
Theme!!?


statement "Pieces of the Puzzle" refers to people. Not some adults off the street, but students like you and me - Us- the people of North Thurston High School.









Jason Williams, another member of the senior class and close friend of the family, describes Keller as easy going. "He gives kids an incentive to know what's right."


As an advocate for the teaching profession the faculty looks to Keller for advise and guidance. Keller has actively participated in the North Thurston Education Association and served as an officer.


Whether in the classroom, or on the field, Keller's interest in motivating kids toward success earns him the 1991 Annual Dedication.











'Unchained Melody'








Drama Club





Not only did Rally cheer the wrestlers on, the girls gave them pins whenever they pinned their opponent in order to motivate them. Good going girls!







All the experienced students graduated. The instructor retired. The AV lady moved to Germany. There was no equipment. The old tapes were lost.



Finally in late November, the class started filming and assembling its first show, *NT Magazine*. "That first show was really a




Slosson summed up the experience with a sigh of relief, "We're glad the first year is over and we've set a tradition to carry us on in the future."




This year's scheduled trips included night skiing at Snoqualmie and later day trips to Baker, Bachelor, Crystal, and Snoqualmie.


The main purpose of this club was to save money by going in big groups. This allowed group rates, provided transportation, and gave the opportunity to ski with old friends and meet some new ones.

KNOWLEDGE BOWL






FRIENDSHIPS FROM AROUND THE WORLD






The club brainwashed all its members by teaching them culture even though the unsuspecting members thought they were just having a great time.




BRIGHTENING OUR PROSPECTS, the Dance Team performed at our first assembly.

Their costumes were unique and of their own choices. Their first performance was at a Christmas Bazaar.



Thank you for everything -- the good times and the bad. Thank you for the memories. Thank you for making us who we are today. See you in ten.....Carri









Co-captains Jennifer Glyzinski and Tami Becker had an easy task. This was the second year of fastpitch and the players were knowledgeable.


This year the Rams put effort forward to go to state. Varsity player Mary Thielen stated, "It was our first year having state. It gave us something to work for."





The 1991 May Dance theme was One Moment in Time. It fit, one last moment in time, one more memory not to forget.



The new football coach, Steve Cain, promised us a bright season, and the way-too-early date of the Homecoming game on September 28 added to the glimmer of things.



