**I. Call to Order**

Mrs. Zoller called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

**VII. Presentation: Elm Primary Facilities Design Presentation**

Mike Ruetschle with Ruetschle Architects presented an update on Elm Schematic Design and an update from the first Vermont neighborhood workshop. After hearing strong feedback during the initial design workshops for Elm, Mr. Ruetschle shared the updated proposed site plan including dropped elevation, expanded playground, and chiller placement on the roof. Floor plan updates for the first and second floor

were reviewed. Highlights of the redesigned exterior were presented with a limestone base, double limestone columns and a covered porch, reflecting a more traditional design for the Elm neighborhood.

Regarding Vermont, Mr. Ruetschle revisited the original proposed site plan and noted the feedback from the first neighborhood workshop included site circulation improvements and a recommendation to “flip” the site with parking on the east near Springfield Pike and the playground on the west. Vermont floor plans have not changed at this time.

Citizens Advisory Committee – Mr. Thomas reported that the committees continue to make progress on the 25-26 studies: Young Alumni Survey and Homework/Study Best Practices.

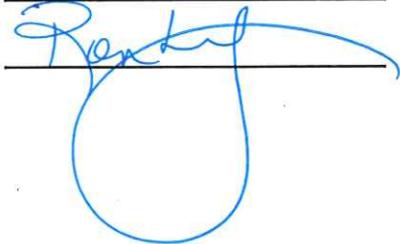
