







Milestones to the Memories







Careful Preparation All week for one night





For a lot of us, the end of the week is just another day. But for others it is time to go cheer for the football team at Friday's game.


Whether fans just buy a ticket and sit quietly in the bleachers, or deck themselves out in Blazer gear, all are there to support the team.

When the game is finally over many go out to eat in celebration of our victory. No matter how the team does there is always reason to celebrate.







Blazing Pride Gaining Unity



Fresh BBQ First Impressions



It is recommended that the





Whatever we have to do, it's not the age that proves we're 18. It's our maturity level, the choices, and the decisions that we make.






be difficult especially if your birthday is on a school day.


New Beginnings T-Line 2000!!



With My Sweetheart

The people who attended this educational day in the library were welcomed with Dr. Seuss books and salty


snacks. Reading Across America Day would be the only day where food was allowed to be eaten in the library.








These, and all the rest of the players on this year's baseball team continued with the blazer's "tradition of winning."

letic ability. Lindsay Wickel and Katie Ingram also put forth great plays to help the team win matches.







team overcame a slow start to enter contention for the playoffs.









they bit hard and bit even harder when they were mad. Their speed enabled them to intercept passes routinely, and reak havoc on an opposing quarterback's passing game.



There were some tough matches this year and the team suffered two losses to Shelton. The Blazers came back in their next match against Aberdeen, win-


ning 5-0.

Weston was really impressed with persistence in the team this season. She felt it was a big factor in this years successful season




The juniors then got the ball and began their efforts to even the score. The two teams went on penalizing and being penalized without gaining or losing any ground.




What it's like:



Most people take Veteran's day for granted as a day off from school and don't realize it's importance.







Cultural Awareness


This year brought many exciting competitions for the green and gold. Not only were the class competitions exciting, but the club competitions were enjoyable as well.

Mrs. Barr has been the teacher for 16 years. Mrs. Barr says that the hardest part about running student store is, "keeping everyone on task."


During class time students are to take inventory, sell their products, and keep track of popular items. They even have to balance their budget and keep track of the money they receive throughout the day.

Every student in the class has a job, however nobody gets paid. Jobs range from; cashier, placing orders, stocking the inventory, maintenance, banking, and management.


This is appreciated by the student body, much of whom rely on it for breakfast and lunch.

Student store is more than a learning experience and even more than a mere class its more along the lines of a real business.






Leading Us Along the Way



Helping the community one step at a time...









So Many Choices... So Little Time






Making MONEY PAYING the BILLS


A mentor is someone who teaches us the ropes in life. A person who is important to us. A mentor can be a teacher, a parent, a friend, anyone whom we feel has


Making the Move

Sailing to success...


When Amado Bainto was in high school he wanted to be a merchant marine so he could travel all around the world. He became a merchant marine and ended up as Timberline's custodian.




Legal Rights Becoming an adult

Galactic Groove A Night In Space




A New League


on in the art class's.

runs through your mind over and over.







Pick Your Pleasure On An Empty Stomach. . .


Brand Spankin' New The new kid in town


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
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
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
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
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
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
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About our book...


