1. CALL TO ORDER – Open Public Meetings Act - 5:10 PM

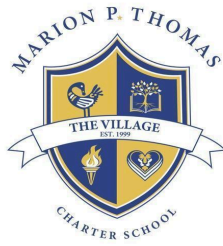

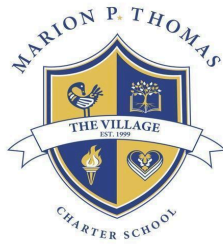

6. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Operations & Finance Committee

- The Operations Committee met on October fifteenth. The first thing we talked about was tech with Mr. Avery and the numbers that we got in that committee or in that portion of the call was that there were 386 incident IQ tickets and out of 386, 366 were closed. We did spend a good amount of time talking about number spoofing. So there was an issue that we've resolved with regards to folks being able to, you know, make phone calls and appear as though it was our phone number. And we figured out how to get that resolved. I know there was also-- there will be some follow-ups on that. We talked about NJGPA and NJSLA assessment testing. We had a successful assessment testing window. And the test will be administered for NJGPA, it looks like, in November. We talked about facilities. We did talk about the National Custodial Staff Recognition Day, some of the professional development that has occurred, and some of the improvements that were made, in particular in Sankofa. We've fixed all the places where there were leaks in Sankofa. We did a tour of the building with the QSAC checklist. And we have replaced all the entry points in Sankofa with new commercial doormats. Moving on to the high school. They even worked weekends getting the high school together. I talked about some of these things already. But Mr. Collins, big shout to Mr. Collins, he even came in on his birthday to make sure that work was getting done. They painted the hallway, one of the hallways in the high school. They fixed the cafeteria floor. They painted a number of classrooms, replaced lights in the black box and in the high school cafeteria. They fixed the sign in the lobby. They replaced tiles in the bathrooms. And we had a list that we thought would take months to get done, and they got it done in only a few weeks. And so we're thankful for that. Next, we talked about attendance and we looked at attendance and we heard about chronic absenteeism today. So I'll skip that, but we did go over that in the operations call. And then finally, we went over enrollment. And, you know, we just talked about our strategy there using our new enrolled website, which is really designed to create a better pipeline for us in terms of the CRM or custom client relationship management tracking, the lead tracking, and also this company we're using, Enrolled, is also sending out secret shoppers to pose as prospective families that want to join the village. And that, you know, they basically posed as a prospective family so that we could get feedback on things that we need to do better. And so we've gotten some constructive feedback that we're working on improving to just make it such that we close any families that we possibly can in terms of getting to our enrollment numbers. Moving on to the finance portion, we went over the payrolls. We went over the grant agreements that we're going to be voting on today. We went over our treasurer's report. You'll see that our treasurer's report shows that our cash balance has dipped a little bit over where it was a year ago. It's still pretty strong. Our medical insurance premiums are higher by about 30%. And so we are shopping around trying to see if there's any possible way we can reduce that cost. But that seems to be an issue in New Jersey in general. And so that is something else that we have to contend with in our budget. We reviewed our budget to actual, and we're presuming at this point are projecting a similar deficit to the one in our original budget, but we also need to revise that



projection based on where our enrollment is right now. Finally, we reviewed our bills list and went through the bills list that we'll be voting on today and went over whatever questions that came up from looking at the bills list, but we feel good about the resolution to approve the bills as well. So that's there for operations and finance. And I've talked about a lot of things, but I'll like to open it up if there's any questions. (Boomer)

Personnel Committee

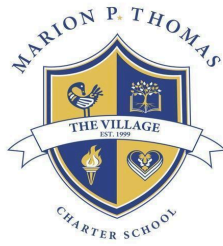
- Good evening, everybody. The personnel committee report is as follows. We do have Sankofa instructional vacancies 0, PAC 0, STEAM 1, and our high school 1 vacancy, which is very good from where we were. Non-instructional is 0, PAC 0, STEAM 2, and the high school 4, which leads us across the district. We have 8 vacancies, which is excellent. Also, our general updates, our departmental transitions that we have had. We are now working with Ms. West, who is in HR, and is definitely working very well to get the payroll. It should be in-house fully by January, which is great. And also, our employee handbook, which was one of our resolutions tonight, will be voted on. Just a few changes to that, the employee handbook, just only a few changes, which involves which you have seen some, I would say some minor revisions to the employee handbook. And also our October personnel resolutions. So hopefully you all had an opportunity to see those changes. We will be part of that position for human resources. Tamika Reese, who is familiar to us, will be coming as the interim executive director for human resources so that we can make sure we take that load off of the assistant superintendent who has been carrying that load here now for a little while. So we want to make sure we take that load off him. So Ms. Reese is coming in as the interim until we're able to move forward with a more permanent person for that. So again, we have two resolutions for that for the personnel, the handbook, and also the personnel report as well. That's our report for today. (Rouse)

