



## **Student Athlete Behavior and Academic Agreement**

Players must be positive role models to the entire MPTCS community. As the Executive Director of Athletics, I will be in contact with the teachers and the administration throughout the season to ensure the student athletes are modeling positive behavior and setting an example for everyone in the school. If students are not showing positive behavior, they will not participate in the games until they improve. Improvement is monitored and judged by the athletic director, coaches, teachers, and administrators.

### **Behavior:**

\*First Complaint: verbal apology and loss playing time (first half/quarter).

\*Second Complaint: verbal and written apology (one paragraph length that is approved by the AD/ person involved), and not playing for the entirety of the following game.

\*Third Complaint: verbal and written apology (one paragraph length that is approved by the AD/ person involved), and not playing for the entirety of the following game. The athletes and parents will also be required to meet with the AD and coach to discuss whether the player shall remain on the team.

\*Fourth Complaint: the athlete is asked to hand in their jersey and leave the team. Athletic Progress Reports (APR) will be due at the end of school day on Friday during a sports season.

### **Academics:**

All student athletes must maintain at least a 'C' or higher in every subject. The student athlete is responsible for bringing the progress report to each teacher so they may record the athlete's progress. The athlete must return the APR to their coach by the deadline. Athletes will not play until their completed APRs are returned.

APR: If they do not have at least a 'C' in one class or more, they will not be allowed to play in games until they improve the grade. During this time, athletes are required to practice while they are making the effort to improve their grades. If students are not showing a strong effort in practice, the coach is permitted to decide if the student should continue to practice. 2nd APR: students will not be allowed to practice or play in games until they submit a completed follow-up APR that shows the student has indeed improved their grade(s).

**Athletic Progress Reports (APR) will be due at the end of the school day on Friday during a sports season.**
