

# Revision ideas for Year 9

# Being prepared



## Start Early

**Why it matters:** Starting early reduces stress and improves memory retention.

**How to do it:**

- Begin revision at least 3–4 weeks before exams.
- Start with short sessions and gradually increase time.
- Focus first on key terms and definitions. Practical actions to take

## Create a Flexible Daily/Weekly Plan

**Why it matters:** A structured but adaptable plan keeps students on track without overwhelming them.

**How to do it:**

- **Weekly Overview:** Write down subjects and topics for the week.
- **Daily Goals:** Plan 2–3 short sessions (30–45 mins each) per day.
- **Adjust as Needed:** Missed a session? Move it forward—don't panic.
- **Include Breaks:** 5–10 mins after each session; longer break after two sessions.

**Reward Effort:** End the day with something enjoyable.



# Practical ideas

## 3. Focus on Key Terms First

**Why it matters:** Key terms are the foundation for understanding exam questions.

**Where to find them:**

- Curriculum Guides on the school website.
- These should be learned before moving on to practice questions.

**Tip:** Make flashcards or use sticky notes for quick recall.

## 4. Subject-Specific Information

**Where to find it:**

- Teachers will post **subject-specific revision advice and resources on ClassCharts.**
- Check regularly for updates and any extra tasks.

## 5. Keep Notes Simple

**Why it matters:** Time spent making notes look pretty is wasted.

**How to do it:**

- Use bullet points and short phrases.
- Highlight only key words.
- Diagrams should be clear and functional, not artistic.

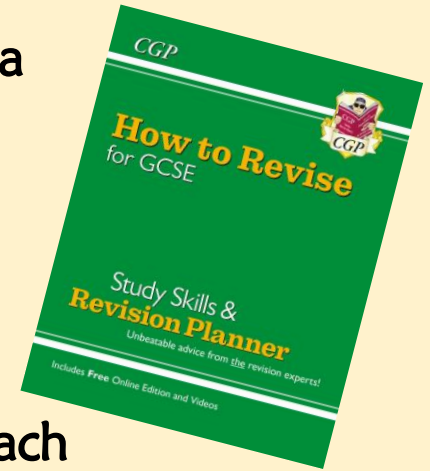
