

2024-2025 FINANCIAL AID & NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS

The purpose of Christ Church Episcopal School's financial aid program is twofold: to provide deserving students with an opportunity for an independent school education, and to provide the school with a well-qualified diverse student body. Need-based awards to qualified students require submission of a financial aid application and supporting documentation.

Figures are based on actual amounts awarded in 2024-2025 for financial aid and named scholarships.

NEED-BASED FINANCIAL AID

In 2024-25, over \$2.2 million was awarded for need-based financial aid, representing 8.3% of the total operating budget. Approximately 15.6% of the CCES student body received financial aid last year, with an average award of 46% tuition. Some of the funds included in financial aid derive from the income from endowments such as the Dr. Georgia M. Frothingham Scholarship Endowment for Alumni Children and the James K. Rumrill Scholarship Endowment for Children of CCES Faculty and Students.

NAMED SCHOLARSHIPS

In addition to the school's need-based financial aid program, several scholarships provide grants for students who demonstrate talent or skills in specific areas such as leadership, the arts, or athletics. Below are actual amounts awarded in 2024-25 for non-endowed and endowed named scholarships.

NON-ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

Cavalier Scholarship.....\$25,265

Full-tuition scholarship awarded this year to four students through an application process. Students must demonstrate financial need, along with academic excellence, evidence of merit as shown by extracurricular activities, and motivation to succeed.

Head of School Scholarship.....\$16,742

Conferred principally on rising freshmen who demonstrate a combination of high academic accomplishment, leadership, and noteworthy achievements in the arts and/or athletics. The award, made during 2023-24 to six students, may be as much as half tuition. Normal academic progress assures continuance of the award through graduation.

Richard Buckley Jacques Scholarship.....\$600

Presented to a sophomore or junior who demonstrates exceptional talent in the graphic arts field, whether in photography, film, web design, or other digital media.

ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIPS

Chris Ferrell Memorial Scholarship.....\$2,000

Given to a rising 10th, 11th, or 12th grader who is gifted in the fine arts.

Will Grist Scholarship.....\$1,000

Awarded to a rising senior who demonstrates Will's qualities of Christian values, honesty, integrity, compassion, kindness, and gentleness.

Barbara Farr Harrision Endowment Award.....\$3,044

Given to a student in the Middle School who is able to successfully demonstrate his/her love of reading through an essay contest.

Helmers Family Head of School Award.....\$16,700

Given to the rising freshman who is intellectually curious and high achieving.

Aletta Wood Jervey and Jinks Jervey Page Memorial Scholarship.....\$2,829

Given to the graduating senior with the highest GPA who has attended CCES full time as a student in grades 9-12.

Leonard Kupersmith Award.....\$26,550

Given to a student with a record of promise and contributions to school life that enhances student life and inspire faculty. The range of noteworthy attributes runs from outstanding scholarship to exemplary service to others.

Buck Mickel Minority Scholarship.....\$3,973

Given to a CCES minority student in grades 9-12 who demonstrates leadership abilities, has maintained a B average or better, and shows evidence of good involvement in school activities.

Jackie Messer Rogers Scholarship.....\$4,050

Given to the rising senior with the highest overall GPA in grades 9-11 with a concentration on AP/IB coursework.

Roger, Kirk, and Dena Stone Scholarship.....\$41,652

Given to a rising twelfth-grader who has attended CCES full time as a student in grades 9-11 who has the highest combined math and verbal SAT scores.
