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WHAT IS TITLE I?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for elementary, middle, and high schools. Through Title I, money is given to school districts around the country based on the number of low-income families in each district. Low-income students are those that qualify for free or reduced lunches.

The focus of the Title I program is helping all students meet the same high standards expected of all children.

HOW ARE STUDENTS CHOSEN FOR TITLE I?

At the beginning of the year every student takes an online test called iReady. If a student does not hit the target score for the fall, in Phonics and/or Phonemic Awareness, they will be offered Title I services. They will also be put on a RIMP (Reading Improvement Plan). Students' progress and interventions will be communicated to the parents through this plan that will be sent home monthly.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT/ SHARED RESPONSIBILITIES

Parent involvement is an important aspect of Title I. As a parent you can influence your child's success in school. We encourage you to be actively involved in your child's education.

Each Title I school will develop a School Parent Compact. You can help by making sure your child attends school every day, making sure homework is complete and attending parent teacher conferences.

According to the Third Grade Guarantee, students who have been identified "not on track" will be placed on a RIMP (Reading Improvement Plan). These plans will contain activities that will help support your child's success.



SCHOOL INVOLVEMENT

- Teachers at Mohawk Elementary will be conducting conferences twice a year. The purpose of conferences is to provide meaningful conversations with students/parents regarding their academic strengths.
- Parents may receive other assessments reports throughout the year that inform them on their child's progress towards their established goals.

Each individual classroom has its own method of utilizing parent support, depending on the needs of that particular classroom.
