Brian Krinsky is a 2008 Graduate of East Stroudsburg North High School. He was the class vice president and was the vice president of the National Honor Society. An honors student, Brian participated in the arts as a member of the choir, band, and the school musical. He was selected for district (2007, 2008) and regional (2007) choirs. In 2007, Brian was selected as the soloist for "Shenandoah" at districts. Brian lettered in football, golf, and track and field. He also participated in soccer and baseball. Brian is a 2012 graduate of Wagner College with a degree in theater and speech. An accomplished actor, Brian has appeared as Tedd Schramm on Law and Order Special Victims Unit; Billy Crocker on the Anything Goes Broadway national tour; and Beauty and the Beast on the Broadway national tour. Brian also performed regionally across the country, including the Maine State Music Theater, the Milwaukee Repertory Theater, Riverside Theater, La Mirada Theatre for the Performing Arts, and the Laguna Playhouse. In addition, he is a founding company member of the White Heron Theater Company. In film, Brian was the star, director, writer, and producer for Mister Dharma (2021); the star and writer of Meet Mom (2020); and will be starring in Good Advice. In developmental theater, Brian has done work on Camelot at the Lincoln Center with Aaron Sorkin and Bartlett Sher. He also worked in the developmental production of Marian directed by Tamara Tunie. Brian received a nomination from the San Diego Theater Critics Circle for best supporting actor in a musical for his work in Camelot at the North Coast Repertory Theater and the Laguna Playhouse. 2012 East Stroudsburg High School North Competitive Marching Band

The 2012 East Stroudsburg High School North Competitive Marching Band went undefeated at all competitions during the regular season and postseason. During the regular season, no other marching band scored higher than the North band regardless of the size of the band — North always had the highest score. At championships, the North band won awards for highest music score, highest overall effect score, best woodwinds, and the gold medal finalist which left North standing alone at the top of the awards podium.

The band's performance show was titled "Music of Russia" and featured music by Tchaikovsky, Glière, and Shostakovich. This was the most difficult level of marching band show that had ever been attempted at the North high school. Success was only accomplished by the hard work of the students, whose work ethic set the stage for future competitive North marching bands and led to a series of championships in subsequent years.
