Essay Formatting Guidelines

Your essay must meet all the following criteria:

- **Length:** No more than **300 words**
- **Spacing:** **Double-spaced**
- **Font:** 10–12-point **Times New Roman, Helvetica, or Arial**
- **Format:** Typed, clean, and professional
- **Tone:** Clear, personal, and concise

Content Requirements

Your essay must address **all** the following prompts. Use the outline below to guide the flow of your writing.

1. Introduction

Briefly introduce yourself. Share who you are, what school you attend, your ROP course, or anything unique that helps the selection committee understand your background.

2. Why You Enrolled in a ROP Course

Explain **why you chose the course** and what motivated your decision.

This can include:

- Your interest in the industry
- A career aspiration
- A personal experience that inspired you

Then describe **what experiences the course offered you**, such as:

- Hands-on training
- Certifications
- Work-based learning
- Guest speakers or real-world projects

3. Career and Educational Goals

Describe your **short-term and long-term goals** within this industry. Consider:

- College, Trade School, or certification plans
- Degrees or credentials you intend to pursue
- The career pathway you envision

4. Extracurricular and Volunteer Activities

Highlight the activities that demonstrate your skills, leadership, commitment, or passion.

These may include:

- School clubs
- Sports
- Community service
- Internships
- Part-time jobs
- Family responsibilities

Explain how these experiences support your career goals.

5. Financial Need & Impact of the Scholarship

Explain your **financial circumstances** in a respectful, professional manner.

Examples include:

- Limited financial resources
- College or training program expenses
- Family obligations
- First-generation college student status

Then clearly state **how this scholarship will assist you**, such as helping pay for tuition, materials, uniforms, exams, transportation, or other barriers to your success.

Final Tips for a Strong Essay

- Keep your writing authentic—your personal voice matters.
- Stay within the 300-word limit.
- Proofread for grammar, spelling, and punctuation.
- Keep your ideas clear, organized, and connected.
- Ask a teacher, counselor, or mentor to review your final draft.
