What is Title I?

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Fourth District Elementary will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support students' learning. Fourth District Elementary values the contributions and involvement of parents in order to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Fourth District Elementary will support parent engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote students' learning at school and at home.

How is it developed?

Fourth District Elementary School welcomes parent input and comments at any time regarding the plan. All parent feedback will be used to revise the plan for next year. We also distribute an annual Title I survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for parent involvement. Parents can also give feedback during parent meetings, Parental Advisory Council meetings, and the annual Title I meeting for the next school year.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Fourth District Elementary will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of each year, the FDES plan is copied and sent home with all students. As a reminder, we let parents know how to access the plan on the school website and in the school office.

2025-2026 District Goals

- Goal 1: The percentage of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the ELA Georgia Milestone assessment will increase by 3% by the end of the school year.
- Goal 2: The percentage of students scoring proficient or distinguished on the Mathematics Georgia Milestone assessment will increase by 3% by the end of the school year.

2025-2026 School Goals

- By June 2026, students will show measurable progress in ELA, Mathematics, and Science as evidence by a 3% growth as measured by the Georgia Milestone Assessment.

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, Fourth District Elementary and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop together that explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards. The compacts will be reviewed and updated annually based on feedback from parents, students, and teachers during the Parental Advisory Council meeting and Annual Title I meeting. The school-parent compacts are kept with each child's teacher if parents need a copy.

Fourth District Elementary will host the following events to build the capacity for strong parental involvement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement.

Open House/Meet Your Teacher (# 1) – 8/01/2025

- Meet your child's teacher and our friendly, helpful school staff and learn about the programs used at FDES. You will also have an opportunity to hear about the standards and expectations at your child's grade level.

Annual Title I Meeting (# 2) – 8/15/2025

- We invite you to an event of learning and sharing about our Title I program including our parent involvement plan, the school-wide plan, the school-parent compacts, and the students' requirements.

Parental Advisory Council (# 3) – 8/27/2025

- We invite you to come and share ideas on how we can better serve the students and parents of FDES. Input on district/school policies, school-parent compacts, and family engagement (1%) funds.

Building Parent Capacity – Literacy Training (# 4) – 10/07/2025

- We invite you to review the literacy programs used with students at FDES. The programs, State standards, and achievement levels for your child's grade level will be explained.

Building Parent Capacity – Math Training (# 5) – 02/05/2026 We invite you to review the math program used with students at FDES. The program, State standards, and achievement levels for your child's grade level will be explained.

*FDES will conduct additional meetings if requested by parents.

*Meetings will be offered in different formats and varied times.