Curriculum & Instruction Committee

- Good afternoon. The committee met on October the 14th, and I think tonight we have 5 items that need to be voted on, if you will. The first one is the approval to accept the funds for the Rise and Coach Grant monies. That is line item G. H is approval of field trips. And I think we only have one listed to be voted on tonight. And that would be a trip to Princeton Innovation Center, the bio labs, and that will take place. Well, the date of the trip, I guess it's gone already, was the 17th. So we may have already approved this one. I'm not sure. Yeah, that was to Princeton and that was the high school. The third one we have is the professional service agreement between Marion P. Thomas Charter and the Positive Positivity LLC organization, which will help improve scores in grades 3 through 8. And the one is the ERESO tuition contract and we need to approve that one for, let me see, I don't know if the amount is here. No, it's a renewal. So we are renewing it. It's no cost to us, but we are renewing our association with them. And the final one is the ESS contract renewal also, that's the effective school solutions and that company offers mental health services to our students. (Towe)

Culture & Climate + Alumni Committee

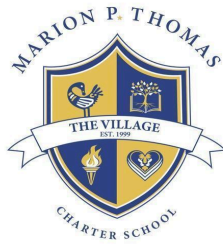
- Good evening, everyone. I have a quick update from the Alumni Committee. The committee met on October 14th, and we largely discussed the cell phone policy. So Mr. Mickens gave a report out on the cell phone policies and we all are supposed to give some feedback to that and respond to that. Ms. Vanessa Jean-Louis also discussed our SEL assessment and parent survey updates. And so those details were very interesting from the engagement survey. She reported that % of our students had completed their SEL assessment. And we had a total of 717 responses that were received from the



parent survey, which helped to identify families that are in need of potential resources. Also, an additional 18 students self-identify as displaced. And so it's just really informative to know that our families feel comfortable even responding to surveys and giving us this level of information so that we can make sure that we're as helpful as possible and helping to fill in those gaps. Some other things that were discussed were the college applications and the student board representative. So we have 48 college applications for the class of 2026 with three acceptances and about \$80,000 in scholarship offers so far. We also will be onboarding our new student board representative, sorry, please forgive me if I'm pronouncing your name incorrectly, Miss Nirvana Perez. So we're excited to be working with her. And that is the major update from the committee. Thank you. (Gilchrist)

