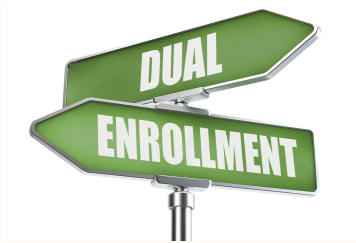

## So, What Exactly Is Dual Enrollment???

**Dual Enrollment (DE) is** when a student attends the college of their choice (school that they met requirements for) and earns high school credits simultaneously with college credits.

### Things To Keep In Mind...

- All schools that we partner with are a part of the University System of Georgia.
- All post-secondary Universities/Colleges have discretion regarding DE credit acceptance.
  - If interested with out-of-state schools after graduation CHECK BEFOREHAND to decide whether DE is the best option for your student.
- Start with the end in mind! Dual Enrollment is not a fit for every student.

# General Eligibility Requirements

## [Elite Scholars Academy Policy](#)

Students are only permitted to begin the Dual Enrollment program at the start of the school year, known as the Fall semester; Elite Scholars Academy program structure is designed for a full-year progression, making Spring entry unavailable.

## [Current 9th Grade Students](#)

Students in the 9th grade are **not** eligible to participate in the Dual Enrollment funding Program.

## [2026-2027 School Year: Rising 10th Grade Students](#)

Students in the 10th grade require a minimum SAT score of 1200 or minimum ACT composite score of 26 in a single national test administration, taken prior to the term of enrollment and in the GSFC Dual Enrollment system, may enroll in any approved Dual Enrollment courses at a TCSG, USG or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.

## [2026-2027 School Year: Rising 11th & 12th Grade Students](#)

Students in the 11th or 12th grade may enroll in any approved Dual Enrollment courses at an eligible participating postsecondary institution (USG, TCSG or private).

# Georgia Dual Enrollment Credit/Funding Limits

## Explanation of Funding

The Dual Enrollment Funding Cap is 30 semester or 45 quarter hours.

- The Funding Cap is a hard cap based on hours paid by the Dual Enrollment funding program for terms of enrollment
- 30 semester hours or 45 quarter hours equals roughly 9 -10 college courses

## Self- Pay for college courses:

- The college may charge the student tuition, fees and books based on credit hours of enrollment not covered by Dual Enrollment funding.
- Upon reaching the Funding Cap, the Eligible Postsecondary Institution may charge Tuition and a prorated portion of the Mandatory Fees and book costs, based on credit hours not covered by Dual Enrollment funding.

Once a dual enrollment student reaches the **FUNDING CAP**, a student may:

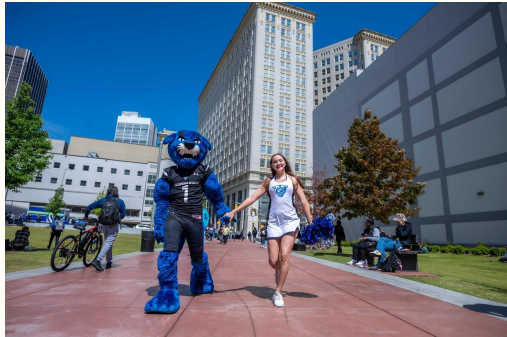
# What Are The Requirements For DE (Public Institutions)?

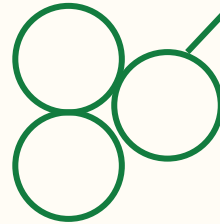

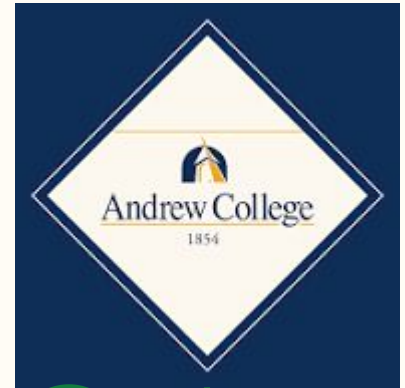

## Important Reminders

- **Elite Scholars Eligibility:**
  - 2.7 GPA Technical Institutions
  - 3.0 GPA University System of Georgia (Core/Recalculated GPA) and Private Institutions
  - Passing all 6 ESA courses 75 or higher
  - Attendance & Tardies
  - Behavioral Infractions
  - Not on Magnet Probation
- **SAT/ACT Testing**
  - Many Dual Enrollment Schools do not require test scores; However, check your institutional website for specific information regarding test scores
  - Truett McConnell (Private) does not require test scores

# Important Things to Remember

- **Rising 10th Graders Acceptance Deadline: May 22, 2026**
- **Rising 11th & 12th Graders Acceptance Deadline: May 1, 2026**
- All schools that we partner with are a part of the University System of Georgia.
- All schools have discretion with regards to credit acceptance.
- If interested with out-of-state schools after graduation CHECK BEFOREHAND to decide whether DE is the best option for your student.
- **We recommend applying to several schools to increase the chances of acceptance.**

