Hands-On Safety: Students Meet Local Firefighters and Katy the Snowplow



Franklinville Elementary students wrapped up Fire Safety Week on October 23rd with a special visit from the Franklinville Volunteer Fire Department. The event offered students a hands-on learning experience that combined fun with important safety lessons.

Throughout the day, students had the opportunity to explore several fire trucks and an ambulance, climb aboard to see the equipment, and learn about the safety measures firefighters take to protect the community. One of the biggest highlights was getting to try out the fire hose—a crowd favorite! Firefighters also demonstrated how their protective gear works and explained the importance of staying calm and knowing what to do in an emergency.

A big thank-you goes to the Franklinville Volunteer Fire Department for spending the day with our students and helping them build valuable fire safety knowledge.



Earlier in the month, on October 15th, our kindergarten students enjoyed a special visit from Katy the Snowplow. Katy and her friends, Dan and TJ, taught students all about snowplow safety and demonstrated how Katy clears snow from the roads and spreads salt during the winter months. The students loved meeting Katy and learning how important snowplows are in keeping our community safe during snowy weather.

Both events provided memorable and meaningful learning experiences, helping students understand safety in fun and engaging ways. Franklinville Elementary is grateful for the support of our community partners, who help make learning exciting—both inside and outside the classroom.

Dear Families,

As we progress through the school year and approach the winter season, we would like to remind everyone of the importance of safety during arrival and dismissal times at Franklinville. With colder weather, snow, and reduced visibility on the way, it's essential to take extra care during drop-off and pick-up. Ensuring the well-being of our students, staff, and families is always our top priority.

Arrival and Dismissal Safety Reminders:

- *Use Designated Drop-Off and Pick-Up Areas:* Please use the approved areas

on North Academy and the elementary parking lot. Avoid stopping or double-parking in unauthorized areas.

- *Stay Alert:* Be mindful of crosswalks and the crossing guard, and watch for students who may be walking or biking to and from school.
- *Follow Traffic Flow Patterns:* Obey all posted signs and directions from school staff assisting with traffic. This helps keep traffic moving safely and efficiently.
- *Student Walkers:* If your child walks to or from school, please review the safe walking routes with them and remind

them to stay alert and use the crosswalks.

We greatly appreciate your cooperation and patience during these busy periods. By working together, we can maintain a safe and welcoming environment for everyone in our school community.

**FROM THE NURSES' OFFICE:
Information about
Medications in School**

Attention Parents/Guardians,

For students to have medications while they are in school, a health care provider order and parent permission is needed for both prescription and over-the-counter (OTC) medications used at school or school-sponsored activities. This will allow the medication to be stored in the nurse's office and be administered by the school nurse.

After the nurse's office has received the health care provider order and parent permission, please bring medications in their original labeled prescription or over-the-counter packaging to the nurse's office. An adult should bring the medications to school. If you need to make special arrangements to drop off medication, please call the appropriate nurse's office (ES: 716-676-8002, HS: 716-676-8022).

If your student's healthcare provider decides your student has a health condition which may require rapid administration of medication AND that the student can carry and use the medication independently, then they must put in writing (attest) that your student can do so safely. This attestation is in addition to the health care provider's order for that medication and will require additional parental permission as well. Independent carry and use of medications means that your student will take their own medicine without any help. The school will not always know if your student takes their medicine. Staff support would be provided only in an emergency. It is recommended that the student carry only one dose of medication in the original packaging. The only time a student is allowed to have medication with them in school is in this scenario.

Both the medication order form and independent use and carry attestation are available on our district website or may be obtained from the nurse's office.

Dear TBA Families:

I hope everyone had a great holiday. I have enjoyed working with the senior class while learning more about what everyone is interested in pursuing after high school. Many students have been accepted to college, while others are preparing to enter the workforce and military. All college-bound students must submit the FAFSA application. Students attending college in NYS should submit the NYS TAP application as well. Please let me know if you need any help moving forward.

Scholarships are available to all seniors and can be found on our website as well as in the Counseling Center.

I will help students apply for the Franklinville Graduation Awards and the Cattaraugus Region Community Foundation Scholarships in class. Seniors need to submit a copy of their resume, college acceptance letters, and two letters of recommendation (can be submitted by the person writing the letter). They also need to complete 12 hours of community service.

On November 6th, Juniors and Seniors took a field trip to Alfred State to tour the campus and learn more about the programs and opportunities they offer. We will continue to host college visits and will be setting up more campus tours.

On December 4th, the Sophomore class took a tour of the Ellicottville CTE Center to learn more about the programs they offer for junior and senior year.

I am in the process of meeting with the Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior classes to review their year, work on post-secondary readiness activities, as well as schedule their classes for next year.

The idea for a joint Veterans Day concert was developed by both districts' band directors, Mr. Briggs of Franklinville and Mrs. Harrison of Hinsdale, who envisioned combining the talents of their music programs to create one amazing event. Up-to-Date Weather Coming Soon!

Students in Mrs. Jordan's Earth and Space Science class will soon have access to real-time weather data thanks to a new weather station purchased through a \$3,700 grant she secured through Terra Science and Education. The station—powered by a 5 W solar panel—features a full suite of high-quality instruments, including a temperature and relative humidity sensor with radiation shield, wind speed and direction sensors, a rain gauge, a barometric pressure sensor, and a solar radiation sensor.

This new technology will give students hands-on experience with authentic atmospheric data and deepen their understanding of local weather patterns.

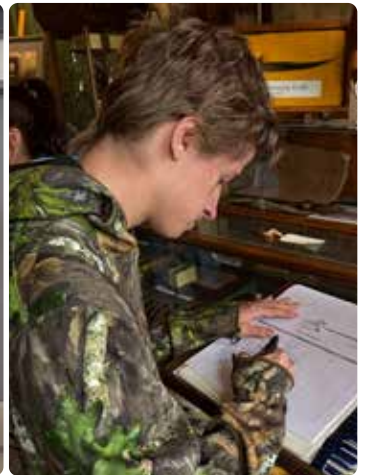
