Varsity Volleyball




The Lady Blazers came up with





The blazers golf team is expected to do very well in the upcoming years. The team has a lot of young leaders that are preparing for next years season.





also on out-of-school teams such as Poseidon; a team for all ages ranging from young children to high school seniors. This team just so happens to also practice in the Timberline pool.



















The wrestlers this year set the bar high in hopes for a great season next year!













The Cheerstaff did a great job this year in being positive school leaders and showing what Blazer pride and spirit is all about!








Thanks to all the new members and the fabulous new coaches for creating a great new look and attitude for Timberline's dance team!
















Timberline High School offers students the opportunity to learn common foreign languages. We provide Spanish, French, and German. These classes are offered to give students the chance to learn a different world language.


