School Strategic Plan

Our Goals

- Increase overall grade-level proficiency from 47.6% to 56% by June 2026.
- Increase percentage of parents who agree there are opportunities for stakeholder involvement from 69% to 80%.
- Increase overall Active Learning and Progress Monitoring score from 2.7 to 3.25.
- Continue promoting a positive and conducive learning environment by encouraging respectful and responsible student behavior, aiming for 80% of teachers to agree that the majority of the students follow the rules for student conduct.

2025 Accountability Results Highlights

- Overall proficiency increased from 52.5% to 56.3%
- Reading overall proficiency increased from 48.8% to 57.9%
- Math overall proficiency increased from 49.4% to 58.6%
- Students with Disabilities subgroup increased from 22% to 34%
- Performance Grade: C
- Came out of low-performing status; continued as TSI school for SWD

Focus Areas for Improvement

- Student Achievement: Maintain math growth from 4th into 5th grade
- Attendance: Decrease student and staff absences
- School Safety: Reduce student referrals for misbehavior
- School Culture: Continue Capturing Kids' Hearts with the Excel Model

Celebrations from 2024-2025

- Multiple family engagement opportunities and a PTO was formed
- Grade-level music and art events
- Fun Run raised \$20,000 for a new swing set
- Exceeded two-year goal for overall proficiency and exceeded growth in reading
- 82% of staff agreed or strongly agreed that STES is a good place to work

Highlights of Action Steps

- Capturing Kids' Hearts best practices embedded in staff meetings
- Social contracts drafted and posted in classrooms
- All EC resource and gen separate teachers trained in SPIRE curriculum
- Weekly calls to stakeholders
- Weekly Student Services meetings held to discuss and align resources based on needs
- Positive Alternative to School Suspension (PASS) for students receiving referrals
- Training provided on use of UFLI for interventions
- Coach books purchased for test prep in 3rd-5th grade reading and math
- One parent involvement educational event will be held each year