# Part Time v. Full Time Dual Enrollment Student

**Part Time DE** = Taking between 1-3 DE classes at your perspective DE school per semester for a total of 6 classes. For instance,

- 1 class DE + 5 classes ESA = 6 classes total
- 2 classes DE + 4 classes ESA = 6 classes total
- 3 classes DE + 3 classes ESA = 6 classes total

**You MUST be a full-time student-** per State of Georgia requirements

**Full-Time DE** = Taking at least 4 DE classes at your DE school per semester and no classes at ESA. For instance,

- 4 classes DE means that you would not take ANY classes at ESA
- FT students CANNOT take all classes asynchronously/online (at least 1 class must be in person)
- FT students must have a blend of core classes and electives when making a schedule

# How Does Transportation Work?

- ➔ **Transportation Responsibility:** Students and parents are responsible for their own transportation. This is true *regardless* of whether the DE student is taking virtual college classes or in-person college courses.
- ➔ **Transportation is Essential:** Reliable transportation to and from both the college and high school campuses is a requirement for dual enrollment participation.
- ➔ **Lack of Transportation:** Students without transportation options will not be eligible for dual enrollment.
- ➔ **No On-Campus Waiting Area:** Supervised waiting areas are *not* available at Elite Scholars. Students cannot wait in the media center, computer lab, or teacher classrooms until they have a class on campus at Elite or until the end of the school day.
- ➔ **Flexible Schedule Required:** Students must be able to accommodate a adjusted high school schedule. You must be in a position to come to school later or leave early.
- ➔ **High School Schedule Adjustments:** College courses replace high school classes. This may result in a later arrival to campus (e.g., not until 2nd period) or an earlier departure (e.g., after 5th period).

# Dual Enrollment Steps To Apply:

- 1) **Review Elite Scholars Academy dual enrollment eligibility requirements**
  - Register for the SAT/ACT/Accuplacer (if applicable for desired institution) (Optional for Rising 11th & 12th; Required for Rising 10th)
  - Ensure scores are sent to desired dual enrollment institution when registering. Score requested after registration may not be free.
- 2) **Visit desired dual enrollment school website to see requirements**
- 3) **Create [www.GAfutures.org](http://www.GAfutures.org) account**
  - Ensure to answered all required questions, including SSN number
  - Use a personal email address when creating an account, not your CCPS
- 4) **Apply to desired institution via their website or [GAfutures.org](http://GAfutures.org) whichever platform they use (ensure you apply using the DUAL ENROLLMENT APPLICATION; FREE!!!)**
  - CSU Application is via their website (Click undergraduate when applying)
- 5) **Request high school transcript (through your GAFutures) & request your transcript via email to BOTH HS counselor to send transcript**

# Dual Enrollment Steps To Apply:

**6) Patiently monitor your application status via your personal email address once your dual enrollment application is completed in its entirety.**

- (Questions regarding your application status should be directed to college DE personnel)

**7) Received Acceptance Email!! Congratulations**

**8) Forward acceptance email to Mrs. Washington and Mrs. Garcia from your personal email address.**

- Be certain to state your first and last name when forwarding your acceptance email to Mrs. Washington and Mrs. Garcia
- High School Counselor will then email studentS CCPS email and the include your parent to provide you with next steps

**9). Monitor your CCPS email and Parent email for "NEWLY ACCEPTED TO DUAL ENROLLMENT MEETING" held virtually via zoom( parents) and in person (students).**

**10) Create dual enrollment schedule for upcoming school year.**

## 1. Technical & Trade Paths

- **Best for:** Students interested in hands-on careers like **HVAC, Automotive Technology, or Cosmetology.**
- **Recommended Schools:** \* Southern Crescent Technical College
  - Atlanta Technical College
  - Georgia Military College (GMC)
- **Why:** These schools offer specialized electives and core classes tailored to workforce readiness.
- **Important Note:** Courses can be taken in person and online

## 2. Local & In-Person Learning

- **Best for:** Students who want the "college campus" experience and the ability to attend classes **locally and in person.**
- **Recommended School:** Clayton State University
- **Why:** Convenient access for students in the Clayton County area to attend physical lectures and use campus resources.

## 3. Earning a General Associate Degree

- **Best for:** Students who want to complete a broad **two-year degree** that covers general education requirements before transferring to a four-year university.
- **Recommended School:** Clayton State University

## 5. Christian Faith-Based Learning (Online)

- **Best for:** Students who prefer an education integrated with a **Christian worldview** in a flexible online format.
- **Recommended School:** Truett McConnell University
- **Important Note:** Students cannot attend this university full-time

## 6. Maximum Flexibility & Counselor Support (Online)

- **Best for:** Students wanting online part-time schedule with strong support systems, accommodations, and a platform where their high school counselor can easily monitor grades.
- **Recommended School:** Andrew College
- **Important Note:** This is our newest partner school and is available **online only**. Course availability is currently limited. Students cannot attend this university full-time.
