Through these memorable years, the school evolved into what it is today. With its own share of trials and triumphs, Timberline remains a proud and unique place, forever knowing Blazer Pride.







Mr. Kycek-The excitement and enthusiasm we all felt when the new school opened.


Mr. Malkmus-When I taught African history, we built an authentic African hut [outside]. Then as a joke, some members of the faculty moved my desk out there.







"I liked the school. It was exciting because they were testing new things. There were no walls, but that didn't work. My favorite teacher was Ms. Patton because I loved PE."










AFTER HOURS





A wise man once said of a hobby, they are "something you do in your spare time but not just to waste the day." Meaning something that you enjoy doing.

Renee N.-My brother told me and my friend that we were going to be late, and he told us to get out and run to the school, but we didn't do it.






with their friends. For some unlucky folks, time was spent in a mock jail, while others were bound together for the evening in mock matrimony. What ever the occasion, it was a great time for all.













All the dramatics of high-school were captured in one club this year. That club was the drama club. From horror to humor- the drama club had it all.


They started off the year by participating in the Haunted House held at South Sound Mall. Members portrayed such characters as ghosts and newly dead newlyweds.

The club gave the exchange students the experience of living in Washington. They planned trips to the Seattle Center, to a hockey game, and to the mountains.








After finishing their pictures, staffers had to write captions for





More than 700 students (63% of THS.) voted in the


























Senior Sarita Summit gives her all during the 200-meter relay. This year she broke the school record for the 50-meter free with a time of 28:24.









Shooting For Success












