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
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
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







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Good Night I Know What You Did Last Summer...


T-Line's Wacky Records




Honorable Mentions...




GROWING PAINS... a new identity.





Running Start

Playing a second fiddle... ORCHESTRA



"It may seem odd but orchestra is much like a sport," the course instructor, Mr. Courter, explains. Students begin class by and working on techniques and warming up independently. Afterwards the students engage in a group session where they learn new techniques, various musical pieces, or work on their group collaboration skills. In one aspect orchestra is not like a sport, Mr. Courter encourages his students to not limit themselves, and to participate in extra curricular programs too. Orchestra is a fun class to be in, yet it consists of hard work and dedication. Both green and gold orchestra perform about once every month, 12 concerts, and 4 festivals. They perform at concert halls like Mercer Island, PLU, and even in a fiesta in central Washington.

The main lesson that orchestra teaches the individual is how to 'develop and refine.' Develop the necessary skills and techniques and then refine them into usable skills that suit them better. The main goal of orchestra as a whole is to develop the students ability to work in a group. This collaboration is most important since every musician depends on the other to do their part.

Orchestra is not just a one-year class, it is a step in the evolution of the musician. Most students begin playing in the fifth or sixth grades, and some even earlier than that. 


Green orchestra, mainly ninth and tenth graders, is for the intermediate student. Green orchestra members meet early in the morning, first period, to practice skills and techniques. Rather than focusing on the type of music, they do exercises that build skills. To be in gold orchestra one has to go through green orchestra first. Students begin orchestra in elementary school, then moving to middle school where they are still considered beginners. Ninth and tenth grades, for most, are the intermediate years of their instrumental development, learning more complex skills than when in elementary yet not as sophisticated as gold orchestra.










Have the edge in... The balance between work and play



The club met every week, focusing on four different themes which explains the acronym of the club.


Accountability was focused on finding someone each person could trust, share their frustrations, problems, and encourage one another.

Challenge Week was where a guest speaker would come, encourage, and challenge students to stand up for what was right.


Testimony Week was a time where they shared their personal experiences with each other.

FFA, (Future Farmers of America) or since 1988 the National FFA Organization, and Forestry Club (affiliated with the Society of American Foresters) are important clubs for students pursuing a career in any forestry or agricultural field. FFA began after the Smiths-Hughes National Vocational Act of 1917 was passed so that students would be exposed to forestry and agricultural opportunities. In 1950 the FFA was granted a federal charter and combined with the New Farmers of America origination. Despite their relatively small size, Timberline's FFA/Forestry club has won numerous awards in agricultural, lumber, and livestock competitions. FFA can be found in all 50 states, with almost half a million members in 7,263 chapters.

The THS, Forestry Club, chapter participates in many events throughout Western Washington that involve conservation and responsible harvesting of our forest lands. Members from THS joined together with members from other high schools throughout Thurston County in their regional meetings, they participate in events ranging from ice skating to auctioning off livestock.






Games Club







DECA Gets a Good *View* of New York




DECA is not only a club that teaches how to make businesses more profitable and appealing to the public, but how to make yourself, as an employee, a greater asset to your company. Members




Canned Food Drive



What is it like to be a cheerleader?




Questionable Calls



In the end the seniors were just too much for the juniors winning 14-7. It was lots of fun I couldn't have had a better time.








BLOOD RUNS THICKER THAN WATER...

Blood Drive *Working to save lives*


One day of each school year is set aside for the Puget Sound Blood Center to come to school and collect blood from those people that wish to donate. Anyone sixteen years of age and older are welcome to donate if they meet the screening requirements. These requirements are a minimum weight of one hundred and ten pounds, and a blood iron level that is expectable for blood donation. This one day event saw one hundred and twenty-five people, however only one hundred and twelve met all the donation requirements. Donating blood can be a stressful ordeal for anyone. "The scariest thing about donating blood is the wait, the longer it took to donate the more nervous I got, remarked" Jennifer Shaw.

Donating blood can take anywhere from thirty minutes to two hours. After the donation process, each donor is escorted to a different room to rest, where they are served cookies, crackers and juice. After a ten minute mandatory rest, donors are free to head back to class. This event helped hundreds in the community and is well worth the short amount of time it takes to save so many lives.



Last year, it was estimated that just over a million adults and ten million kids took part in this program. This year however, the figure jumped well past twenty million.

Hitting closer to home, students had the opportunity to get a school sponsored form giving them permission to either read in the library, or to go to Lakes to read to elementary school kids.



Nevertheless, while Sadies had several fresh and innovative ideas, one thing stands clear--just like Mardi Gras, the fun never ends.




