




Timberline's Future Business Leaders of America, or FBLA, was very busy this year. The forty-four member group participated in many fund raisers and leadership conferences.














The Timberline Wrestling team had an extremely successful 1982-83 season. Their league record was 6-3, this record put them in a tie for second place with Hoquiam.


The Blazers also took part in three other tournaments. High places were taken in most weight classes including Scott Jones at 168, Scott took first place in all three tournaments.







The following three meets were elementary for Timberline as they had no problem handling Capital, Aberdeen, and Shelton.


