Timberline, in those days, had modular scheduling, no walls, tons of unscheduled time for students for independent study (Right!), and a young, dynamic teaching staff. I have been with this school through a major remodel to a state basketball championship to eight years of coaching Dance Team. I started teaching here with manual typewriters and now teach expert certification classes for Microsoft. I watched my colleagues go from young, dynamic teachers to a staff we affectionately called Panorama High. Most of those colleagues are gone now, and I find myself the senior statesman. And we again have a young, dynamic staff.

There is a mystique to Timberline-for both students and teachers, I think. Teachers here want to stay here; and, if they leave, they often



come back. Former students come back to visit; some of our teachers were students here. They, like me, can't imagine being anywhere else.

I have always felt blessed to be surrounded every day by so many different kinds of people. I remain attached to many former students from years ago, as well as those from today. Teachers are blessed with the relationships they form with their students. I have been blessed indeed.

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

...as a Sibling



Throughout the year activities, like Spirit Week, Penny Wars and the Blood Drive are specifically designed to bring together the Blazer community.







Autumn Ball - Homecoming 2001


This year Homecoming week kicked spirit into high gear, and let everyone know that the school year was officially off to a start.

Q: Do you believe in what our country is doing?






My experience is that it's hard to graduate and I feel that people should not take for granted the credits that they are allowed to miss because it will get you in the end.




Not only was I involved with leadership but I also played online football

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




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


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
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




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Joining Together






Today's Topic of Discussion...


Decisions, Decisions...




Wrappin' Things Up...

All the Rules...






German Club



The Blazer's purpose was to provide the THS community with an










A Memorable Experience...




An Unforgettable Year

Cross Country had one of their best seasons this year. Starting off with the biggest turnout they've ever had; 9 girls and 25 boys.







again the beginning of this year. They also allowed freshmen to join the team. This gave them their biggest turnout which turned into their biggest and most successful team.



Making Their Mark, One Pin at a Time



The story that got the



Theodor Seuss Geisel 1904-91, is an american author and illustrator of children's books. Some remember his books from childhood for easy, learning how to read, style and imaginative illustrations. When you look back on your childhood, most students remember books such as *Green Eggs and Ham*, *Hop On Pop*, *Whorton Hears A Who*, *Cat In The Hat*, *How The Grinch Stole Christmas* and many others. While some students do express themselves on stages and at concerts, it is paper that gives students a chance to fully express their inner feelings and emotions.





down, the night went on as planned. Oktoberfest was open





for all ages, but geared toward little kids. Entrance was free with the donation of only a few canned food items. The school really showed their commitment

Produced by the science club, they enlisted


judges who then critiqued each individual of their project. They were graded on a range of topics such as how much they knew about their research and if their conclusion supported their hypothesis.


Political Science







B.A.D.D.
