JUVENILE COURT AND COMMUNITY SCHOOLS

East Region Community Schools, operated by the San Diego County Office of Education (SDCOE), provide educational opportunities for students who have been referred by social services, probation, or one of the 42 school districts in San Diego County.

Each campus is tailored to meet the diverse needs of each student population, united by a common mission to remove barriers and provide students with a high-quality education, academic and wellness support, and access to community resources.

Several teaching and learning models are available ranging from traditional community school classes, interdisciplinary project-based learning, independent study, and hybrid options.

East Region offers three programs located across two sites — San Diego and El Cajon: Cuyamaca Prep, East County Community School, and Project SAFE. All community and courts schools are accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges.
