

 - "Football, wrestling, skateboarding, and or school musicals."














BUSINESS AND APPLIED TECHNOLOGY




FOREIGN LANGUAGE



at Washington State University. "Everyone that was involved in choir this year has played a part in our development and success", says choir teacher Terri Shaw.








these classes. She did a fantastic job seeing as it was only her first year teaching.




At Timberline there are beginning art classes and advanced classes to meet the needs of all of Timberline's artists. Many of the advanced classes prepare students who are going to pursue








GIRLS SOCCER














BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE














