

FEARING *less* about all


the stressful situations life has thrown at you. So why is it that all of a sudden, you're scared? We all know that the first day of high school was intimidating, so why shouldn't the last be just as

Homecoming 2003


>> A Beautiful Night









FOOTBALL















friend and teach at the same time, and the ones who you *want* to forget. All of those hundreds of names and faces have impacted you in


