











Skills Center Career Smart

Math Club


Adding it Up












Baseball

AIDS AWARENESS WEEK

North Thurston had a week of A.I.D.S. (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome) awareness to present the facts of the deadly disease to students. During each Activity period, students had a chance to learn more about how to protect themselves and how it's spread. For example, one day a panel made up of people living with H.I.V. answered student questions.

Another opportunity for learning about H.I.V., A.I.D.S. and the impact it has on human life included a viewing of NAMES Project A.I.D.S. Memorial Quilt panels. The standard cost for a quilt panel display is \$2000, but N.T.H.S. saw them for free. The individual "pieces" represent someone who has died of A.I.D.S. and many were decorated with pictures and objects that meant something to the person who died.

The Teaching Academy students and their teacher organized the "Liquid Lesson", designed to simulate how fast the disease can spread through body fluids. In each class, almost everyone received a glass of water. Two people had glasses with plastic wrap to represent "safer sex", and one person was given vinegar without their knowledge. The instructions were to "socialize" by sharing water with other people in the class. After the sharing, litmus paper was used to see which glasses had vinegar. Pink litmus paper meant the cup owner was "infected" with H.I.V., the virus that causes A.I.D.S.. Statistics show that the ratio of the people they shared water with is the number of people they could have unsafe contact with during their lives.

Hopefully, students learned that the only ones who are safe are the ones who play it safe through abstinence from sex and drug use. Also, this week demonstrated that we should not fear or hate those who are already infected with the disease or who have died from A.I.D.S.. Thank you to all those who worked so hard on making this week a success.
