Recognition of Outgoing Board of Education Members

Revised 2026–2027 District Calendar -

The Board reviewed the updated primary facilities construction timeline and its impact on the 2026–2027 school calendar. As a result of these updates, the revised calendar

reflects a return to a traditional two-week winter break and a slightly later start to the school year in August. The Board approved [this revised calendar](#), and the district website has been updated with these changes.

Facilities Committee Updates

We continue to make steady progress on the construction of our three new primary schools, with several important actions and discussions having taken place this month:

- **Elm School Design Workshop #3** - The third Elm School Design Workshop took place on Monday, December 8, with strong community participation and thoughtful feedback throughout the evening. Architect Mike Ruetschle reviewed the Elm design process, highlighting how community input has shaped the current proposal. Overall feedback was very positive, with support to move forward with sharing the design with the City of Wyoming as part of the permit approval process.
- **Primary Facilities Core Team Meeting** - The Primary Facilities Core Team met on Wednesday, December 3. Key discussion topics included a program budget review, planning for Vermont garden enhancements, final floor plans for Hilltop School, and preparation for the Elm Design Workshop.

Policy Review Committee

One of the Board of Education's core responsibilities is the ongoing review and updating of Board policy. During the December meeting, the Board approved several policy revisions. Master Contract with the Wyoming Education Association

The Board approved the Master Contract with the Wyoming Education Association for the period of July 1, 2026 through June 30, 2030. Thank you to all team members for their thoughtful collaboration and strong engagement throughout this process. This work represents an important step in supporting both our staff and the students of Wyoming City Schools.

2025–2026 Active Volunteers

The Board approved the list of active volunteers registered in Raptor as of December 5, 2025. This list includes hundreds of individuals who support Wyoming City Schools through their time and service. We are grateful to each of our volunteers for their commitment to our students and schools.

Student Clubs

Numerous student clubs were approved during the December meeting. Each club is supported by a supervising staff member who helps guide student interests and activities. Thank you to the staff members who serve in these roles and help foster student engagement, a vital component of student success.

Course Changes for 2026–2027

2026–2027 Optional Full-Day Kindergarten Tuition

The Board approved Optional Full-Day Kindergarten tuition rates for the 2026–2027 school year:

- **\$3,500** for families with a household income greater than 250% of the Federal Poverty Level
- **\$2,000** for families with a household income less than 250% of the Federal Poverty Level

Kindergarten enrollment information for the 2026-2027 school year will be shared in January.
