curriculum that challenges and supports students at every level.

As we look ahead, this renewal serves as both a validation of the progress we've made and a charge to keep expanding opportunity – ensuring that every scholar, regardless of zip code, has access to the exceptional education they deserve.

WELCOMING CAPITAL PREP NEW ROCHELLE TO THE CAPITAL PREP FAMILY

Capital Prep New Rochelle was officially approved by SUNY on October 9, 2024.

Although the school was originally slated to open in Fall 2025, delays in Charter School Program (CSP) funding necessitated a planning year.

The school is now on track to open in Fall 2026, launching with grades K, 6, and 7.

Capital Prep New Rochelle will carry forward the proven legacy of the Capital Prep network, continuing its commitment to 100% college acceptance and to graduating students as agents of change, prepared for college, career, and life beyond.

In Middletown, the story the numbers tell *depends on who is being counted.*

At Capital Prep Harbor, the Black students we serve consistently outperform their Middletown peers in ELA, math, and science state testing and graduate at higher rates, showing what becomes possible when students learn in an environment built to support them fully.

Black students at Capital Prep are 48% likelier to be able to read at grade level and 41% likelier to be able to do math at grade level compared to the Black students in Middletown School District.

For many Black parents in Middletown, this gap isn't abstract – it shapes everyday worries about whether their children will be seen, challenged, and supported.

This is why the possibility of Capital Prep in Middletown matters. It offers not just another school, but opportunity, where students who have long been on the margins of the district's success can finally stand at the center of their own.



IT'S BEEN ALMOST FOUR YEARS SINCE OUR JOURNEY TO OPEN CPREP MIDDLETOWN BEGAN

Spring 2022

New Charter RFP is released by the state of Connecticut. Capital Prep Middletown **Planning Committee** is established.

Weekly planning meetings commence, community engagement town halls and events are held, newsletter series begins

December 2022

Our 518-page Capital Prep Middletown application was submitted, including **162 signatures** and **23 letters of support.**

March 2023

Despite their effort to **block the vote from happening**, CPREP Middletown is **officially approved** by the State Board of Education as the #1 charter applicant in that given year.

Over 35 speakers attended, with over 80% speaking favorably about Capital Prep Middletown.

June 2023

In a closed door meeting, which excluded the Chairs of the Appropriations Committee, Capital Prep Middletown **was removed from the State's Budget.**

Middlesex County Chapter NAACP held a press conference at State Capitol to address the unjust removal of funding for CPREP Middletown. Since then, we have had a consistent presence in the community, regularly attending Board of Ed meetings and speaking to advocate for the opening of the school.

September & October 2025

In September 2025, Capital Prep Middletown filed a declaratory ruling with the State Board of Education, stating that, pursuant to CT charter law (10-66 ee), that the State Board of Education **broke the law by not allocating funding to Capital Prep Middletown** despite our track record of success, and ranking #1 in the application process when it was approved.

The State Board of Education **dismissed our request** for an impartial hearing officer to oversee the declaratory ruling, and has since **denied any allegations** that they've broken the law.











PERCENTAGES BY SUBGROUP