Safety Committee

- Hi, everybody. So we were on the safety committee, we talked about a lot. First, we finally finalized the BTAM policy that is the behavioral threat assessment and management teams policy. For the policy, it's very straightforward. It mirrors what the school, I mean, what the state requirements are. And that's to have a, just going back over them real quickly, since we're approving the policy, it's to have a team that encompasses some required categories, like a school psychologist, a teaching staff member, a school principal, a safe schools resource officer, and the safety school specialist. And these teams, again, they can dual hat in there, but we did make sure that team is in place throughout our district. In plain words, the purpose of this is to identify any serious threat to school safety, serious and imminent threat. So that's what this is for. This is distinct from HIB, which is just harassment, intimidation, and bullying. And there's also a discipline policy. All of those things are also running concurrently, but this is specifically for immediate, like imminent and serious threats to safety in the school. And these are meant to have quick, swift responses that engage law enforcement when appropriate, but not unnecessarily. And the goal is to build school safety while not applying this statute or The goal is to apply the statute, which is a state law, responsibly in a way that doesn't, that protects school safety while also not unnecessarily sending scholars down a line of something that the statute's not meant for. So we paid a lot of special attention to that. The policy is set very generally, but there's been a lot of hard work. I want to shout out Mr. Williams for putting a lot of effort into this and the other administrators that have had a role in this as well, in ensuring that the implementation of it, the procedure that's being set up by the school carries this out responsibly. Again, I commend them for being so open and transparent in the development of that procedure to go along with the policy. And I think everybody should be, you know, rest assured that this particular, you know, given our population and how our population is often treated by a draconian system, if they don't have people looking out for their interest, it could be applied wrong. So I was really happy to see that this was applied in this way. We talked about student discipline also. There was a student discipline that has been improving so just to not go too in depth because the person that could give the report is not in right now. But student discipline, there has been an improvement, ongoing improvement from last year. And that seems to be coming from a lot of measures that have been taken to first of all, engage in restorative forms of discipline, ways that you approach to try to improve the discipline instead of, again, just smack people down. There has been an ongoing focus on culture, on a culture of respect for other students and taking pride in yourself and learning. And I'm doing my best to describe it, to give it justice if anybody wants to step in. If I'm missing something or not doing it justice, please feel free to jump in. But this is something that we talked about at length at the committee as well. Nothing we and I'll leave that in a second. I mean, but actually, I'll pause for a second if anybody does want to jump in on that. If you don't, if you don't,

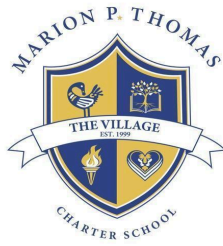


that's fine. Okay. So also we talked quickly about HIB, so hib, harassment, intimidation and bullying, student grievances. There were no significant cases. Just to let everybody know, we keep an eye on this stuff every month. When we meet at the committee, we kind of ask staff to give us an idea of what kind of stuff that we're dealing with. Also, by the way, jumping back to discipline real fast, the kind of offenses, not only have the numbers gone down, but the kinds of offenses are low in severity. So there is definitely a feeling that, or at least, you know, from what I've seen on the oversight committee, there's a feeling that the school is safe and in continuing to make students feel safe. And we also, again, we cover the security team. I don't know if Mr. Abbaleo, if you're still around. I'm not sure if you brought in the outside team yet. I know that we met with that. Well, yeah, I was there to meet. We all met with the security team and peppered them with questions to make sure that we were getting what we are asking for in an outside assessment. And I'm talking about the third-party contractor that we are bringing in to do an independent audit to make sure that our security, to identify any areas that we can improve, give us things to think about, et cetera. So I don't know Mr. Abbaleo. (Valdivieso)

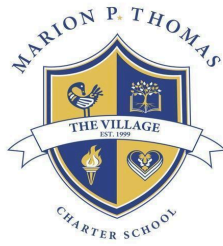
- They'll be starting tomorrow, and Wednesday, and then November 5th, and we're solidifying a fourth date. (Abbaelo)

So we have that one resolution on the table to approve the BTAM policy. Next month, the aim is to approve a bunch more. So get ready for more policies relating to safety. So get ready. (Validvieso)

And so as I close, I'm reminded of a powerful quote that we can think about as we



move on. "Blowing out someone else's candle won't make yours shine any brighter", right? So let's take that to heart. And with true strength, our beloved, we are found in lifting each other up. Let us continue to lift each other up and never tear any one of us down. We're living in a strange time in our nation and that we are builders and not, again, destroyers. And so with everything happening in our world again, remain steadfast in unity, compassion and purpose so that our village can continue to thrive. Thank you so much. Those are my words for the day. I pray everybody has a blessed and happy Thanksgiving because by the next time that we meet, we will be past that point. So please, do this. Enjoy your family. Enjoy your loved ones. 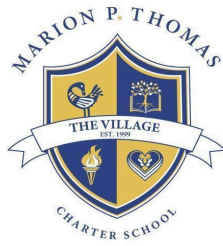

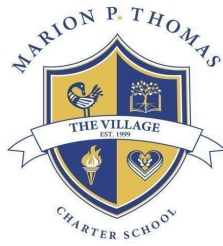

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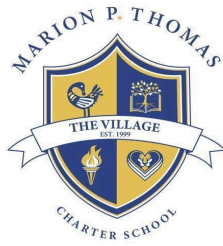
