

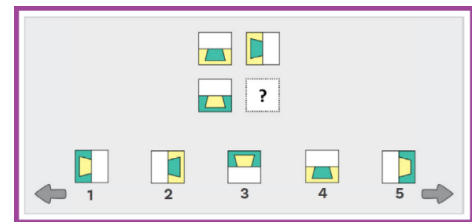
**To the Family of
School:**

Your child recently took the Naglieri General Ability Tests–Nonverbal. This test measures general ability using nonverbal questions. The test was created to give all students a chance to show their problem-solving abilities. The resulting score compares each student to a nationally representative sample of students in the same grade and a local representative sample at their school. Your child's score can be found in the table below.

Type of Score	Your Child's Score
<p>National Percentile Rank A National Percentile rank(NPR) compares an individual student to other students in the same grade. For example, a NPR of 90 means that the student earned a score that was the same as or better than 90% of students in the national comparison group. <u>Score Descriptions:</u> Average Scores: 23–76 Above Average Scores: 77–95 Very Much Above Average Scores: 96 or Higher</p>	
<p>Local School Percentile Rank A Local Percentile rank compares an individual student to other students in the same grade and school. For example, a score of 90 means that the student scored as well as or better than 90% of the students in their local comparison group. Score descriptions are relative and vary by school</p>	

Description of the test:

The Naglieri General Ability Test – Nonverbal uses questions that are presented using shapes and diagrams. The student uses the shapes, their color, and other features to figure out which answer completes the pattern. Students can solve these questions regardless of what language they speak.



Activities that may help children strengthen Problem Solving Skills

Puzzles (i.e. jigsaw, crossword and word searches), concentration card games, card matching, Sudoku for Children and playing with blocks (i.e. Lego® bricks)

As is true of any assessment, this assessment should be viewed alongside all other relevant data and only measures one type of skill that can assist teachers in planning and providing instruction to our scholars.
